MADISON, Wis. – Eleven of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's 12 mens member teams will be in action over the upcoming Thanksgiving weekend of Nov. 23-24, with six engaged in league play and five involved in non-conference match ups. The three two-game WCHA series will feature Alaska Anchorage at Bemidji State, St. Cloud State at Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State at Wisconsin. The only team not playing this coming weekend is Michigan Tech.

At Sanford Center (4,373), host Bemidji State (2-5-1, 1-4-1 WCHA) will go up against the UAA Seawolves (2-3-3, 0-2-2 WCHA), who return to competition after a week off, on Friday night at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. These will be the only two regular season games between them.

At AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, Minnesota Duluth (2-6-2, 0-4-2 WCHA) will take on No. 12-ranked St. Cloud State (6-4-0, 4-2-0 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. This, too, is the only two-game set between the Huskies and Bulldogs during the regular season. St. Cloud State returns to play after a week off while UMD is still in search of its first league victory of 2012-13.

And in Madison this weekend, Wisconsin (1-5-2, 1-3-2 WCHA) will go up against visiting Minnesota State (3-5-2, 1-5-0 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT face-offs at the Kohl Center (15,325). The Badgers and Mavericks, who are also coming off a bye week, will then conclude their four-game regular season series on Jan. 11-12 in Mankato.

Outside the WCHA over this holiday weekend, five teams currently occupying upper division slots in the league standings will lace-up the skates against non-conference opponents in Friday-Saturday series. No. 4-ranked Minnesota (7-2-2) will play at Hockey East Association-member Vermont (2-4-2) in a pair of 7:05 pm ET contests. No. 7-ranked North Dakota (5-3-2) heads to CCHA-member and No. 6-ranked Notre Dame (8-3-0) for 7:35 pm ET and 5:05 pm ET encounters. No. 15-ranked Nebraska Omaha (6-3-1) gets back in action with Friday (7:37 pm CT) and Saturday (7:07 pm CT) games against independent Alabama-Huntsville (1-10-1) at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959). No. 14-ranked Colorado College (7-5-0) will host No. 3-ranked New Hampshire (8-1-1) of Hockey East at Colorado Springs World Arena (7,380) at 7:37 pm MT on Nov. 23 and ECAC Hockey-member Yale (3-2-1) at 7:07 pm MT on Nov. 24. And No. 2-ranked Denver (9-1-0) will entertain Yale (3-2-1) at 7:37 pm MT on Friday night and No. 3 New Hampshire (8-1-1) on Saturday evening at 7:07 pm MT with both of those games at the Pioneers' Magness Arena (6,025).

Through 39 non-conference games as of Nov. 19, WCHA-member teams stand 21-15-3 vs other Div. 1 teams for a .577 winning percentage. League members are a collective 3-4-0 vs Hockey East, 3-2-1 vs ECAC Hockey, 7-9-0 vs the CCHA, 5-0-1 vs Atlantic Hockey and 3-0-1 vs independents.

Over the most recent weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 16-17, there were four WCHA series contested with the quartet of road clubs breaking even against their hosts, 3-3-2. Two teams, Denver and Michigan Tech, managed to post sweeps and bank four points in the league standings. The Pioneers won a home-and-home set against arch-rival Colorado College (6-5 @ CC, 6-2 at DU) to take the lead in the Gold Pan derby while the MTU Huskies captured back-to-back overtime road victories at Bemidji State (5-4 and 2-1). Both Minnesota and North Dakota were able to secure three points on home ice, with the Golden Gophers tying (2-2 ot) and winning (3-1) over visiting Wisconsin and host UND tying (4-4 ot) and winning (4-3 ot) against Minnesota Duluth. In all, five of last weekend's eight league games went into overtime and six of the eight were decided by a goal or less.

Through games of Nov. 19, Denver has exploded out of the blocks with a 9-1-0 overall mark and 7-1-0 league record to hold down first

place in the WCHA with 14 points. Minnesota is second at 4-2-2 and 10 points, followed by Nebraska Omaha (6 gp, 4-1-1) with nine points and then a three-way tie for fourth with eight points apiece between Colorado College (6 gp, 4-2-0), North Dakota (6 gp, 3-1-2) and St. Cloud State (6 gp, 4-2-0). Michigan Tech (6 gp, 3-5-0) is seventh with six points, Wisconsin (6 gp, 1-3-2) stands eighth with four points, Bemidji State (6 gp, 1-4-1) is ninth with three, and Alaska Anchorage (4 gp, 0-2-2), Minnesota Duluth (6 gp, 0-4-2) and Minnesota State (6 gp, 1-5-0) share 10th with two points each. Denver and Minnesota have played the most league games to date with eight each while UAA has played the fewest at four.

