Then on Friday and Saturday, the schedule features a full hand of WCHA sets. Up in Houghton, Michigan Tech (4-8-3, 3-6-3 WCHA) will play host to No. 8-ranked North Dakota (8-5-3, 5-2-3 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm ET encounters at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128). This marks the only two regular season match ups of the two clubs. Michigan Tech just played five games in a nine-day period from Nov. 30-Dec. 8 and the Huskies have lost only twice in their last eight contests overall at 2-2-4. North Dakota is on a three-game unbeaten streak at 2-0-1.

At Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji, Bemidji State (4-8-2, 3-7-2 WCHA) will entertain league-leading and No. 10/11-ranked Denver (9-5-2, 7-3-2 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. This series is the only one between the Beavers and Pioneers during the 2012-13 regular season. BSU snapped a three-game winless streak with a 2-1 road win at Minnesota Duluth last Saturday while Denver enters the series without a victory in their last six outings at 0-4-2.

No. 17-ranked St. Cloud State (9-7-0, 7-5-0 WCHA) continues a stretch of 10 consecutive home games this weekend when Colorado College (8-8-2, 5-4-1 WCHA) visits the National Hockey and Event Center (5,371) at 7:37 pm CT Friday night and 7:07 pm CT Saturday evening. The Huskies and Tigers will play another two-game conference set on Feb. 22-23 in Colorado Springs.

Two of the league's hottest teams – No. 13/14-ranked Nebraska Omaha and No. 20 Minnesota State – will face-off on Friday at 7:37 pm CT and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT at CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959). The UNO Mavericks (10-5-1, 6-3-1 WCHA) and the MSU Mavericks (9-5-2, 7-5-0 WCHA), who play just twice during the regular season, have both been on tears of late. Nebraska Omaha went unbeaten during the month of November at 7-0 and is 8-2-0 over the last 10 games while Minnesota State has skated to three consecutive league sweeps and six consecutive victories under first-year head coach Mike Hastings.

And up at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage, Alaska Anchorage (3-7-4, 1-6-3 WCHA) will host Minnesota Duluth (5-8-3, 3-6-3 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT contests on Friday and Saturday – the only two times the Seawolves and Bulldogs meet up during the 168-game conference slate.

Idle from competition until Dec. 29 is No. 4-ranked and defending WCHA regular season/MacNaughton Cup champion Minnesota (11-3-3, 6-3-3 WCHA).

In a complete set of six WCHA series contested last weekend – Dec. 7-8 – only one team, Minnesota State, was able to gain a sweep with

the Mavericks downing visiting Alaska Anchorage, 3-1 and 3-0. Four of the 12 games went into overtime and all of those ended in ties, while three games were decided by one goal. Both North Dakota and Minnesota were able to bank three of four points, with UND tying (2-2 ot) and winning (6-3) against Denver in Grand Forks and the Golden Gophers winning (4-2) and tying (4-4 ot) at Colorado College. Michigan Tech managed back-to-back 1-1 (ot) and 3-3 (ot) ties at Wisconsin while two other series ended in splits. In Duluth, Minnesota Duluth won 4-2 over visiting Bemidji State last Friday before the Beavers battled back for a 2-1 triumph on Saturday. And in St. Cloud, visiting Nebraska Omaha sprung a 6-5 win on St. Cloud State in the opener on Dec. 7 before the Huskies responded with a 2-1 victory on Dec. 8.

Through the first 68 games of the conference schedule, the home-ice advantage has been almost non-existent, with home teams logging just a .522 winning percentage in WCHA games at 29-26-13.

In this week's WCHA standings, first place Denver's (16 points) lead has shrunk to one point over second place Minnesota (15 points) and two over third place Minnesota State (14 points) and St. Cloud State (14 points). Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota are tied for fifth, each with 13 points and both with two games in hand on the top four. Colorado College is seventh this week with 11 points, followed by a three-way tie for eighth between Michigan Tech, Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin, who all have nine points in 12 conference games. Bemidji State is 11th with eight points followed by Alaska Anchorage in 12th with five.

Outside the WCHA, and after 50 non-conference games as of Dec. 10, WCHA-member teams stand 26-20-4 vs other Div. 1 teams for a .560 winning percentage. League members are 5-0-1 (.917) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 8-11-0 (.421) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 3-4-1 (.438) vs ECAC Hockey (ECACH), 5-5-1 (.500) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 5-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at a perfect 5-0-0, Alaska Anchorage is 2-0-1, Minnesota State is 2-0-2, Nebraska Omaha is 4-2-0, Denver, Minnesota Duluth and St. Cloud State are all 2-2-0, Bemidji State is 1-1-0, Michigan Tech is 1-2-0, Colorado College is 3-4-1, North Dakota is 2-3-0 and Wisconsin is 0-2-0.

Following the games on Dec. 15, the league will break for almost two weeks for the holiday period before play resumes on Dec. 29.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued Dec. 10, the WCHA has six teams among the top 20, with Minnesota at No. 4, North Dakota at No. 8, Denver at No. 11, Nebraska Omaha at No. 13, St. Cloud State at No. 17 and Minnesota State at No. 20. Also receiving votes was Colorado College.

And in the latest (Dec. 10) USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 8, Denver is No. 10 and Nebraska Omaha is No. 14. Teams receiving votes from the WCHA were St. Cloud State, Colorado College and Minnesota State.

