The race for the WCHA regular season championship consists of 168 games (28 per team). North Dakota is the defending MacNaughton Cup champion. Other WCHA openers, by member team, are: Alaska Anchorage (Oct. 21-22 at Nebraska Omaha), Denver (Oct. 21-22 vs Minnesota State), Minnesota State (Oct. 21-22 at Denver), Nebraska Omaha (Oct. 21-22 vs Alaska Anchorage), North Dakota (Oct. 21-22 at Wisconsin), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 28-29 at North Dakota).

Outside the league, six WCHA teams will skate against non-conference opponents Friday and Saturday. Alaska Anchorage (1-0-1) and No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha (1-1-0) will both participate in the Alaska Goal Rush tournament at Carlson Center in Fairbanks, hosted by Central Collegiate Hockey Association-member Alaska Fairbanks (1-1-0) and also including Mercyhurst (0-2-0) from the Atlantic Hockey Association. On day one, UAA and UNO play at 5:05 pm AT while Alaska Fairbanks plays Mercyhurst at 8:05 pm AT. On Saturday, it's UAA vs Mercyhurst at 4:05 pm AT and UNO vs UAF at 7:05 pm AT.

After a pair of exhibition contests, No. 3-ranked Denver (0-0-0) launches its 2011-12 regular season with road games at Hockey East Association-members Boston College (2-0-0) at 7:05 pm ET on Friday and Boston University (1-0-0) at 7:05 pm ET on Saturday. BC is ranked No. 1 nationally this week while BU is No. 8.

Minnesota State (1-1-0) will play its first regular season games at home on Oct. 14-15 when the Mavericks entertain UMass-Lowell (0-0-0) from Hockey East at 7:37 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832).

In Grand Forks, No. 6-ranked North Dakota (1-1-0) will host No. 17-ranked Maine (1-1-0) of the HEA at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night.

And St. Cloud State (1-1-0) will head out on the road again this weekend when the Huskies visit CCHA-member Northern Michigan (1-1-0) for a pair of 7:30 pm ET face-offs in Marquette.

In on-ice action involving WCHA teams last weekend (Oct. 7-8), Alaska Anchorage won their own Kendall Hockey Classic title with a 4-4 tie against Clarkson and a 4-3 (ot) victory over St. Cloud State and both Michigan Tech and Minnesota won a pair of home contests. The Huskies, under first-year head coach Mel Pearson, defeated American International by 4-3 and 3-1 scores while the Golden Gophers blanked visiting Sacred Heart by 9-0 and 6-0 counts. Bemidji State went on the road and gained a split with CCHA-power and top-ranked Miami, winning 5-3 before losing by one, 3-2. Minnesota State split at ECAC-power Rensselaer, prevailing 1-0 last Friday before dropping a 4-1

NCAA Div. 1 Men's Hockey Candidates Announced for 2012 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

OVERLAND PARK, KS – Twenty NCAA® men's ice hockey student-athletes who excel both on and off the ice were selected as candidates today for the 2012 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. WCHA Coaches Pick Denver, North Dakota as Favorites for MacNaughton Cup in 2011-12

GRAND FORKS, N.D. – The MacNaughton Cup has been in Grand Forks or Denver for the last three years. The Western Collegiate Hockey Association coaches don't think that will change this year.

Denver was picked to win the league and UND voted second in the 41st annual Grand Forks Herald preseason WCHA coaches poll. Denver earned seven first-place votes. UND received four. Colorado College, picked to finish third, grabbed the other first-place vote.

Nebraska Omaha was picked to finish fourth, followed by defending national champion Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota, St. Cloud State and Wisconsin. The bottom four teams are predicted to be Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Minnesota State, Mankato and Michigan Tech.

Denver returns several key players such as Drew Shore (46 points), Jason Zucker (45 points), Luke Salazar (28 points), former first-round pick Beau Bennett (25 points) and offensive defenseman David Makowski (30 points). The Pioneers will have to go the first half of the season without starting goaltender Sam Brittain, who had knee surgery in June. Adam Murray is expected to cover for him.

The coaches have correctly predicted the champion in four of the last six years, including the last two.

UND, meanwhile, is undergoing a major rebuilding project, but the coaches don't seem to think the Sioux will slow down much. They lost six of their top seven scorers, including Hobey Baker finalist Matt Frattin and two-time All-American defenseman Chay Genoway.

