Both No. 1-ranked Minnesota and No. 15-ranked Minnesota State are idle this week.

At Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji this Friday and Saturday, St. Cloud State (15-10-1, 12-5-1 WCHA) will go up against host Bemidji State (5-14-5, 4-10-4 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT in the opener and 7:07 pm CT in the finale. The only two-game series between the Huskies and Beavers during the regular season, SCSU has forged a 3-0-1 over the last four league outings, including a sweep over Denver and a win at tie at North Dakota, to move into first place.

At CenturyLink Center Omaha (15,959), Nebraska Omaha (15-9-2, 11-5-2 WCHA) will host Michigan Tech (7-12-4, 4-10-4 WCHA) at 7:37 pm CT on Friday evening and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday night. The Mavericks, who are 4-1-1 over their last six WCHA contests while banking nine of a possible 12 points, won twice over the host Huskies in Houghton back on Nov. 2-3 by 2-1 and 5-3 scores. MTU, idle last week, is 3-2-1 since Dec. 15.

In Grand Forks, Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634) will be the site of a two-game set between longtime rivals North Dakota and Wisconsin, with face-offs at 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. North Dakota (13-8-5, 8-5-5 WCHA) and Wisconsin (11-8-5, 8-5-5 WCHA) feature identical league records and are tied for fourth in the league standings (with Minnesota State). The games are of added significance as this, too, is the only regular season series between UND and the Badgers. North Dakota has one win in the last six league games after a loss and tie to visiting St. Cloud State on Jan. 25-26 while Wisconsin enters the series as one of the hottest clubs in the country, standing 10-1-3 overall since Nov. 24 and boasting a 10-game unbeaten streak in league play at 7-0-3.

At AMSOIL Arena (6,726) Feb. 1-2, Minnesota Duluth and Denver return to league play with a two-game set that features a pair of 7:07 pm CT puck drops. The Bulldogs (10-11-3, 8-7-3 WCHA) and Pioneers (13-8-4, 8-6-4 WCHA) are separated by just a single point in the standings and this is their only two-game series during the regular season. UMD is 5-3-0 in league play since Dec. 8 and 3-1-0 over the last four, while DU is coming off a bye week.

And up at Sullivan Arena (6,251) Friday and Saturday, Alaska Anchorage (3-16-5, 1-15-4 WCHA) takes on visiting Colorado College (10-14-2, 7-10-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm AT encounters – also the only two regular season meetings between the Seawolves and Tigers. Six of Alaska Anchorage's conference setbacks this season have come by just a single goal while Colorado College returns to the ice after a bye week.

With six weeks to go, the races for the WCHA regular season championship as well as for a top six finish and a resulting first round home playoff berth continue to tighten. The regular season champion in the WCHA will be awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earn the No. 1 seed for the post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final regular season standings will earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set

St. Cloud State (18 gp, 12-5-1 WCHA, 25 points) currently holds a one-point advantage over Minnesota (18 gp, 10-4-4 WCHA, 24 points) and Nebraska Omaha (18 gp, 11-5-2, 24 points). Three teams are tied for fourth place this week in North Dakota (18 gp, 8-5-5 WCHA, 21 points), Wisconsin (18 gp, 8-5-5 WCHA, 21 points) and Minnesota State (20 gp, 10-9-1 WCHA, 21 points), although UND and the Badgers have two games in hand. One point back of those three clubs in seventh place is Denver (18 gp, 8-6-4 WCHA, 20 points), Minnesota Duluth (18 gp, 8-7-3 WCHA), 19 points) is eighth and Colorado College (18 gp, 7-10-1 WCHA, 15 points) is ninth. Tied for 10th are Bemidji State (18 gp, 4-10-4 WCHA, 12 points) and Michigan Tech (18 gp, 4-10-4 WCHA, 12 points) while Alaska Anchorage is 12th (20 gp, 1-15-4 WCHA, 6 points).

After the first round league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23, at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

Through 110 games contested of the 168-game conference schedule and as of Jan. 28, home teams are just 48-43-19 in Western Collegiate Hockey Association games for a .523 winning percentage. Last weekend (Jan. 25-26), the home teams went just 2-5-1 in league play.