NEBRASKA OMAHA'S RYAN WALTERS HONORED AS NOVEMBER'S NATIONAL COLLEGE HOCKEY PLAYER OF THE MONTH MINNESOTA'S ADAM WILCOX IS ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

WAKEFIELD, Mass. – University of Nebraska Omaha forward Ryan Walters, who posted one of the finest months ever for a Mavericks player with 15 points to help his team to a perfect 7-0-0 record, has been named the Hockey Commissioners' Association National Division 1 Player of the Month for November.

A 6-0, 196-pound junior from Rosemount, Minn., Walters scored six goals and set up nine others for 15 points in just seven games, posted multiple-point games in six straight outings, fired 31 shots on goal and earned a +8 plus/minus rating as UNO built the second-longest winning streak in school history. After going pointless in the first game of the month, he scored points in his next six outings, including five straight with a goal. He scored a power-play goal and had two assists in a 5-3 win at Michigan Tech on Nov. 3 that gave UNO a sweep, had a goal and an assist in a 3-2 victory over Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 10 and then had another goal and two assists, including one on the game-winner, the following day as the Mavericks swept the visiting Bulldogs with a 6-3 win. Against Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, he had the game's first goal and an assist in a 3-2 win and then helped UNO forge a 8-0 triumph on Nov. 24 with two tallies and an assist. Walters then finished the month with two assists, again contributing to the game-winning goal, as the Mavericks upset No. 3-ranked Minnesota, 3-2, in Minneapolis.

Through 14 games this season, Walters leads both Nebraska Omaha and the Western Collegiate Hockey Association in scoring with 20 points (6g, 14a), is tied for the league assist lead, and is ninth nationally with 1.43 points per game. He has played in 89 consecutive games during his collegiate career.

Named as the HCA National Division 1 Rookie of the Month for November was University of Minnesota goaltender Adam Wilcox, who went 5-2-2 with a 1.75 goals-against average and .925 save percentage, forged a six-game unbeaten streak, and allowed two or fewer goals in eight of his nine starts.

A 6-0, 186-pound freshman from South St. Paul, Minn., Wilcox emerged as the Golden Gophers' starting goaltender in the month of November. He went 4-0-2 over a six-game stretch between Nov. 9-24 that included a 4-0 shutout at Alaska Anchorage on Nov. 9, a 2-2 (ot) tie and 3-1 victory over Wisconsin on Nov. 16-17 and a 5-1, 3-1 non-conference road sweep at Vermont over the Thanksgiving weekend that saw him stop 48 of 50 shots on goal. He was named the WCHA Rookie of the Month on Nov. 13 and for the month, he turned aside 198 of 214 shots on goal.

Over 819:23 minutes of action in nets, Wilcox leads the WCHA overall with a 1.61 goals-against average, is third in save percentage at .925, and is first in victories at 9-2-2 and second in winning percentage at .769. He is a draft choice of the NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning.

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all regular-season home games. On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center was dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the

last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created.”

WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The Bulldogs traded wins with Bemidji State last weekend in their final home appearances of 2012, opening up with the 4-2 triumph on Friday before falling 2-1 the following evening ... Senior center Jake Hendrickson scored twice while his linemate, senior right winger Keegan Flaherty, turned in a two-point night (1g, 1a) on Friday for UMD, which struck three times in the third period ... In the rematch, the Bulldogs outshot their intrastate rivals 34-19 (13-2 in the final period) but had just Caleb Herbert's goal to show for it (with 50 seconds remaining in regulation and with the extra attacker on for UMD) ... Mike Seidel, who has picked up at least one point in 14 of UMD's 16 outings to date (he was blanked last Saturday night and in UMD's 2-0 loss to Wisconsin on Oct. 26), continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with 10 goals and eight assists ... Those 10 goals are bettered by only four other NCAA Div. 1 combatants at the moment while his six

power-play scores are tops in the nation (he shares that honor with St. Lawrence University's Greg Carey) ... Seidel, who had his personal best 10-game scoring streak terminated Saturday night by Bemidji State, also ranks 14th nationally and is third in the WCHA in shots on goal (a 3.94 per night average) ... UMD has yet to win a series rematch game this season, going 0-6-2 ... UMD's rookie class is the fourth highest scoring group in the country (along with St. Cloud State University), amassing 43 points on 15 goals and 28 assists ... Left winger Austin Farley, the reigning WCHA Offensive Player of the Week, is tied for second among all NCAA freshman with seven goals and nine assists for 16 points (three less than nation-leading Riley Barber of Miami University) while Bulldog center Tony Cameranesi is sixth with 15 points ... Last Friday's 4-2 win over Bemidji State marked Scott Sandelin's 500th game as the Bulldogs head coach ... In his 13 seasons behind the UMD bench, he's produced a 222-218-61 overall record – including a 100-57-24 mark (for a .619 winning percentage) since the start of the 2008-09 season ... Sandelin is 17-13-7 in 37 career meetings with Alaska Anchorage ... Both freshman Matt McNeely (3-4-1) and junior Aaron Crandall (2-4-2) and have made seven starts in goal for the Bulldogs thus far ... Crandall has faced Alaska Anchorage only once previously – on Oct. 23, 2010 when he turned aside all 26 Seawolf shots for his first collegiate shut out in a 6-0 triumph ...
