MADISON, Wis. – Ten of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12 member men's team will engage in conference action over the final weekend of October. Friday (Oct. 28) and Saturday (Oct. 29) two-game series feature Alaska Anchorage hosting Minnesota, Denver traveling to Michigan Tech, Nebraska Omaha visiting Wisconsin, Bemidji State heading to Minnesota Duluth and North Dakota entertaining St. Cloud State. All five of these series mark the only two regular season encounters of 2011-12 between the respective foes.

The Huskies lost twice on the road at WCHA-foe Bemidji State last weekend, 6-5 and 3-1, while the Pioneers skated to back-to-back league victories over visiting Minnesota State, 4-2 and 10-2.

At the Kohl Center (15,325) in Madison this weekend, Wisconsin (3-3-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) will entertain Nebraska Omaha (3-3-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) in 7:07 pm CT Friday and Saturday evening contests. Last weekend, Wisconsin took four points from defending WCHA/MacNaughton Cup-champion North Dakota with 5-3 and 5-4 home-ice victories while UNO swept visiting UAA by 4-1 and 3-1 counts.

At AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth this Friday and Saturday, defending national champion and No. 15-ranked Minnesota Duluth (2-3-1, 0-2-0 WCHA) will hook-up with Bemidji State (3-3-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT starts. The Bulldogs won (5-2) and tied (2-2 ot) in a non-conference set at Providence College last weekend while the Beavers fashioned a 6-5, 3-1 league sweep of visiting Michigan Tech.

And at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) in Grand Forks this weekend, No. 12/13-ranked North Dakota (2-3-1, 0-2-0 WCHA) will play host to St. Cloud State (2-3-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) in a 7:37 pm CT face-off Friday night and a 7:07 pm CT start on Saturday evening. These will be the first two league games of the season for the Huskies. The Sioux fell twice in league play at Wisconsin last weekend, 3-5 and 4-5, while SCSU claimed a 7-5 win before a 3-3 (ot) tie in a home non-conference series against New Hampshire.

The race for the WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup consists of 168 games, with each league club playing 28 contests (14 home and 14 away). Of the seven two-game WCHA series played through Oct. 23, all have resulted in sweeps.

One other WCHA member team – No. 3-ranked Colorado College (2-0-0) – hits the road for a Friday-Saturday set at ECAC Hockey-member Rensselaer (1-4-0). Face-offs are 7:00 pm ET each night. Idle from action this week is Minnesota State (1-5-0, 0-2-0 WCHA).

Through games of Oct. 23, WCHA-member teams are a combined 17-13-4 (.559) in 34 non-conference games. Jeff Sauer, Mark Johnson Among Four Lester Patrick Trophy Winners

Award Ceremony Set for Oct. 26 in Saint Paul

NEW YORK, N.Y. – Distinguished player and coach Mark Johnson, Hockey Hall of Famer Bob Pulford, long-time USA Hockey executive Tony Rossi and college coaching legend Jeff Sauer have been named recipients of the 2011 Lester Patrick Trophy for outstanding service to hockey in the United States.

The recipients will be honored at an evening reception on Wednesday, Oct. 26 at the RiverCentre in St. Paul, Minn.

Johnson, a Minneapolis, Minn. native, is not only an accomplished athlete, but has distinguished himself as an outstanding coach as well. He played 11 years in the NHL (1979-90), where he amassed 508 points in 669 games with the Pittsburgh Penguins, Minnesota North Stars, Hartford Whalers, St. Louis Blues and New Jersey Devils.

Johnson may be best known as the leading scorer for Team USA at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, where he scored twice in Team USA's iconic victory against the Soviet Union en route to the gold medal. All total, Johnson represented the United States as a player in 13 international tournaments. He also enjoyed a three-year collegiate playing career at the University of Wisconsin where he was a two-time All-American and was named the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Freshman of the Year in 1977.

Johnson is currently the head coach of the women's hockey team at his alma mater, having led Wisconsin to four NCAA championships (2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011). He also served as the head coach of the 2010 silver-medal winning U.S. Olympic women's ice hockey team and twice was an assistant coach for the U.S. men's national team at the International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship (2000, 2002). Johnson, the son of legendary college and NHL coach "Badger" Bob Johnson, was inducted into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2004.