Colorado College forward Jaden Schwartz, who piled up a staggering 1.57 points per game as a freshman, is the league's preseason player of the year. Schwartz tallied 47 points in 30 games to lead the Tigers in scoring, despite missing six weeks with a broken ankle.

Sioux forward Rocco Grimaldi earned 10 of 12 first-place votes and is the league's preseason rookie of the year. Denver defenseman Joey LaLeggia and UNO forward Jayson Megna received the other two votes. Grimaldi led the U.S. Under-18 team in scoring last season and was selected by Florida in the second round of the NHL Draft.

Denver, Colorado College Top 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll for 2011-12; DU's Zucker Chosen as Player of the Year

The Denver Pioneers, who finished second in the WCHA standings a year ago (2010-11) before falling to North Dakota in the NCAA Midwest Regional Final, earned the top spot in this year's 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll. The survey of media members covering the league was released today (Sept. 27, 2011).

Denver received 15 first-place votes to top the 2011-12 poll, ahead of long-time rival Colorado College, which received seven first-place votes. Third-place North Dakota and No. 4 choice Nebraska Omaha each received first-place votes. North Dakota won the league's regular-season and tournament championships last season, and advanced to the NCAA Frozen Four.

First-place votes in the poll were worth 12 points, second place 11, and so on. The teams were placed in order based on the voting average.

Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth placed fifth, followed by Minnesota. The top six teams in this year's preseason poll all earned home ice advantage in last year's WCHA playoffs. St. Cloud State and Wisconsin finished in a tie for seventh, followed by Alaska Anchorage in ninth, Bemidji State in 10th, Minnesota State, and Michigan Tech.

In addition to predicting the league's order of finish, the Preseason Media Poll also included votes on the WCHA Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year, and Coach of the Year. The media selected Denver sophomore forward Jason Zucker as the WCHA Preseason Player of the Year. North Dakota's Rocco Grimaldi was chosen WCHA Preseason Rookie of the Year. The Preseason Coach of the Year is Colorado College's Scott Owens.

For the first time, media members also selected a Preseason All-WCHA Team.

Since then, UAA picked up and win and loss in 2009-10 and lost both games last season ... UAA will start the tourney against UNO ... The all-time record between the teams is 1-1-1 with all three games being played in Anchorage ... The teams have never met on neutral ice ... The last meeting was on Feb. 19, 2011 with UNO winning, 4-1 at the Sullivan Arena ... UAA and UNO will square off on Oct. 21-22 in Omaha for the first time ever ... The Seawolves are undefeated against Mercyhurst, winning all four prior meetings ... The last matchup occurred on Oct. 9 at the Sullivan Arena in the Kendall Hockey Classic ... UAA won, 5-3 ... UAA will enter this weekend's tournament after winning its own Kendall Hockey Classic on Oct. 7-8 ... The Seawolves captured their sixth overall title and first since 2006 with a 4-3 overtime win over WCHA member St. Cloud State in non-conference action last Saturday ... In addition to the come-from-behind victory against the Huskies, the Seawolves tied Clarkson in overtime on Oct. 7, 4-4 ... To help determine a tournament champion, the teams competed in a three-person shootout with UAA winning, 1-0 ... Throughout the tournament, the undefeated Seawolves were 3-of-10 on the man-advantage and led the league over the weekend in that category, while finishing third in the nation ... UAA is also tied for 2nd in scoring offense (4 g/gm) in the league and tied for 8th in the nation ... The Seawolves were propelled to victory by junior F Mickey Spencer, who became just the sixth player and the second Seawolf (Rob Conn vs Dartmouth, 1990) to record a hat trick in the tournament ... It was also the Seawolves' first hat trick and first four-point game since Kevin Clark accomplished both at in a 5-4 victory at Michigan Tech on Jan. 16, 2010 ... Although it is just two games into the season, Spencer currently stands tied as the nation's leading point scorer (4-2=6) after recording a goal and an assist in Friday's 4-4 tie with Clarkson ... He is currently tied with Minnesota's Jake Hansen (1-5=6) ... Against Clarkson on Oct. 7, three Seawolf juniors posted multi-point games; Mitch Bruijsten (0-2=2), Daniel Naslund (1-1=2) and Mickey Spencer (1-1=2) ... Collecting his first collegiate point was rookie Sam Mellor with an assist on the game-tying goal ... Sophomore Mark Pustin scored UAA's first goal of the night, before scoring the only shootout tally ... Also picking up points were sophomore Matt Bailey, 2010-11 UAA Rookie of the Year, with the game-tying goal and UAA's top-point returner from a year ago, Jordan Kwas with an assist ... Last Saturday night, in addition to Spencer's four-point night, UAA received its first goal of the night from Kwas, who also assisted on the game-winning goal ... Picking up his first three-point night was sophomore Brett Cameron with three assists ... Cameron is tied for second in the overall WCHA stats for assists ... Also credited with assists on Oct. 9 were Naslund, Bailey and sophomore Quinn Sproule ... In net for UAA, sophomore G Rob Gunderson picked up the tie last Friday night, followed by sophomore G Chris Kamal claiming the win on Saturday ... Currently, Kamal is 8th in the WCHA overall stats with a 2.85 gaa and an .875sv% ... Following the tournament, two Seawolves were honored with All-Tournament team selection; Bailey and Pustin, while Spencer easily claimed with tourney's Most Outstanding Player accolade.