WCHA men's-member teams own a 44-31-5 (.581) record in non-conference match ups so far this season. League-member teams

are 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 12-15-1 (.446) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey (ECAC Hockey), 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record so far at a perfect 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other 2012-13 non-conference records by member team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (3-3-0).

Looking forward to next week's schedule there will be a full complement of six WCHA series contested on Friday and Saturday, February 8-9. Alaska Anchorage travels to Michigan Tech for the Huskies' annual Winter Carnival weekend, Bemidji State heads to Wisconsin, St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth entertains Minnesota State, Colorado College and Denver play a home-and-home set, and Nebraska Omaha welcomes North Dakota. The first game of the UNO vs UND series will be played at CenturyLink Center Omaha while that Saturday's late afternoon contest will be played outdoors at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha.

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 28, seven WCHA-member teams are among the nation's top 20. Minnesota remains at No. 1, North Dakota is at No. 7, Denver is No. 10, St. Cloud State is up to No. 12, Nebraska Omaha is at No. 14, Minnesota State is No. 15, and Wisconsin is No. 19.

And in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued January 28, Minnesota is No. 1, North Dakota is No. 8, Denver is No. 10, St. Cloud State is No. 13, Nebraska Omaha is No. 14 and Minnesota State is No. 15. Also receiving votes was Wisconsin.

## U.S. NATIONAL SLED TEAM WINS USA HOCKEY SLED CUP; DEFEATS KOREA 5-2 DAN MCCOY SCORED TWICE IN CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

INDIAN TRAIL, N.C. – The U.S. National Sled Team won the inaugural USA Hockey Sled Cup by defeating Korea, 5-2, here tonight at the Extreme Ice Center. Dan McCoy (Cheswick, PA) scored two goals, while four other U.S. players also had multi-point efforts in the championship game.

"It's always fun to win and to do so on home ice is exciting for all of us," said Jeff Sauer, head coach of the U.S. National Sled Team. "We had to fight hard to win this game tonight because Korea gave it their all. We scored the goals and made the key plays in the game when necessary to get the victory."

Team USA capitalized on its first power-play opportunity of the night at 3:21 of the first period. Paul Schaus (Buffalo, NY) drove through the low slot with a defender on his hip and managed to tip a crossing pass from Greg Shaw (Merritt Island, FL) into the net.

Midway through the second period the teams exchanged goals. Team USA took a 2-0 lead at 6:05 on a McCoy breakaway that was created by Kevin McKee's (Davenport, IA) long pass from the U.S. blue line. A minute and a half later, Korea scored on a deflected point shot.

Nikko Landeros (Johnstown, CO) put the U.S. ahead 3-1 with a power-play goal that he lofted in from the left circle at 9:17.

At 5:20 of the third stanza, Korea cut the U.S. lead to a single goal when it scored on a five-on-three advantage.

Team USA bounced back, however, with a shorthanded marker just :47 seconds later. Joshua Sweeney (Phoenix, AZ) forced the puck free near center ice, where Adam Page (Lancaster, NY) scooped it up and cruised in alone. Page faked left then tucked the puck inside the right post for a 4-2 U.S. lead.

McCoy locked up the win for Team USA with 2:29 remaining in the game when his shot from the edge of the crease hit the netminder and trickled over the goal line.

Goaltender Steve Cash (Overland, MO) made 10 saves, while Korea's Mangyun Yu turned aside 18 shots.

In the USA Hockey Sled Cup third-place game, Russia prevailed over the U.S. National Developmental Team 7-0.

Up next for the U.S. National Sled Team is a three-game series against Canada Feb. 14-16 in Ottawa, Ont.

Notes: Josh Pauls (Green Brook, NJ) led the tournament in points (7) and assists (5) ... Jeff Sauer (Madison, WI), former men's ice hockey head coach at Colorado College and the University of Wisconsin, is the head coach of the U.S. National Sled Team, while Guy Gosselin (Grafton, WI) is the assistant coach ... The U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team for the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia, will be chosen this summer.

