On Friday and Saturday, Oct. 12-13, Alaska Anchorage will host Air Force (Atlantic Hockey Association), Alaska (CCHA) and Canisius (AHA) at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage in the 22nd annual Kendall Hockey Classic while Nebraska Omaha hosts the Ice Breaker Tournament at Sprint Center in Kansas City with Army (AHA), Maine (HEA) and Notre Dame (CCHA). In two-game non-conference series this weekend, Colorado College will entertain Clarkson (ECAC Hockey) at Colorado Springs World Arena, Minnesota takes on visiting CCHA-member Michigan State at Mariucci Arena, Minnesota Duluth hosts Ohio State of the CCHA at AMSOIL Arena, Minnesota State travels to Alabama Huntsville (independent), St. Cloud State heads to Hockey East Association-member New Hampshire, and Wisconsin suits up against CCHA-member Northern Michigan at Resch Center in Green Bay.

In exhibition play this week, Nebraska Omaha entertains University of Lethbridge on Monday evening, North Dakota hosts the USA Under-18 Team on Friday night at Ralph Engelstad Arena, and Bemidji State skates against the visiting USA Under-18 Team on Saturday evening at Sanford Center.

In the first on-ice activity of 2012-13, ten league-member teams competed in a series of exhibition match ups against Canadian-based opponents. Last Saturday (Oct. 6), host Alaska Anchorage defeated University of Regina 3-1 at McDonald Center in Eagle River, Michigan Tech won 6-2 over Brock University in Houghton, host Minnesota blanked University of Lethbridge 7-0, Wisconsin shut out the USA Under-18 Team 5-0 in Madison, and Denver tied University of British Columbia 2-2 (ot) in a game played at Pepsi Center in Denver. On Sunday (Oct. 7), host Colorado College skated past British Columbia 3-1, Minnesota State downed Lethbridge 7-1 in Mankato, and Bemidji State tied visiting Manitoba 3-3.

The first WCHA series of 2012-13 will occur Oct. 19-20 when Michigan Tech hosts defending league champion and preseason favorite Minnesota. The conference schedule and race for the MacNaughton Cup (regular season championship) again consists of a total of 168 games, with each member team playing 28 WCHA contests.

In this week's (Oct. 8) USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, five WCHA-member teams were listed among the nation's top 20, led by Minnesota at No. 2. North Dakota is ranked No. 4 nationally, Denver is No. 7, Minnesota Duluth is No. 13 and Wisconsin is No. 15. Five other league clubs received votes in the latest poll, with those being Colorado College, St. Cloud State, Nebraska Omaha, Michigan Tech and Minnesota State.

GRAND FORKS HERALD'S WCHA COACHES POLL TABS MINNESOTA NO. 1, UND NO. 2

IF THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION COACHES ARE CORRECT, MINNESOTA AND NORTH DAKOTA WILL BE BATTLING TO WIN THE LEAGUE'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2012-13

Minnesota is the defending MacNaughton Cup champion. North Dakota is the defending Broadmoor Trophy winner.

If the Western Collegiate Hockey Association coaches are correct, those two teams will be battling to win the league's championship in 2012-2013 before departing for new, startup leagues.

The Gophers are picked to win the league in the 42nd annual Grand Forks Herald WCHA coaches poll, getting 11 of 12 first-place votes and 121 points. UND, which received the other first-place vote, is picked to finish second with 110 points.

Denver (91 points), St. Cloud State (90), Wisconsin (70) and Minnesota-Duluth (69) round out the top six.

"First and foremost, we want to be able to get home ice," UND coach Dave Hakstol said. "To get in that top three, it's going to be a long haul. For a team to be in the top three in this league, you've got to play well early and you're going to have to be consistent through the year."

Minnesota and UND both return significant portions of their rosters from last season, when they met in the West Regional championship. Minnesota won that matchup and advanced to the Frozen Four.

The Gophers will be led by Nick Bjugstad, who is the WCHA coaches preseason player of the year. Bjugstad received eight votes for player of the year. Bjugstad racked up 25 goals and 42 points in 40 games last season, earning first team All-WCHA honors. In the offseason, he decided to return to Minnesota instead of sign a pro contract with the Florida Panthers.

Other player of the year votes went to Wisconsin forward Mark Zengerle (two), Omaha forward Matt White and St. Cloud State forward Ben Hanowski.