Bemidji State University

The Bemidji State University men's hockey team opened the 2011-12 season with a non-conference series split vs Miami University in Oxford, Ohio last weekend ... The Beavers stunned the nation's top-ranked team Friday with a 5-3 victory, before falling in game two the following night 3-2 ... BSU's season-opening victory was the Beavers' 41st opening-night win in 56 seasons of play ... In all, the Beavers are 41-13-2 in the first game of the season all-time and are unbeaten in 26 of their last 32 lid-lifters ... Since making the jump to the NCAA Division 1 ranks for the 1999-2000 season, BSU is 7-5-1 in season-openers ... The Beavers' triumph over the nation's top team marks the second time BSU has knocked off a No. 1 squad since moving to NCAA Division 1 in 1999-2000 ... BSU is now 2-6-0 all-time vs teams with the nations' top billing ... Ironically, BSU's other win over No. 1 came Nov. 27, 2009 against this week's opponent, Miami (3-2) ... In 2010-11, the Beavers played 17 games against teams holding down one of the nation's top 15 spots and posted a 7-8-2 mark in those games ... Since the BSU made the jump to the NCAA Division 1 ranks in 1999-2000, it is 15-45-4 (.266) vs teams in the top-15 ... With that said, BSU is now 12-10-2 (.541) vs the top 15 since the beginning of 2008-09 ... BSU's 2011-12 season-opening win is a vast difference from a year ago ... It took the Beavers until Nov. 6 – the sixth game – before BSU found the win column (0-4-1) ... Last Friday night's five-goal explosion matched the Beavers' best offensive effort of 2010-11 ... A year ago, BSU scored five or more goals just one time – a 5-5 draw with Colorado College Feb. 18 ... Aaron McLeod led the Beavers in the victory with a career-best three points ... Not only had he not scored more than one goal in a game, the night marked the first multi-point night of his 66-game collegiate career ... The three-point night give him 10-8=18 career points ... Since Dec. 3, 2010, BSU's last 28 games, McLeod has posted 7-5=12 points ... Brad Hunt registered the 68th, 69th and 70th assists of his career over the weekend ... With two helpers Saturday, he surpassed BSU greats Andrew Murray (2001-05) and Luke Erickson (2003-07) for second on BSU's Division 1 assists list ... He is also now seventh on BSU's all-time assist-scoring list for defensemen ... With a three-point weekend, Hunt enters the Beavers' WCHA opener 11 points shy of the 100-point plateau ... Only five other defensemen have eclipsed 100 points as a Beaver with the last coming in the 1993-94 season (Chris Morque, 28-79=107) ... David Boehm, Matt Prapavessis and Tyler Tosunian each made their debuts for the Beavers last Friday night ... Boehm, a transfer from the UMass, practiced with the team in 2010-11 while sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules, while Prapavessis and Tosunian skated in their first collegiate games ... In his first game in the green and white, David Boehm logged an assist ... The last BSU player to register a point in his BSU debut was Jordan George who recorded an assist in his debut Oct. 9, 2009 ... BSU is back on the road this weekend as it heads west to Colorado-Springs for a WCHA opener vs Colorado College ... BSU is 2-3-1 all-time vs Colorado College with a 1-3-0 mark against the Tigers in Colorado Springs ... Last season the Beavers took three points from the Tigers in a series played in Bemidji ... The teams tied Friday, 5-5, before BSU edged their guests, 2-1 on a Jamie MacQueen power-play goal ... Eight of the Beavers' first 10 games this season come on the road ... Minnesota heads to defending national champion Minnesota Duluth this weekend to