## **WCHA GRANTS FULL-TIME MEMBERSHIP TO UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA IN HUNTSVILLE CHARGERS TO BECOME 10TH MEMBER OF MEN'S LEAGUE**

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association men's membership voted today (January 17) to admit the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) as a full-time men's conference member. In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair of the WCHA President's Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of the WCHA, said "The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men's member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference

tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since its founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA-members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

### **ABOUT UAH HOCKEY**

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only DI hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

## WISCONSIN MEN'S HOCKEY CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Earlier this fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and men's coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire Wisconsin athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. Nights honoring those NCAA championship teams will make up part of the schedule. The department will honor the 1973 team on Friday, Jan. 25 when the Badgers skate against Alaska Anchorage, while recognition comes for the 1983 squad on Friday, Feb. 8 when Wisconsin takes on Bemidji State.

Throughout the season, men's hockey will also recognize honorary captains during all regular-season home games. On Friday, Nov. 2, the ice at the Kohl Center was dedicated to "Badger" Bob Johnson and named for the program's greatest architect.

In addition, this year's schedule poster will pay homage to the program's history and tie the current day Badgers to the teams from the 1920s and 1930s.

"I was here in the 1970s as a student-athlete when Bob Johnson was the coach and have been here for the last decade as a coach myself, and it has been a great journey," said Eaves. "We carry the torch forward for everyone who has been involved throughout the last 50 years and the entire history of the program, and we want to use this season as a chance to recognize some of those people and the tradition they created."

## WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

UAA won on Friday evening, 6-3, before the Tigers took Saturday's game, 4-3 ... in the last five games, UAA leads, 3-2, while the teams are tied 7-7 in the last 14 ... the last time UAA swept at home was Jan. 14-15, 2011 (4-1, 2-1) ... the 2-1 win was the last time the Seawolves won at home against CC ... UAA hosts the Tigers after being swept by the then-No. 20 ranked Wisconsin Badgers, 5-2, 2-1 on Jan. 25-26 in Madison ... with the sweep, UAA is in a 12-game winless streak with its only tie coming on Jan. 18 vs. Minnesota State at home ... on Friday night, the Seawolves received all of its points from UAA's second line made up of sophomore Scott Allen (1-1=2), freshman center Blake Tatchell (1-1=2) and junior Jordan Kwas (0-2=2) ... the multi-point games were Allen's fifth, Tatchell's third and Kwas' fifth of their careers ... this was the first time the trio had skated together on the same line ... with the two points, Tatchell continues to lead UAA with 15 points, while Allen is tied for second with Kwas with 13 points and leads in goals (9) ... Allen (9-4=13), who was named to the Kendall Hockey Classic all-tournament team in October, has easily bypassed his goal total from his rookie campaign (3) ... BSU is 2-3-1 versus the Mavericks in games played in Bemidji, Minn. ... The Beavers have now played eight consecutive games without a victory (0-6-2) ... The last time BSU played a stretch of eight-or-more games without a win was Feb. 9 to March 15 of 2002 (0-6-2) to cap the 2001-02 season – Tom Serratore's first season as head coach of the Beavers ... Bemidji State is now 3-6-3 at home this season and seek its first victory on Sanford Center ice since a 5-1 victory over then-No. 10 Denver Dec. 15 (0-2-1) ... In the short history of Sanford Center, BSU has only one winless streak that is longer – a five game (0-4-1) streak to open the new building Oct. 15-Nov. 13, 2010 ... Brady Wacker registered the first goal of his senior season last Friday ... It marked his first tally since he lit the lamp Dec. 14, 2012 – a streak spanning 376 games and 35 games ... He has six points (1g, 5a) to sit second among BSU's defenders in scoring ... Two of BSU's three goals Friday came from BSU's defensive corps – a group averaging just over one point per game this season (1.08 ppg) and including Friday, only four goals have come from the BSU blueliners ... the last time BSU had two different defenders score a goal in the