Following the Thanksgiving weekend, there will be a full slate of six head-to-head WCHA series played on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1. Michigan Tech will host Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota entertains Nebraska Omaha, Minnesota State entertains Bemidji State, Wisconsin travels to Denver, North Dakota visits Colorado College and St. Cloud State heads to Alaska Anchorage.

On Tuesday night, Dec. 4, Michigan Tech will play at CCHA-member Northern Michigan in a single non-conference contest.

OVERLAND PARK, KS – Twenty NCAA® men's ice hockey student-athletes who excel both on and off the ice were selected as candidates today for the 2012-13 Senior CLASS Award® in collegiate hockey. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division 1 senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. On Sept. 17, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's hockey head coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of

the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

Minnesota now travels to Vermont for the first time in program history ... the Gophers split with Vermont last year at Mariucci Arena in the first-ever series between the two teams, picking up a 6-0 win on Oct. 21, 2011 before falling 5-4 on Oct. 23.

MINNESOTA DULUTH

After a one-month absence, the University of Minnesota Duluth will return to AMSOIL Arena this weekend to host intrastate rival St. Cloud State University in a two-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association series ... The Bulldogs, who will be seeking their first league win of the somewhat young season, haven't been at home since Oct. 27 when they skated to a 2-2 draw with the University of Wisconsin ... UMD and St. Cloud State have collided on 102 previous occasions in a rivalry that stretches back to the 1946-47 season ... The Huskies hold a 56-39-7 lead in the all-time series and are 52-35-6 vs the Bulldogs since joining the NCAA Division

1 ranks in 1987-88 ... St. Cloud State took three of four points from the Bulldogs (a 2-1 win and 3-3 tie) in the two clubs' only meetings last year (March 2-3 in the regular season finales in St. Cloud), but was winless against the Bulldogs the previous season, going 0-3-1 at AMSOIL Arena ... That included being swept in the opening round of the WCHA playoffs (4-2 and 3-2 in triple overtime on March 11-12, 2011) ... UMD is unbeaten (4-0-1) in its last five clashes against the Huskies in Duluth, having last lost to them on Nov. 25, 2006 at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center – a 4-2 decision ... The Bulldogs skated out of Grand Forks with just one WCHA point in a two-game set with North Dakota last weekend ... Both outings required overtime with the hosts taking the rematch 4-3, scoring with only :34 second remaining in the extra session, after UMD had rallied to earn a 4-4 tie the previous night ... The 4-3 overtime setback to North Dakota Saturday marked the first time since the 2011 WCHA Final Five (vs Bemidji State) that the Bulldogs lost a game in which it led heading into the third period ... They had been 20-0-3 in that situation prior to Saturday ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who has picked up at least one point in nine of UMD's 10 games to date (he was blanked in UMD's 2-0 loss to Wisconsin on Oct. 26), continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with seven goals and five assists ... Those seven goals are bettered by only seven other NCAA II players and one WCHA combatant – Chris Knowlton of Denver with eight) ... Seidel, whose four power-play goals are tops in the nation (he shares that honor with seven others), has scored once in each of the last four outings ... Center Tony Cameranesi, who like Seidel will take a five-game scoring streak into this Friday's bout with St. Cloud State, currently is tied for fourth in points among all NCAA rookies with 10 (4g, 6a) ... The Toronto Maple Leaf (NHL) draftee has put the second most shots on net (3.70 a night) of any WCHA newcomer ... The Bulldogs are the nation's most penalized team thus, averaging 20.6 minutes of infraction time per outing ... UMD has not been shut out on the road during the regular season in almost five years (2-0 vs Bemidji State on Jan. 5, 2007), but has been blanked at home over that same stretch on six occasions ... Freshman left winger Austin Farley potted a pair goals – both coming a little over three minutes apart in the second period – in the 4-4 overtime tie at North Dakota last Friday night, giving him eight points on the season ... That places him in the No. 3 spot on UMD's scoring charts (behind Mike Seidel and Tony Cameranesi) ... Farley (+1), the youngest member of the 2012-13 Bulldogs (he turned 19 earlier this month), senior left winger Dan DeLisle (+2), and junior center Max Tardy (+1) are the only three UMD players who currently sport positive plus-minus numbers ... Since Feb. 26, 2010, the Bulldogs have lost two or more games in a row only three times with the longest losing skid during that stretch being a three-outing drought between Oct. 8-16, 2011 ... UMD has cashed in on five of 17 opportunities with the man-advantage over the past four games (29.4%) and now rank fourth among WCHA clubs in power-play efficiency (23.5%) ... The Bulldogs have been outscored 9-4 in the third period this season.