Pulford was one of the most reliable players in the NHL during a 16-year career that spanned three decades. The Ontario native played 1,079 regular-season NHL games, winning four Stanley Cups with the Toronto Maple Leafs (1962-64, 1967) before being traded to the Los Angeles Kings in 1970. He took his first coaching role with the Kings, guiding them to their first playoff appearance in five years in 1974, and won the Jack Adams Award as coach of the year in 1975. That season, the Kings amassed 105 points, still a club record.

Pulford then joined the Chicago Blackhawks, where he spent more than 30 years in various roles. He served as the club's coach on three separate occasions from 1977 to 1987. He was promoted to senior vice president in 1990 and took on the general manager's duties three separate times. Pulford was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1991.

Outside of a highly successful business career, Rossi has generously donated significant time, resources and expertise to USA Hockey for parts of five decades at the grassroots and executive leadership levels. After beginning his volunteer career with the National Governing Body in the mid-1970s, Rossi was elected to the USA Hockey Board of Directors in 1983 and served as a director from the Central District until 1988. After that, he was elected to the USA Hockey Executive Committee and transitioned into the role of USA Hockey treasurer in 1995. He currently serves as vice president of the organization and its international council chair.

During his time with USA Hockey, Rossi helped guide the formation and growth of The USA Hockey Foundation, a charitable and educational non-profit corporation that provides long-range financial support for USA Hockey and promotes the growth of the

game in the United States. He was elected to the International Ice Hockey Federation council in 2008.

Sauer, a Fort Atkinson, Wis., native, is one of the most successful and distinguished coaches in the history of college hockey. Following his playing career at Colorado College, where he played for Bob Johnson, Sauer spent more than 30 seasons as an NCAA Division 1 head coach – both at Colorado College from 1971-80 and then at the University of Wisconsin from 1983-2002. Sauer won national championships as coach of the Badgers in both 1983 and 1990 and ranks eighth on the all-time wins list of college hockey coaches with more than 650 victories (655-532-57) and a winning percentage of .549.

Sauer also is closely involved with preparing and coaching the USA Deaf Olympic Team, having participated in seven Deaflympics and earning a gold medal in 2007 at the IIHF Winter Deaf Olympics. In April 2009, he also coached Team USA to a bronze medal in the first ever World Deaf Hockey Championships. Sauer earned the John “Snooks” Kelley Founders Award from the American Hockey Coaches Association in 2003, presented to individuals in the coaching profession who have contributed to the overall growth and development of the sport of ice hockey in the United States. He is a member of USA Hockey’s International Council and the Disabled Hockey Committee and also currently works for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association as assistant to the commissioner. Sauer was recently named head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

The Lester Patrick award, one of the most prestigious in hockey, was presented to the National Hockey League by the New York Rangers in 1966. It honors the memory of Lester Patrick, who spent 50 years in hockey as a player, coach and general manager and was a pioneer in the sport’s development.

USA Hockey Announces Deutschland Cup Roster for Nov. 11-13 Tournament in Munich

Team Includes WCHA Alums Noah Clarke, Brandon Bochenski, Kyle Klubertanz, Brian Salcido, Ryan Lasch, Marty Sertich, Steve Wagner, Andy Wozniewski, Barry Tallackson

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – USA Hockey today announced the 21-man roster for its 2011 U.S. Men’s Select Team that will compete at the Deutschland Cup from Nov. 11-13 in Munich, Germany.

All 21 players on the roster currently are participating in elite European leagues in the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Russia, Sweden and Switzerland.

Named to the squad were nine WCHA-member team alums in **Noah Clarke** (CC), **Brandon Bochenski** (UND), **Kyle Klubertanz** (UW), **Brian Salcido** (CC), **Ryan Lasch** (SCSU), **Marty Sertich** (CC), **Steve Wagner** (MSU), **Andy Wozniewski** (UW) and **Barry Tallackson** (UM).

Highlighting the U.S. squad are five players who have U.S. national ice hockey team experience at multiple International Ice Hockey Federation World Championships, including Ben Eaves (Minneapolis, MN), who played on the 2002 U.S. National Junior Team and the 2000 U.S. Men’s National Under-18 Team; Freddy Meyer (Sanbornville, NH), who skated with the 2006 U.S. Men’s National Team, the 2001 U.S. National Junior Team and the 1999 U.S. Men’s National Under-18 Team; Robbie Schremp (Fulton, NY), who was a member of two (2005, 2006) U.S. National Junior Teams; Yan Stastny (St. Louis, MO), who skated with three (2005, 2006, 2011) U.S. Men’s National Teams and Barry Tallackson (Grafton, ND), who played on the 2003 U.S. National Junior Team and the 2001 U.S. Men’s National Under-18 Team.