"Maybe that's one of the storylines for this season – some of the returning veterans and some of the returning players who were very good in our league last year," Hakstol said. "They are coming back one more year to mature and I think it's going to be a deep league."

The WCHA also boasts an impressive crop of rookies.

North Dakota's Rocco Grimaldi is voted the best of them.

Grimaldi, voted the league's preseason player of the year last season as well, was injured in preseason camp, only played four games and

received a medical redshirt to return once again as a rookie this season. Grimaldi received seven first-place votes.

"We know him so well as a person and know him well as a player," Hakstol said. "We're excited to have him contribute on the ice and contribute to the team and be a big part of the team. It's so hard to do that when you are injured and out of the lineup for the majority of the season. Our whole team is looking forward to having him back in the lineup."

Minnesota defenseman Mike Reilly (three votes), Wisconsin forward Nic Kerdiles and Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Andrew Welinski also received preseason rookie of the year votes.

MINNESOTA NEAR UNANIMOUS PICK IN 94X WCHA PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

GOPHER'S NICK BJUGSTAD RUNAWAY CHOICE FOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A year after surprising many by winning the WCHA's MacNaughton Cup championship, the Minnesota Golden Gophers are a nearly-unanimous pick of WCHA media to win the league again in 2012-13. The annual 94X WCHA Preseason Media Poll, released Wednesday, shows the Gophers easily outdistancing the rest of the league.

A panel of 25 members of the WCHA media voted on a predicted order of finish, along with a handful of individual honors.

Minnesota received a whopping 24 of 25 first-place votes. Defending WCHA playoff champion North Dakota had the other first-place vote and finished a distant second. Denver came in third, followed by Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth. St. Cloud State claimed the final "home-ice" position in the preseason balloting.

Minnesota junior forward Nick Bjugstad was a runaway choice for the Preseason Player of the Year. He also anchors the media's second annual Preseason All-WCHA Team, where he is joined at forward by Wisconsin junior Mark Zengerle and St. Cloud State senior Ben Hanowski. The defensemen on the team are Denver's Joey LaLeggia and Nick Jensen of St. Cloud State. Sam Brittain of Denver and Josh Thorimbert of Colorado College tied for the goaltending nod.

For the second straight year, the media chose North Dakota's Rocco

Grimaldi as Preseason Rookie of the Year. Grimaldi took a redshirt after an injury-ravaged season, and he is again eligible for rookie honors.

Teams were scored under a standard system of 12 points for a first-place vote, 11 for second, and so on. The number listed with each team is the number of points that team averaged per vote.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, marking its 61st season of on-ice competition and owning a record 37 NCAA Men's Frozen Four titles since its founding in 1951, released its men's composite schedule for 2012-13 on July 26, highlighted by the return of one of college hockey's most successful post-season tournaments – the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five – to Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul next March 21-23.

In addition, the Association welcomes Mike Hastings as the new head coach at Minnesota State, Michigan Tech will host the annual Great Lakes Invitational outdoors at Comerica Park (home of MLB's Detroit Tigers) Dec. 27-28 and there are two more outdoor games in the month of February as Nebraska Omaha entertains North Dakota at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha on Saturday the 9th and Minnesota and Wisconsin hook-up in the Hockey City Classic at Soldier Field in Chicago on Sunday the 17th. The league's 168-game conference schedule launches the weekend of Oct. 19-20 as defending MacNaughton Cup champion Minnesota travels to Michigan Tech, North Dakota has a shot at becoming the first team to ever win four consecutive WCHA Final Five crowns, the four NCAA regional tournaments will be contested in Grand Rapids, Toledo, Manchester and Providence the weekend of March 29-31, and the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four will be played at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh April 11-13.

"We are thrilled about what promises to be a tremendously exciting season in 2012-13," said Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, who marks his 19th year at the helm of college hockey's most historic and successful league. "Our final campaign together in our current make-up should be one of the best ever. Across the board our teams look improved, there is some great talent back, and there are plenty of highlights throughout the season that will command attention, from the Ice Breaker in Kansas City and the Kendall Hockey Classic in Anchorage in October, to the Great Lakes Invitational at Comerica Park in Detroit in December, to the two outdoor WCHA games in Omaha and Chicago in February and on to the Red Baron WCHA Final Five in March and the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Pittsburgh in April. We had four teams earn national tournament berths a season ago, with Minnesota advancing to the Frozen Four, four teams wind up in the nation's top 10 at the end of the season, we were 51-33-8 in non-conference play, Jack Connolly (Minnesota Duluth) won the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, Denver's Joey LaLeggia was the national rookie of the year, we had seven players earn All-American honors and we had a record 110 men's and women's student-athletes named as WCHA Scholar-Athletes and a record 150 men's players earn All-WCHA Academic Team honors.