MINNESOTA STATE

Minnesota State, which was idle last weekend, stands 3-5-2 overall and 1-5-0 in the WCHA after a pair of one-goal losses to then third-rated Denver (4-3 and 3-2) in its most recent action (Nov. 9-10) ... The Mavericks resumes action this week with a pair of league games at the University of Wisconsin ... MSU stands 15-23-4 in the all-time series vs Wisconsin ... MSU split last year's series with the Badgers, dropping a 4-0 decision before claiming a 3-0 win the next night in a pair of games played in Mankato ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, upped his season totals to 3-5=8 with his two-goal, two-assist output in MSU's two games vs third-rated Denver ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine has moved into second place on MSU's scoring charts, he owns 16-20=36 in 48 career games and is currently riding a four-game point scoring streak (3-4=7) ... Sophomore forward Matt Leitner (1-9=10), who led the Mavericks in scoring last year, stands atop MSU scoring charts this year and also leads

the Mavericks in assists ... Leitner assisted on Jean-Paul Lafontaine's second goal vs Denver and had another assist when Lafontaine scored late the next night ... He has extended his point-scoring streak to four games (0-4=4) ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke assisted on Jean-Paul Lafontaine's second goal vs Denver and has tallied points in three of the last four games (1-2=3) ... With 1-3=4 in ten games this year, he stands tied for eighth on the team's scoring charts ... Lehrke owns 16-17=33 in 73 career games ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes scored a goal in each game vs #3 Denver and stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 36-30=66 in 122 career games ... Hayes, who has 4-2=6 in ten games this year, ranks second on the team with 39 shots on goal ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles (0-4=4), who assisted on the goal by Eriah Hayes in MSU's first game vs Denver, has played in nine of MSU's nine games in his debut season with the Mavericks ... His +5 ranks first on the team ... Junior forward Johnny McInnis, who has scored a goal in four of the last nine games, stands tied for the team in goals and ranks third on the team in shots on goal for the season with 32 ... With 4-2=6 on the year, the Boston, Mass., native stands third on the team scoring charts ... Freshman forward Teddy Blueger, who has 2-3=5 and has played in all ten MSU games to date, ranks third on the team with a +2 ... Zach Palmquist, MSU's top-scoring defenseman as a freshman last season, has 7-17=24 in 48 career games ... Palmquist currently leads MSU defensemen in points (1-4=5) and shots on goal (20) ... Palmquist has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career ... Junior defenseman Josh Nelson, who had three shots on goal and was +1 in MSU's first game vs. third-rated Denver, registered his first career power-play goal in the Nov. 10 contest vs the Pioneers ... The Wisconsin Rapids, Wis., native owns 3-7=10 numbers in 58 career games with the Mavericks ... Senior goaltender Phil Cook stands 28-29-7 for his four-year MSU career ... Cook is 3-2-1 with a .883 save percentage and 3.39 goals-against average in six appearances this year ... Cook, who has four career assists, ranks sixth on MSU's career games played by a goaltender list with 71 ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all ten MSU games this year, is +3 (second on team), has 0-2=2 and has put nine shots on goal in his debut season with the Mavericks ... One of three players in the history of the program whose last name begins with the letter "Z", senior forward Eli Zuck has 11-24=35 in 94 career games ... The Anchorage native owns 1-1=2 in eight games this year ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, the WCHA Rookie of the Week honoree two weeks ago, collected his first career assist as a collegian when he assisted on Josh Nelson's power-play goal vs #3 Denver on Nov. 10 ... Margonari has 2-1=3 in eight games in 2012-13 ... The Mavericks have outscored their opponents by a 14-11 margin in third-period goals this year ... MSU trails in first-period scoring (11-6) and second-period scoring (10-6).

NEBRASKA OMAHA

The Mavericks return to action this week, hosting Alabama-Huntsville on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 23 and 24 ... Omaha has a record of 6-3-1 overall and 4-1-1 in the WCHA, good for third place ... The Mavericks haven't played since earning their second consecutive series sweep on Nov. 10 and 11, beating Minnesota Duluth 3-2 and 6-3 at the CenturyLink Center Omaha ... Last season, the Mavs had just one series sweep ... With back-to-back sweeps, the Mavericks have won four in a row for the first time since the 2010-11 season when they stopped St. Cloud State and Wisconsin in back-to-back weekends in February ... Junior Ryan Walters and sophomore Dominic Zombo have both had hot hands for the Mavericks ... Walters now leads the team in scoring with 11 points while Zombo is right behind with 10 ... Walters has earned eight points in the last three games while Zombo has seven in that same stretch ... Goaltender John Faulkner has been in goal for each game of the Mavericks' win streak, and he remains unbeaten this season with a record of 6-0-1, a 2.03 GAA and a .915 save percentage ... He ranks third in the WCHA in GAA and sixth in save percentage ... He is one of only two undefeated goaltenders in the league, joining Alaska Anchorage's Rob Gunderson ... Faulkner is now just one win from tying Jerad Kaufmann for second all-time in wins at UNO ... Faulkner's career record is 44-34-9 ... He has played in 94 career games ... After struggling on the power-play during