same game was a 5-0 win versus Alabama-Huntsville Dec. 17, 2011 (41 games), a contest in which Brady Wacker and former Beaver Brad Hunt (2008-11) each scored ... Brance Orban continues to lead the Beavers in scoring with 16 points (5g, 11a), while Aaron McLeod owns the Beavers' top goal-scoring mark with 10, and Orban holds down BSU's top assist spot with 12 ... Colorado College, which was idle last week, is coming off its most lopsided victory of the season – a 5-1 triumph over Minnesota Duluth on Saturday, Jan. 19, that salvaged a split of the teams' two-game series at the World Arena ... Minnesota is coming off a home-and-home split with Minnesota State last weekend, losing 2-1 on Friday to snap the team's 10-game unbeaten streak before rallying for a 4-1 win on the road on Saturday ... Friday's loss marked the first game since Dec. 1 that Minnesota failed to score at least four goals in a game (a span of nine games) ... Nate Schmidt paced Minnesota with two goals over the weekend including the eventual game-winner on Saturday night ... Schmidt has now tallied a point in every game this season and leads the NCAA in scoring by a defenseman with 25 points (6g, 19a) ... Four different Gophers tallied goals last Saturday including Justin Holl, who snapped a 42-game goal drought with his first tally of the season ... Zach Budish, Schmidt and Erik Haula also tallied for the Gophers on Saturday with Haula reclaiming a spot on the score sheet after having his 16-game point streak snapped last Friday ... Haula, who played in his 100th career game last Saturday, currently leads the Gophers, ranks sixth in the WCHA and tied for eighth nationally with 31 points (11g, 20a) ... Haula's 20 assists also lead the team and rank tied for ninth nationally ... Nick Bjugstad and Kyle Rau are the Gophers' leading goal scorers this season with 13 each ... six of Rau's goals have come on the power-play, ranking the sophomore tied for sixth nationally and tied for second in the WCHA ... Rau has also tallied five game-winning goals this season – the second most in the nation and most among all WCHA skaters ... Adam Wilcox continues to pace the WCHA in his first season in goal for Minnesota ... the rookie holds an league-best 1.70 GAA that ranks fifth nationally ... the rookie also has a WCHA-high 17 wins and a league best .792 winning percentage (17-3-4, second in the NCAA this season) ... Wilcox also has a .926 save percentage and has recorded three shutouts in his first season with the team ... Minnesota continues to lead the WCHA in all four major team statistical categories including scoring offense (98 goals, 3.77 goals per game) – the Gophers also lead the nation in scoring offense ... additionally, Minnesota leads the league and ranks nationally in scoring defense (48 goals against, 1.85 goals-against per game, tied for third nationally), power-play (30-for-121, .248, fourth nationally) and penalty-kill (74-for-83, .892, seventh nationally) ... Minnesota is the only team in the nation to rank among the top 10 in all four categories ... the No. 1 Gophers return to action in two weeks with a road series at No.

12/13 St. Cloud State – setting up a weekend between two of the top teams in the WCHA standings ... St. Cloud State leads the league with 25 points while the Gophers are one point back in a tie for second with Omaha ... the series with the Huskies marks Minnesota's first and only regular-season meeting with St. Cloud State this season – the Gophers are 51-27-12 all-time against the Huskies including a 17-14-6 mark on the road ... 2012-13 marks Minnesota's final season in the WCHA before the Gophers move to the new Big Ten Conference next season ... Minnesota is 7-2-3 against nationally-ranked opponents this season with Friday's loss marking just the second time this season Minnesota has fallen at Mariucci Arena (12-2-2) ... the Gophers posted an 8-0-0 record in nonconference play and close out the 2012-13 regular season with 10-straight WCHA contests including four at home.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