Also included on the roster are five alumni of USA Hockey’s National Team Development Program, including forwards Tallackson (1999-

2001) and Stephen Werner (Chevy Chase, MD/2000-02); defensemen Andrew Hutchinson (Evanston, IL/1997-98) and Meyer (1997-2000); and goaltender Chris Holt (Billings, MT/2002-03).

In addition, Team USA includes five players with previous experience playing for the U.S. Men’s Select Team at the Deutschland Cup, including forwards Noah Clarke (La Verne, CA/2009), Chris Collins (Fairport, NY/2009), and Stastny (2003, 2004); defenseman Kyle Klubertanz (Sun Prairie, WI/2009); and goaltender John Curry (Shorewood, MN/2007).

The U.S. Men’s Select Team faces off against Slovakia in its first game on Nov. 11 at 10:15 am ET.

Notes: The U.S. roster includes 13 forwards, six defensemen and two goaltenders ... One more player will be added to the U.S. roster prior to the start of the tournament ... Fourteen members of Team USA have National Hockey League experience, while 20 played U.S. college hockey ... The 21 players on the U.S. roster represent 12 different states ... Minnesota leads the way with four natives on the roster, while California boasts three ... The Deutschland Cup has been held every year since 1987 and will feature teams from Germany, Slovakia, Switzerland and the United States ... Team USA has participated in the Deutschland Cup on six different occasions (2002-05, 2007, 2009) ... The U.S. won the tournament in 2003 and 2004, garnered second-place finishes in 2007 and 2009 and finished third in 2005 ... Jim Johannson, USA Hockey’s assistant executive director of hockey operations, will serve as general manager of the team ... Don Waddell, long-time head coach and general manager in the National Hockey League and International Hockey league, will serve as head coach with Chris Chelios, advisor to hockey operations of the NHL’s Detroit Red Wings, and Bill Guerin, player development coach of the NHL’s Pittsburgh Penguins, serving as assistant coaches ... The following support staff will assist the 2011 U.S. Men’s Select Team: Bob Webster, team leader; Scott Aldrich, equipment manager; Stan Wong, athletic trainer; Peewee Willmann, massage therapist; and Mike Shindle, team doctor ... The U.S. Men’s National Team Advisory Group, comprised of Brian Burke, David Poile, Don Waddell, Ray Shero, Paul Holmgren, Dean Lombardi, and Dale Tallon, was formed in February 2007 and assists USA Hockey in the selection of staff and players for all U.S. Men’s National Teams.

University of Alaska Anchorage

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves (3-2-1, 0-2-0 WCHA) will host ranked Minnesota at the Sullivan Arena for UAA's WCHA home openers on Oct. 28-29 ... The games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm AT on both evenings ... The series will mark the first meeting between the teams after the Seawolves became the first team ever to sweep the Golden Gophers in the first round of WCHA Playoffs in Minnesota ... UAA defeated UM on March 11, 2011, 4-3, before blanketing the Gophers, 3-0, on March 12 ... The Gophers hold the all-time series record against the Seawolves at 50-19-7 and in Anchorage, 23-9-4 ... In the last five outings, the Seawolves are 4-1 against the Gophers and enter the series with a three-game winning streak against UM ... The last time the Seawolves and Gophers met in Anchorage, UM won on Jan. 29, 2010, 7-4, before the Seawolves came back on Jan. 30 with a 2-1 win ... The last and only time the Seawolves have swept the Gophers in Anchorage was on Nov. 14-15, 1997 with identical 3-2 wins ... UAA and UM face-off after the Seawolves were swept by the Nebraska Omaha Mavericks in their WCHA season openers in Omaha on Oct. 21-22 ... UNO won, 4-1 last Friday and 3-1 last Saturday ... The loss on Friday broke a four-game unbeaten streak for the Seawolves ... In the first meeting between the teams outside of Alaska, the Mavericks now lead the all-time series record at 3-2-1 ... After averaging 38 shots per game in the first four games this season, the Seawolves were held to a season-low 19 shots on net last Friday and 21 on Saturday ... UAA also allowed a then season-high 28 shots on net on Oct. 21, before giving up a season-high 40 on Oct. 22 ... In the overall WCHA stats, the Seawolves are tied for 5th in scoring defense (2.67), 6th in penalty-kill (79.2%), tied for 7th in scoring offense (3.17), 8th in power-play (18.2%) and tied for 9th in penalty minutes (9.7) ... In national stats, UAA's junior class (9-18=27) is ranked 4th, averaging 4.50 points per game, while the sophomore class (7-10=17) is 15th, averaging 2.83 points per game ... The Seawolves are tied for No. 16 with Alaska Fairbanks in shots on goal, averaging 32, and are No. 20 in shots allowed per game (27) ... Individually, the Seawolves received goals by juniors Mickey Spencer and Mitch Buijsten over the weekend ... Spencer collected his team-leading fifth goal of the season and 11th of his career ... Spencer is tied for third in the WCHA overall stats for goals and is tied with teammate junior forward Daniel Naslund with seven points apiece for the Seawolves ... Last Friday night, Naslund failed to score, breaking a team-high four-game point streak, while senior D Brad Gorham picked up his first assist and point of the season ... In net for UAA was sophomore G Rob Gunderson (1-1-1) ... Gunderson holds a .904 save percentage on the season – ranking 9th in the overall WCHA stats ... He is also ranked 4th in goals-against average at 2.29 ... Last Saturday night, Buijsten garnered his first goal of the season and 12th of his career ... In goal was sophomore G Chris Kamal (2-1-0), who made a career- and team season-high 37 saves in the loss ... Following the Minnesota series, the Seawolves will have the next week off with a bye.