"We also want to extend another special welcome to Mike Hastings as the new head coach of the Minnesota State Mavericks," said McLeod, "and acknowledge the many contributions that Troy Jutting

made to both MSU and the league over his long tenure there."

Under the leadership of Commissioner McLeod, who has over the past 19 seasons fashioned a thriving partnership between the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the NHL's Minnesota Wild, the annual Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five has developed into one of college hockey's most prosperous conference tournaments.

Last season's Final Five drew a total attendance 73,002 – best at the playoff championship since 2009 and eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five – and an average per game crowd of 14,600.

The 2013 edition of the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five will mark the event's 13th consecutive year at Xcel Energy Center, where the playoff championship has drawn 923,566 fans in 12 previous appearances and an average crowd in excess of 15,500 per game.

"As an Association, we have been tremendously fortunate," said McLeod. "This on-going success has not happened by accident but rather by a lot of hard work and diligence over the past two decades. The Final Five has been a labor of love for the staffs of the WCHA, Xcel Energy Center and the Minnesota Wild and together we look forward to making the 2013 Red Baron WCHA Final Five the best yet.

"I also want to acknowledge the great support we have received from Xcel Energy Center Vice-President and General Manager Jack Larson, Minnesota Wild Owner and Governor Craig Leopold, and former Minnesota Wild Owner Bob Naegele, Jr., who was a key player in the Final Five from day one. Another essential part of our continuing success in marketing the Final Five has been our exclusive television partnership with FOX Sports North and our many corporate sponsors. We want to sincerely thank Mike Dimond (Senior Vice President and General Manager for FOX Sports North) and his entire staff and to also thank Red Baron® as our on-going title sponsor."

The first on-ice competition for 2012-13 will consist of a series of exhibition contests between Oct. 6-8 for Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State, Colorado College, Denver, Michigan Tech, Minnesota, Minnesota State, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota.

The first regular season action, all non-conference match ups, will occur Oct. 11-13. Michigan Tech travels to CCHA-member Lake Superior State on Thursday and then hosts the Lakers on Saturday, Alaska Anchorage hosts Air Force, Alaska Fairbanks and Canisius in the Kendall Hockey Classic, St. Cloud State visits New Hampshire, Minnesota State plays at Alabama-Huntsville, Nebraska Omaha hosts the Ice Breaker Tournament at Sprint Center in Kansas City with Army, Maine and Notre Dame, Colorado College entertains Clarkson, Wisconsin takes on Northern Michigan at Resch Center in Green Bay, Minnesota welcomes Michigan State, and Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State. In exhibition play, North Dakota engages the U.S. Under-18 Team in a single game in Grand Forks on the 12th while Bemidji State hosts the U.S. Under-18 Team on Saturday the 13th.

Competition for the 2012-13 WCHA regular season championship and MacNaughton Cup, a 168-game campaign which consists of 28 league games for each of the league's 12 member teams, commences Oct. 19-20 with one two-game series featuring defending league champ Minnesota visiting Michigan Tech. Other WCHA series openers, by member team, are: Alaska Anchorage (Oct. 26-27 at North Dakota), Bemidji State (Oct. 26-27 at Nebraska Omaha), Colorado College (Nov. 2-3 at Wisconsin), Denver (Oct. 26-27 vs Michigan Tech), Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 26-27 vs Wisconsin), Minnesota State (Oct. 26-27 at St. Cloud State), Nebraska Omaha (Oct. 26-27 vs Bemidji State), North Dakota (Oct. 26-27 vs Alaska Anchorage), St. Cloud State (Oct. 26-27 vs Minnesota State), and Wisconsin (Oct. 26-27 at Minnesota Duluth).

During the course of the 168-game league slate, there are four weekends that will feature all 12 teams engaged in league play – Nov. 30-Dec. 1 (six series), Dec. 7-8 (six series), Feb. 8-9 (six series), and March 8-10 (six series).