UMD returns to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association grind this weekend to host the University of Denver ... The Pioneers are the only league club that has yet to pay a visit to AMSOIL Arena, but were the Bulldogs' opponent in the final game ever at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center – a 2-1 UMD victory on Dec. 10, 2010) ... UMD took three of our points from the host Pioneers in the two clubs' lone series one year ago, following up a 3-3 overtime time with a 4-0 triumph on Nov. 4-5) ... The Bulldogs will be at home for 10 of its final 14 regular season games ... UMD took a break from regular season play last Saturday afternoon and skated off with a 3-1 exhibition victory over the U.S. National Under-18 Team at AMSOIL Arena ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, sophomore left winger Justin Crandall and sophomore center Caleb Herbert (on the power-play) had a goal apiece while freshman Matt McNeely (15 saves) and Alex Fons (six saves on seven shots) and Aaron Crandall (three saves) each handled the goaltending duties for one period ... UMD is unbeaten in eight of its last 10 WCHA engagements (7-2-1) and had its five-game league win streak snapped in its most recent regular season outing – a 5-1 loss at Colorado College on Jan. 19 ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel continues to pace the Bulldogs in scoring with 23 points ... Six of Seidel's team-leading 12 goals have come on the power-play, a number bettered by only one other WCHA combatant (Minnesota State, Mankato's Eriah Hayes with seven) ... He also is tied for fourth in the WCHA in game-winners with three ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in all but seven games this season and currently possess the WCHA's second most efficient power-play at 22.4% ... Only four other NCAA clubs – Union College (31), Minnesota (30), Minnesota State, Mankato (28) and Western Michigan (25) – have racked up more power-play goals than UMD (24) to date ... Junior right winger Joe Basaraba, who skated in his 100th collegiate game at Colorado College on Jan. 19, now has seven goals on the season, matching his career high which he established as a sophomore ... UMD is an impressive 8-2-1 in series openers this season but a mere 2-6-2 in rematch games with the two lone wins coming at Alaska Anchorage (2-1 on Dec. 15) and versus Michigan Tech on Jan. 12 in Duluth ... UMD's rookie class is the ninth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment amassing 54 points on 21 goals and 33 assists ... Tony Cameranesi, ranks seventh nationally in freshmen scoring with 22 points and is second among WCHA newcomers in that department (one point back of St. Cloud State's Kalle Kossila) ... Cameranesi's 12 power-play points this season are the fourth most of any WCHA skater – and tops among freshmen (he shares that honor with Denver defenseman Nolan Zajac) while his 3.79 shots per game ranks fifth in the league ... Left winger Austin Farley, is tied for 6th among WCHA freshmen in points (17) and Andy Welinski holds down the No. 2 slot on the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring charts with two goals and nine assists ... UMD's most recent appearance at AMSOIL Arena – a 5-4 triumph over Michigan Tech on Jan. 12, came in front of a UMD record home crowd of 6,829 ... The Bulldogs are 24-13-4 in 41 lifetime appearances at AMSOIL Arena, which opened its doors for business on Dec. 30, 2010 ... That includes a 5-4-1 record this season ... UMD is averaging the sixth best home attendance (6,255 a night) of any team in the nation this season ... Matt McNeely has gotten the starting nod in 10 of the last 12 games – including the last eight in a row – and

in those 10 starts has compiled a 7-3-0 record, a 2.38 goals-against average and a .905 saves percentage ... Junior defenseman Tim Smith (+7), sophomore defenseman Chris Casto (+3) and freshman center Tony Cameranesi (+2) are the lone three Bulldogs who currently sport positive plus-minus numbers ... Casto is an impressive +24 for his career while senior defenseman Wade Bergman is not far behind at a +20 ... Tim Smith has scored each of his three points this season (all assists) at home.