Bemidji State University

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey program posted its first conference sweep of the season Oct. 21-22, posting back-to-back wins over previously unbeaten Michigan Tech, 6-5 and 3-1 ... The wins allowed the Beavers to even their record at 3-3-0 overall and 2-2 in WCHA play ... The sweep stands as the first in regular-season league play since BSU defeated then-No. 4 Nebraska Omaha in consecutive games Dec. 3-4, 2010 ... The Beavers extend their unbeaten streak versus Michigan Tech to six games (5-0-1) dating back to Nov. 28, 2008, while the team is a perfect 4-0-0 when hosting Michigan Tech ... BSU is 5-2-1 versus the Huskies all-time in a series dating back to 2006-07 ... Jordan George, Ben

Kinne and Brance Orban each contributed two goals and an assist in the sweep, while freshman Matt Prapavessis logged three assists ... Rookie goaltender Andrew Walsh made a splash in his collegiate debut weekend ... Called on to replace starter Dan Bakala down 3-1 in the first period last Friday, the newcomer turned aside 17 Michigan Tech shots in the final 47:11 to backstop the Beavers to a 6-5 win ... In his first collegiate start the following night, Walsh posted 31 saves and allowed just one goal in a 3-1 victory ... The last BSU goaltender to post a victory in relief was Orlando Alamano when BSU defeated Wayne State (Mich.) 7-5 Feb. 8, 2008 ... Each of the three goaltenders on BSU's roster recorded a victory in their collegiate debuts ... In addition to Walsh's win last Friday, Dan Bakala won his collegiate debut over Air Force Oct. 9, 2009 and Mathieu Dugas posted a win over Northern Michigan in his first appearance for BSU Oct. 26, 2009 ... Last Friday night's goal-scoring total of six was the Beavers' highest scoring output of the 2011-12 season ... The last time the Beavers scored more than five goals was a 6-1 victory over Niagara Feb. 20, 2009 ... Eleven different Beavers logged at least a point in the victory ... Brance Orban's two goals last Friday stood as just the third multi-point effort of the junior's career ... He also scored a pair of goals to go with an assist in a career-high three-point night at Niagara Jan. 16, 2010 ... Orban leads BSU in scoring after six games with 2-5=7 points and is the team's top assist man ... He has now surpassed the scoring totals of both of his first two years and has nearly doubled his career scoring total (6-9=15) already this season ... With 2-4=6 points in WCHA action, Orban enters the third week of the conference season leading the league in scoring ... Jordan George led all BSU players in scoring last Friday with two goals and an assist ... The two-goal night was the 18th multi-point game of his career, his third multi-goal effort and his three points matched a career-high ... With 33 career goals, George climbed into a tie with BSU greats Jean-Guy Jervais (2002-06), Blaine Jarvis (2004-08) and Matt Pope (2004-08) for 11th on BSU Division I-era goal scoring list ... The BSU penalty-kill continues to be a strong point for BSU ... The unit was flawless in the series holding MTU without a power-play goal in seven opportunities ... The Beavers are now 21-of-25 (.840) on the kill this season, including a .929 mark in league play (13-of-14), and have allowed just one power-play goal in their opponents' last 16 opportunities ... Bemidji State's power-play scored three times versus MTU improving to unit is 7-for-25 (.280) on the season and is 6-for-19 (.316) on the man-advantage in WCHA play ... With 2-3=5 points on the man-advantage, senior Shea Walters leads the league in power-play scoring ... Saturday