WCHA teams will also be hosting or playing in a number of regular season tournaments this season. Alaska Anchorage will host the Kendall Hockey Classic at Sullivan Arena Oct. 12-13 and play in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush in Fairbanks Oct. 19-20, Bemidji State plays in the Ledyard National Bank Classic in Hanover, N.H., Dec. 30-31, Michigan Tech hosts the Great Lakes Invitational at Comerica Park in Detroit Dec. 27-28, Minnesota hosts the Mariucci Classic on Dec. 29-30, Minnesota Duluth travels to the Florida College Hockey Classic in Estero Dec. 28-29, Minnesota State skates in the UCONN Hockey Classic in Storrs on Dec. 29-30, Nebraska Omaha hosts the Ice Breaker Tournament at Sprint Center in Kansas City Oct. 12-13, and North Dakota plays in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush Oct. 19-20.

The six-round playoff winners will then be re-seeded (according to their regular season finish) and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 21-23 at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn. North Dakota is a three-time defending Broadmoor Trophy champion. There will be two Final Five games contested on Thursday at 2:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT as the No. 5 seed will play the No. 4 seed and the No. 6 seed will play the No. 3 seed. The No. 1 and No. 2 Final Five seeds will receive byes on Thursday. On Friday, there will be two semi-final match ups at 2:07 pm and 7:07 pm CT, followed by the Broadmoor Trophy championship game on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT.

In 2010, the WCHA unveiled an all-new Broadmoor Trophy at the Final Five. The bronze cast trophy, created by Blue Ribbon Trophies & Awards of Colorado Springs, Colo., is a recreation of the famous Broadmoor Hotel, host to numerous past national championships and the former home of Colorado College hockey. There are a total of three Broadmoor Trophies. The largest is on display at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, one is a traveling trophy, and one is given to the winning team each year as a permanent addition to their display case.

The four NCAA Men's Division 1 Regionals will be contested the weekend of March 29-31. On Friday and Saturday, the NCAA Northeast Regional will be played at Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, N.H.

and the NCAA West Regional will be contested at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, Mich. On Saturday and Sunday, the NCAA East Regional will be played at Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. while the NCAA Midwest Regional will be held at Huntington Center in Toledo, Ohio.

The four regional winners will then advance to the 2013 NCAA Men's Frozen Four, which is set for April 11-13 at Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh, Pa.

The Golden Gophers also prevailed for the league's regular season title and MacNaughton Cup with a 20-8-0 conference mark and 40 points ... The 12 WCHA-member men's teams combined for a 51-33-8 record and .593 winning percentage against Div. 1 non-conference opponents ... Four WCHA-member teams were ranked among the nation's top eight in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll issued on April 9 ... they were Minnesota at No. 4, Minnesota Duluth at No. 5, North Dakota at No. 6 and Denver at No. 8 ... In the final USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued on April 9, UM was ranked No. 4 nationally, UND was No. 5, UMD was No. 6 and DU was No. 12. Two other league teams – Colorado College and St. Cloud State – also received votes ... North Dakota skated to a record third consecutive Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five playoff championship title and Broadmoor Trophy ... UND won all three Final Five games to become only the third team ever to do so (Minnesota Duluth in 2009, North Dakota in 2010) ... Minnesota Duluth senior forward Jack Connolly earned both the Hobey Baker Memorial Award and the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award ... A resurgence was launched at Michigan Tech under first-year WCHA Coach of the Year Mel Pearson, with the Huskies winning more games (16) this season than in the previous three combined and earning a highly-coveted berth in the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five ... Seven league-member team players received All-American acclaim ... West First Team honorees from the WCHA were Minnesota Duluth senior forward Jack Connolly, Colorado College sophomore forward Jaden Schwartz and Wisconsin junior defenseman Justin Schultz ... Both Connolly and Schultz were repeat First Team All-Americans ... West Second Team All-American selections were Minnesota sophomore forward Nick Bjugstad, Minnesota Duluth sophomore forward J.T. Brown, Minnesota senior goaltender Kent Patterson and Denver sophomore forward Jason Zucker ... Denver defenseman Joey LaLeggia was chosen as the National Rookie of the Year ... LaLeggia also was the WCHA Rookie of the Year and earned All-WCHA First Team and All-WCHA Rookie Team honors ... Post-season individual honors handed out by the WCHA saw Minnesota Duluth senior forward Jack Connolly earn WCHA Player of the Year honors, North Dakota senior goaltender Brad Eidsness chosen as WCHA Outstanding Student-Athlete of the Year, Wisconsin junior defenseman Justin Schultz named WCHA Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season, Denver defenseman Joey LaLeggia selected as WCHA Rookie of the Year, Michigan Tech's Mel Pearson honored as the WCHA Coach of the Year in his first season behind the Huskies' bench,