Sophomore forward Matt Leitner has racked up 9-15=24 in the last 23 games and leads the Mavericks in scoring and assists with 10-20=30 on the year ... The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for 11th in the country in points and is tied for sixth in assists ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, leads the country in power-play points with 17 and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career with 66 straight appearances ... Senior forward Eriah Hayes is third on MSU's scoring charts on the season with 12-9=21 ... Hayes stands as MSU's active career scoring leader with 44-37=81 in 140 career games and is tied for 17th on the school's all-time career scoring list with Pete Holoein (22-59=81 from 1998-01) and Rylan Galiardi (29-52=81 from 2007-11) ... Next on the list is defenseman Ben Christopherson, who ranks 16th and had 12-70=82 in 148 games from 1998-2001 ... Hayes, who has 10-7=17 in the last 20 games, leads the Mavericks with seven power-play goals, which stands tied for second in the country ... His 12 goals on the season stands tied for 16th in the nation ... Sophomore forward J.P. Lafontaine, who has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career, has 8-17=25 on the year to rank second on MSU's scoring charts ... A member of the 2011-12 WCHA All-Rookie Team, Lafontaine owns 21-32=53 in 66 career games ... Senior forward Eli Zuck owns 2-9=11 in 26 games played on the year ... Zuck, who has 12-32=44 in 112 career games, stands atop MSU's plus/minus chart this year at +11 ... Zuck entered the Minnesota series with 0-5=5 in the last nine games and the Mavericks are 11-0-0 on the year in games in which he scores a point ... Senior defenseman Evan Mosey has 4-2=6 in 17 games this year, with his four tallies representing a single-season career high ... Mosey, who is tied for second on the team with a +7 on the year, has 9-19=28 in 99 career games ... Junior forward Zach Lehrke, who has played in all 28 games this year, has racked up 3-10=13 in the last 17 games and stands sixth on the team's scoring charts with 4-13=17 on the season ... Junior forward Johnny McInnis has 7-4=11 in the last 16 games and ranks fifth

on the team in scoring (11-7=18) ... McInnis, who leads the Mavericks with four game-winning goals (which stands tied for third in the country), is second on the team in goals (11) and is second in shots on goal (85) ... Sophomore defenseman Brett Stern, who had 0-1=1 in 19 GP as a freshman last year, has 2-5=7 in 27 GP this year ... The former Green Bay Gambler has 2-4=6 in the last 15 games ... Freshman netminder Stephon Williams, a two-time WCHA Rookie of the Week this year, has won 13 of his last 18 starts ... For the year Williams stands 13-7-2 (16th in the country in winning percentage – .636) with a 1.82 goals-against average (11th in the country) and a .927 save percentage (18th in the country) ... Williams leads all NCAA D1 netminders with 1707.57 minutes played ... Freshman forward Brett Knowles, who has 2-2=4 in the last 15 games and owns 2-6=8 in 27 games played, got his first career game-winning goal in last Friday's 2-1 victory at #1 Minnesota ... Knowles is tied for fifth on the Mavericks with a +5 on the year ... Freshman forward Dylan Margonari, the WCHA Rookie of the Week after MSU split a WCHA series with Minnesota Nov. 2-3, has 4-7=11 in the last 21 games ... Margonari has 5-7=12 in 26 games in 2012-13 to rank ninth on the team scoring charts ... Freshman defenseman Jon Jutzi, who has played in all 28 MSU games in 2012-13, has 1-4=5 on the year and is tied for fifth on the Mavericks with a +5 ... Freshman forward Bryce Gervais, who has 5-1=6 and is +2 on the year, has seen action in all 28 games in his maiden season with the Mavericks ... He's seventh on the team with 58 shots on goal ... The two power-play goals given up to #1 Minnesota marked the first time since Nov. 2 that an opponent scored at least two power-play markers on the Mavericks (Minnesota was 3-of-6 vs. MSU Nov. 2) ... Minnesota State has held opponents to six power-play goals in the last 20 games (three in the last 11) and has killed off 61-of-67 opponent power-play opportunities during that time ... For the season, the Mavericks are 30th in the country with a 83.0% PK mark having killed off 88 of 106 opponent power-plays.

Senior forward Danny Kristo leads all active UND skaters with 10 points (5g, 5a) in eight career games against the Badgers ... UND managed to claim just one point from SCSU last weekend, falling 3-1 on Friday and tying 2-2 on Saturday ... Senior forward Corban Knight had his point streak snapped at 19 games during last Friday's loss ... It was the fourth-longest streak in UND history and the longest in 25 years ... He collected nine goals and 22 assists for 31 points during his streak ... Knight returned to the scoresheet the next night, scoring one of UND's two goals and assisting on the other ... He has notched at least one point in all but three of his 25 games and leads the team in points (35) and assists (23) ... UND is now 31-2-6 all-time when Knight scores a goal ... UND is now unbeaten (2-0-5) in seven overtime games this year after going winless (0-1-3) in extra time last year ... Senior defenseman Andrew MacWilliam has played in more games (147) than any other active WCHA defensemen and ranks fifth nationally among all skaters ... Last Friday night marked the first time all season that both Knight and Kristo were held without a point in the same game ... UND leads the NCAA in home attendance, averaging 11,684 fans per game in the 11,364 seat Ralph Engelstad Arena.