defender Sam Windle will make his debut in the green and white ... After enjoying a bye weekend, Colorado College plays its next five games on the road, at arenas with NHL-size sheets of ice ... CC heads to Troy, N.Y., this week for a two-game non-league series against Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute of ECAC Hockey, and owns a 3-0-2 all-time record against the Engineers ... With his early goals-against average of 0.75 and saves percentage of .973, junior netminder Joe Howe ranks second nationally in both categories ... The Tigers have won 15 consecutive home openers, including all 13 during Scott Owens' reign as head coach, since dropping a 6-3 decision to St. Cloud State at the World Arena on Nov. 1, 1996 ... They've prevailed in 10 straight season openers overall, all at home, dating back to a 6-2 loss at North Dakota to start the 2001-02 campaign ... Junior center Rylan Schwartz, whose first career hat trick fueled a 6-4 come-from-behind 6-4 victory over Bemidji State on Oct. 15, has factored in on 19 game-winning goals for Colorado College after his third tally midway through the third period stood up as the GWG in the series finale against the Beavers ... He's scored five game-winners and assisted on 14 ... Schwartz also won 59.5% (25 of 42) of his face-offs in the Bemidji series ... Sophomore left wing Jaden Schwartz has either scored or assisted on the game-winning goal in CC's last six victories, including all four post-season triumphs last March, when the Tigers reached the WCHA Final Five and NCAA quarterfinals ... The younger Schwartz struck for the GWG in the series opener against BSU on Oct. 14, then teamed up with junior linemate Scott Winkler to set up his brother's final red lighter the next night before adding an empty-netter of his own with :32.7 seconds left ... He's already been involved in 10 game-winners during his collegiate career, and has amassed 51 points (19g, 32a) in just 32 games overall ... Twenty-four of the 28 players on Colorado College's roster saw action in the sweep of Bemidji State, and 13 of them – including five of the six defensemen who played – recorded at least one point ... With three assists on Oct. 15, Winkler recorded the first three-point game of his career as a Tiger ... Howe, who started 36 games in each of his first two seasons, was credited with both victories against the Beavers after stopping 36 of 37 shots in the series ... He made 25 saves while going the distance that Friday, then steered away all 11 third-period attempts he faced in a relief of starter Josh Thorimbert on Saturday ... CC's blue-line corps, which included freshmen Aaron Harstad and Peter Stoykewych, combined for nine points (2g, 7a) in the season-opening sweep ... Senior Gabe Guentzel and junior Mike Boivin each scored a goal in the series opener ... Boivin added an assist in both games, while alternate captain Guentzel helped set up a tally in the second contest ... In 310 all-time games on the World Arena's Olympic-size ice, including 19 exhibitions, Colorado College owns a winning percentage of .706 (212-84-14) ... The Tigers don't play at home again, however, until Wisconsin visits the CSWA for a two-game series on Nov. 18 and 19 ... Jaden Schwartz, who led the team with four points altogether (2g, 2a) in its season-opening sweep, has compiled 18 (6g, 12a) during an eight-game streak that includes the team's final six outings of his freshman season ... He has seven points (3g, 4a) in four all-time appearances against Bemidji State.

The Pioneers charted a two-game sweep (4-2, 10-2) last weekend against Minnesota State ... The 10 goals were