Connolly capture the league scoring championship, and Minnesota senior Kent Patterson claim the WCHA Goaltending Championship ... Four WCHA teams recorded at least 25 victories overall – Minnesota had 28, North Dakota had 26 and both Minnesota Duluth and Denver had 25 ... A record 110 men's and women's student-athletes were honored as WCHA Scholar-Athletes in 2011-12 ... A record number of 150 men's student-athletes earned All-WCHA Academic Team accolades ... The 2012 Red Baron WCHA Final Five, held at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul from March 15-17, drew a total attendance 73,002 and an average per game crowd of 14,600. The total attendance of 73,002 – including crowds of 16,738 on Friday night and 16,838 for the title contest – was the best at the playoff championship since 2009 and was the eighth highest in the 20-year history of the Final Five ... WCHA alums Mark Johnson and Jeff Sauer were honored by the National Hockey League in October of 2011 with the prestigious Lester Patrick Award, awarded for outstanding service to hockey in the United States ... Five WCHA member-team players were honored as national players of the month or national rookies of the month by the Hockey Commissioners' Association (HCA) in 2011-12 ... Minnesota goaltender Kent Patterson was the National Player of the Month for October ... Minnesota freshman forward Kyle Rau was National Rookie of the Month for October ... Minnesota forward Nick Bjugstad was National Player of the Month for November ... Bemidji State freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh was National Rookie of the Month for December ... Denver freshman defenseman Joey LaLeggia was National Rookie of the Month for January ... In year-end national tournament play, the WCHA was represented at the NCAA Men's Div. 1 Ice Hockey Championship tournament by league and West Regional champion Minnesota, Red Baron WCHA Final Five champion North Dakota, defending Frozen Four champion Minnesota Duluth and Denver ... The Gophers, winners of five previous national championships in 1974, 1976, 1979, 2002 and 2003, made their 20th Frozen Four appearance overall and first since 2005 in Columbus, Ohio, when an all-WCHA national championship round included eventual champion Denver, runner-up North Dakota, Minnesota and Colorado College. The Gophers fell to eventual national champion Boston College by a 6-1 count in one of the two semi-final match ups at the 2012 NCAA Men's Frozen Four ... Minnesota had earned the trip to Tampa by winning the West Regional at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul March 24-25, defeating both Boston University, 7-3, and league-rival North Dakota, 5-2 ... Denver fell by one goal to Ferris State, 2-1, on March 23 in a semifinal at the Midwest Regional at Resch Center in Green Bay. The FSU Bulldogs went on to capture that regional and advance to the Frozen Four with a 2-1 victory over Cornell on Saturday ... Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth came up one victory shy of reaching the Frozen Four when the Bulldogs fell 4-0 to Boston College in the title contest at the Northeast Regional at DCU Center in Worcester, Mass. Minnesota Duluth advanced to the regional championship after a 5-2 triumph over Maine in a semifinal ... The other regional victor this season was Union College, as the Dutchmen came out on top at the NCAA East Regional at Webster Bank Arena at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Conn. Union skated past Michigan State, 3-1, in a semifinal and then downed UMass-Lowell, 4-2, in the championship tilt ... Over 92 games season, WCHA-member teams went a combined 51-33-8 in games against other Div.1 conference-member teams.

Scott Sandelin is entering his 13th season as UMD's head coach and has a 217-210-58 record to show for it ... The 2012-13 UMD roster is comprised of seven seniors, four juniors, six sophomores and nine freshmen ... Sixth-year senior winger Cody Danberg has been entrusted with team captain responsibilities for the Bulldogs this season while a pair of fellow seniors – defenseman Drew Olson and winger Keegan Flaherty – will serve as alternates ... Sophomore left winger Caleb Herbert, who ranked eighth among all NCAA rookies in scoring last winter, is the Bulldogs' top returning point-producer ...