St. Cloud State University men's hockey maintained its hold on first place in the WCHA with a three-point weekend at North Dakota on Jan. 25-26 ... The Huskies opened the weekend with a solid 3-1 victory over UND on Jan. 25 and completed the trip with a 2-2 tie in Grand Forks on Jan. 26 ... The weekend's results moved the Huskies' season record to 15-10-1, 12-5-1 WCHA ... SCSU will continue its WCHA season on Feb. 1-2 with a pair of road games at Bemidji State ... Fans can listen to both of these games on KNSI AM 1450/FM 103.3 (www.knsiradio.com) and KVSC 88.1 FM (www.kvsc.org) ... The games are also scheduled to be televised live on Lakeland Public Television (check your local listings for the availability of LPTV in your area) ... SCSU postseason honors candidate Drew LeBlanc continues to lead the nation in assists this winter with 28 ... He added a helper on Ben Hanowski's game-tying goal on Jan. 26 ... LeBlanc also ranks second in the nation this winter with 35 points ... In his career as a Husky, LeBlanc ranks 10th in the team records with 132 points and fifth in the team charts with 96 assists ... SCSU senior captain Ben Hanowski accounted for three of the Huskies' five goals over the weekend at UND ... Hanowski notched the game-winner on Jan. 25 with his first period goal at 16:36 and he scored two goals in the 2-2 tie on Jan. 26, including the game-tying goal at 1:59 of the third period ... The game on Jan. 26 marked SCSU's first tie game of the season and it was just the second time in 2012-13 that the Huskies have played in overtime ... SCSU is 1-0-1 in overtime games this season ... If you are looking for any trends, Jonny Brodzinski's dad Mike Brodzinski scored 20g, 14a during his first season of play at St. Cloud State in 1984-85 ... The elder Brodzinski went on to score 76g, 70a during his career at SCSU from 1984-87 ... SCSU freshman Kalle Kossila will bring a five-game point-scoring streak into the series at BSU ... He added assists in the series at UND and now has increased his first-year scoring totals to 11 goals and 12 assists ... He ranks fourth among D1 rookies this year with 23 points in 23 games played ... A total of seven Huskies have played in all 25 of SCSU's games this season ... This group includes junior blueliner Nick Jensen who is the team's current Iron Man having played in 103 consecutive games at SCSU ... In fact, Jensen has played in every game since he joined the club in 2010-11 ... A draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings, Jensen ranks third among D1 defensemen this season with 16 assists ... In his career, Jensen has 14 goals and 60 assists ... SCSU sophomore goalie Ryan Faragher seems to enjoy working at the Ralph Engelstad Arena ... In his four outings at UND during his career, Faragher owns a 2-1-1 record and has allowed just six goals in those four games ... He gave up one power-play goal in the third period on Jan. 25 and allowed just two goals in the 2-2 tie on Jan. 26 ... On the season, Faragher's numbers continue to impress with a league leading .735 win percentage (12-4-1) in WCHA play ... UND moves to the National Collegiate Hockey Conference next season, while the Badgers will be part of the Big Ten ... Wisconsin is 7-0-3 in its last 10 WCHA contests, including a 5-0-1 mark on the road during that stretch. Overall, UW owns wins in nine of its last 10 games and is 10-1-3 since Nov. 30 ... the Badgers are 6-1-3 on the road and 5-2-3 against ranked opponents this year ... UW is 4-1-3 against ranked teams on the road ... junior forward Michael Mersch is tied for second in the nation with 15 goals, one behind the national lead.