the most scored by DU since netting 11 against Air Force on Dec. 27, 1995 ... Sophomore Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, NV) leads DU in scoring with 8 points (3g, 5a) ... Junior Drew Shore (Denver, CO) tallied a career-best four assists in the 10-2 win and is second on the team with seven points (3g, 4a) ... Zucker and Shore have four-game point streaks to start the season ... Sophomore David Makowski (Wildwood, MO) tallied a career-high four points (1g, 3a) in the 10-2 win and leads DU blueliners in scoring with five points (2g, 3a) ... Minnesota heads to Alaska Anchorage for a pair of games this weekend ... Last year, the rivalry intensified when the Seawolves became the first-ever team to end a Gopher Hockey season at the current Mariucci Arena with a two-game sweep in the first round of the WCHA playoffs ... This happened 42 days after the two teams split a pair of games in the same venue in late January ... Then-freshman Chris Kamal started in goal for the all three Seawolves' wins against UM last year and recorded two shutouts in the process ... Minnesota owns a 50-19-7 advantage in the all-time series between the schools and is 13-3-2 in nine trips to Anchorage under head coach Don Lucia ... Erik Haula is tied for first in the nation in scoring with 14 points with junior forward Jeremy Langlois of Quinnipiac ... The sophomore center has five goals (tied for sixth in the nation) and nine assists (tied for first in the nation) in six games ... His 2.33 points-per game average leads all players, as Langlois has played in two more games than Haula ... Senior Jake Hansen is tied for third in the nation in points with three other players with 11 points ... Hansen has three goals and eight assists (tied for third in the nation with teammate Nate Schmidt and one other) on the year ... Six players are tied for 10th in the nation in scoring with nine points and three of them are Gophers ... Freshmen Kyle Rau has six goals and three assists on the year, while sophomores Nick Bjrgstad (5a, 4a) and Nate Schmidt (1g, 8a) also have nine points after six games ... Rau is tied with Cole Gunner (2g, 7a) of Air Force for first in the nation in freshmen scoring ... Rau has six goals to lead the Gophers ... His six strikes tie him for third in the nation with junior Travis Ouellette of Ferris State and senior Travis Oleksuk of Minnesota Duluth ... Rau leads all freshmen in the nation with six goals ... Sophomore Nate Schmidt, who scored his first career goal this past Sunday against Vermont, leads all defensemen in the nation in scoring with nine points (1g, 8a) ... His eight assists tie him with teammate Jake Hansen and one other for third in the nation ... The Gophers have the No. 1 offense in the nation and are averaging 5.83 goals-per game (Denver is second with a 5.25 average) ... Minnesota has scored at least four goals in every game and has scored five or more goals in five of its six games ... One of the reasons that Minnesota has the most potent offense in the nation is its power-play, which is also best in the country ... The Gophers are 12-of-33 on the power-play for a 36.36% success rate (Union is second at 8-of-23 for 34.78%) ... Freshman Kyle Rau leads the Maroon and Gold (and is tied for second in the nation) with four power-play goals ... Senior goaltender Kent Patterson earned his third shutout of the season (best in the nation) with a 6-0 win against Vermont last Friday ... Patterson made 17 saves as the Gophers won their first three homes games by shutout since the 1928-29 season ... Minnesota's home shutout streak ended on Sunday at 204:07 when Connor Brickley scored for Vermont in the second period ... Minnesota has scored 35 goals this year and 32 of them have been scored by forwards ... Entering last Sunday's game against Vermont, Ben Marshall was the only defenseman to score a goal on the season ... Sophomore blueliners Justin Holl and Nate Schmidt notched their first goals of the year with blasts from the point ... Schmidt's goal was the first of his career ... Holl scored for the first time since his first career game (29 total games played in between goals) last year against Massachusetts ... Minnesota's impressive unbeaten run against one of the top conferences in the nation, Hockey East, came to an end on Sunday ... The Gophers were 5-0-1 against Hockey East opponents since losing to Boston College 5-2 in the 2008 NCAA Regional in Worcester, Mass. before losing 5-4 to Vermont on Sunday ... The Gophers defeated Northeastern, Vermont, and Massachusetts (twice) and beat and tied New Hampshire in those six games ... The Gophers run of five straight games with five or more goals, the longest such run for the program since the 2001-02 season, also came to an end in the loss ... Minnesota gave its opponent more than six power-play chances for the first time all year, providing the Catamounts with a man-advantage seven times.

Senior center Travis Oleksuk scored twice in the 5-2 triumph while senior defenseman Brady Lamb and sophomore right winger Max Tardy each had a pair of assists ... Junior left winger Mike Seidel (his second in as many nights) and rookie left winger Justin Crandall accounted for the two Bulldog goals Saturday ... UMD is unbeaten in 20 of its 25 games away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season (15-5-5) ... With an assist each night at Providence College, senior team captain Jack Connolly upped his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 143 points (47g, 96a) ... That moved the two-time All-American and 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist into 23rd place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, one point behind the No. 22 occupant, Hockey Hall of Famer Brett Hull (1985-86) ... Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third among NCAA skaters with a career-high 59 points), has been a model off consistency when it comes to offensive contributions ... Consider this: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010) ... Connolly is now within four assists of becoming the 14th Bulldog ever to reach the 100 mark for a career ... All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, #5 vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