begin 2011-12 WCHA play ... Since the Gophers won back-to-back national championships in 2002 and 2003, they have played 13 games against the defending national champions ... Minnesota is 9-3-1 in those games ... Minnesota went 2-1 against Denver the year after the Pioneers won the 2004 title ... The Gophers were 3-1 against Denver after the Pioneers won the 2005 championship ... Minnesota was 4-1 against Wisconsin the year after the Badgers won the 2006 title ... Minnesota and Michigan State tied 3-3 in their lone meeting the year after the Spartans won the 2007 championship (game was Nov. 23, 2007 and was the last time that Minnesota played a defending national champion) ... Minnesota began the year with a weekend sweep of Sacred Heart ... The Gophers won 9-0 last Friday and 6-0 on Saturday to start the year 2-0-0 ... The 15 goals were the most that the Gophers have scored against the same team in two consecutive games since they tallied 16 goals at Minnesota State on Jan. 16-17, 2004 (Minnesota won 6-0 and 10-3) ... The 15 goals were the most the Gophers have scored in a home series since they recorded 16 goals on Nov. 1-2, 2002, against Alabama-Huntsville (Minnesota won 12-1 and 4-2) ... The Gophers won their first two games of the season by shutout for the first time since 1936 when they beat Carleton (7-0 on Dec. 11, 1936) and Dartmouth (2-0 on Dec. 29, 1936) ... This weekend was the first time that Minnesota won its first two games of the season by shutout on back-to-back days since 1933 when it beat North Dakota (4-0 on Jan. 13, 1933 and 9-0 on Jan. 14, 1933) ... The shutouts were the first and second of senior goaltender Kent Patterson's career and the first for Minnesota since Alex Kangas made 26 saves to beat Colorado College 3-0 on Feb. 19, 2010 ... Patterson made 20 saves on both nights and his 20 saves were the fewest in a Gopher shutout since Kellen Briggs also made 20 saves on Oct. 27, 2006 in a 3-0 win against Colorado College ... The last Minnesota netminder to make less than 20 saves in a shutout was Jeff Frazze who needed to make only 10 saves in a 4-0 win against Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 25, 2006 ... Kent Patterson became the first Minnesota goaltender to shutout the same opponent on consecutive nights since Adam Hauser whitewashed Alaska Anchorage in the WCHA playoffs on March 12-13, 1999 ... Hauser earned 4-0 and 1-0 wins ... The last time that the Gophers had back-to-back shutouts was 2006 ... Minnesota beat Minnesota Duluth 7-0 on March 3 and 2-0 on March 4 ... The last time the Gophers had three straight shutouts was also 2006, as Minnesota beat Alaska Anchorage 4-0 on Feb. 25, 2006 before sweeping Minnesota Duluth ... Senior Jake Hansen, who was voted an alternate captain last week, is tied for first in the nation with Alaska Anchorage's Mickey Spencer with six points ... Hansen had one goal and five assists against Sacred Heart and his five helpers place him first in the nation in assists ... Freshmen Sam Warning is tied for seventh in the nation with four points (2g, 2a), but he is tied for first among freshmen with Bowling Green's Ryan Carpenter (1g, 3a), Lake Superior's Chris Ciotti (1g, 3a) and Boston College's Johnny Gaudreau (1g, 3a) ... The Gophers struggled on the penalty-kill last season as they successfully killed only 77.6% of the penalties that they took ... This past weekend, Minnesota was a perfect 9-of-9 on the penalty-kill ... They were one of 10 teams not to allow a power-play goal last weekend ... After two games, the Gophers rank second in the nation in offense (7.50 goals-per-game) and are tied for first in defense with Boston University and RIT (0.00 goal-per-game).