Their success has helped them move from 10th to sixth in the WCHA as they are now clicking at 17.5% ... UNO's junior class is second among all other junior classes in the nation in scoring with 54 points, just one point behind Minnesota which has played one more game ... North Dakota (5-3-2, 3-1-2 WCHA) begins a two-week road swing with a non-conference series at Notre Dame on Friday and Saturday ... It will be UND's first visit to South Bend since the 1980-81 season ... The all-time series is tied 16-16-3, with UND most recently claiming a win and a tie against the Fighting Irish in Grand Forks over Thanksgiving weekend during the 2010-11 season ... The two teams also skated to a 3-3 overtime tie on Jan. 3, 2010, at Notre Dame's Shillelagh Tournament in Hoffman Estates, Ill. ... Those are the only three previous meetings between the two teams during Dave Hakstol's nine-year tenure as head coach ... UND is 2-2-0 in non-conference play this season, splitting a home series against No. 12 Boston University, and splitting a pair of games at the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, where it downed Alaska Anchorage and lost to host Alaska ... Under Hakstol, UND is 42-14-11 in regular season non-conference play ... UND is coming off of a three-point weekend against WCHA rival Minnesota Duluth last weekend in Grand Forks, winning 4-3 in overtime on Saturday after a 3-3 overtime tie ... UND rallied from a 3-1 deficit on Saturday to win on Mark MacMillan's overtime goal with :34 seconds remaining ... It was the second goal of the game for MacMillan, who also had one assist for the first 3-point game of his career ... He combined with linemates Danny Kristo (1g, 2a) and Corban Knight (2a) for eight points and a +6 ... Junior defenseman Derek Forbort added his third goal of the season on the power-play, while freshman Zane Gothberg made 28 saves for his second victory ... Kristo scored twice in UND's 3-3 tie last Friday, while Rocco Grimaldi and Andrew MacWilliam scored single tallies ... UND has been out shot in five straight games for just the second time under Hakstol, and first since the 2004-05 postseason ... UND is averaging 11,731 fans per home game, making it the top hockey draw in the United States ... No other NCAA, AHL or ECHL team is averaging more than 10,000 fans per game in 2012-13 ... Knight enters the week riding a team-best five-game point streak, with six assists during that stretch ... With 105 career points, Knight has moved into a 6-way tie for 70th on UND's all-time scoring list ... Linemate Danny Kristo is the WCHA's leading active scorer with 121 career points, which ranks 49th all-time at UND ... Kristo has reached the scoresheet in seven of his eight games this season and leads UND with 12 points ... He has three goals and three assists in his last three games.

St. Cloud State men's hockey enjoyed a bye weekend on Nov. 16-17 ... SCSU will return to action on Nov. 23-24 with a pair of WCHA games at Minnesota Duluth ... This will mark the Huskies' first return to the AMSOIL Arena since a pair of losses against UMD in the first round of the WCHA

playoffs in 2011 ... SCSU is 1-2-1 in games played at the new AMSOIL Arena ... In the all-time series against Minnesota Duluth, the Huskies own a 55-39-8 record ... The series dates back to an 8-1 win by the Huskies in 1946-47 ... At the Division 1 level, the Huskies own a 52-35-7 series record against UMD ... In the last five games in this series, SCSU is 1-2-2 against UMD ... Last year at the NHEC, SCSU posted a 2-1 victory and a 3-3 tie on March 2-3, 2012 ... The longest game in SCSU Division I history was an epic 3-2 triple OT victory in the WCHA playoffs at the NHEC on March 11, 2007 ... The length of the game was 111:33 ... SCSU senior captain Drew LeBlanc will enjoy a homecoming of sorts this weekend with his return to Duluth ... LeBlanc is a 2008 graduate of Hermantown High School, which is a suburb of Duluth ... He helped Hermantown win a MSHSL championship during his prep career ... LeBlanc and teammate Nic Dowd both rank second in the WCHA (overall games played) with 14 points ... LeBlanc, who took a medical redshirt in 2011-12, seems to be in top form this winter with five goals and nine assists to his credit ... Junior Nic Dowd and senior Ben Hanowski gained a little bit of air time on ESPN on Nov. 17 ... The pair introduced ESPN Sports Center's Top 10 segment ... The segment was filmed earlier in the summer by SCSU videographer Joel Larsen and the pair took a light-hearted approach with the intro that featured the hair-growing exploits of the Dowd and Hanowski ... On the topic of Dowd, he leads the Huskies this season with six goals and is tied with LeBlanc at 14 points ... The series at UMD will start a two-weekend road swing for the Huskies ... On Nov. 30-Dec. 1, SCSU will travel to Alaska Anchorage before coming back home on Dec. 7-8 for games against Nebraska Omaha ... The Huskies will then be a home for five consecutive series at the NHEC ...
