Each of the 10 member WCHA teams play a total of 28 conference games in 2013-14. Each team will play five other league members four times each and four others two times each. The regular season champion in the WCHA is awarded the MacNaughton Cup.

In a relatively light week of games, Alaska (2-1-1) is the only other conference team in action as the Nanooks entertain Mercyhurst (1-4-0) from the Atlantic Hockey Association at 7:07 pm AT both Friday and Saturday at Patty Ice Arena on campus.

Five other league clubs – Alaska Anchorage, Bowling Green, Ferris State, Lake Superior State and Minnesota State – are all idle this week.

WCHA teams stepped up and went a combined 11-7-2 (.632) in 19 total non-conference match ups last week, beginning on Tuesday (October 15) and continuing through Sunday (October 20), highlighted by the Alaska Nanooks claiming their own Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament championship and Lake Superior State going on the road and winning twice at then No. 15/16-ranked Union College.

Overall so far this season, WCHA teams are a combined 17-18-5 (.488) in non-conference action, with 12 of those 18 defeats coming on the road and eight by just one goal.

Last Tuesday night, Ferris State and Bowling Green got the league rolling. The Bulldogs won 3-2 on the road at Mercyhurst (AHA) and Bowling Green, trailing 3-0 in the second period, forged a 4-3 comeback victory over visiting Big 10 Conference-member Ohio State.

Alaska became the second WCHA team to claim a tournament championship early in the new campaign last Saturday night when the Nanooks captured the Brice Alaska Goal Rush crown in Fairbanks. Alaska, who won 3-2 (ot) over then No. 12-ranked Denver of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference last Friday then claimed the championship with a shootout victory over another NCHC-member in Western Michigan following a 3-3 (ot) tie. The Nanooks now join the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves in the 2013-14 tournament winner's circle. The Seawolves (3-1-0), who won the Kendall Hockey Classic on October 11-12 in Anchorage, also played in the Brice Alaska Goal Rush, battling back from a 6-2 loss to WMU last Friday to defeat Denver 3-2 (ot). First-year head coach Matt Thomas has UAA victorious in three of their first four games this season.

Lake Superior State, off to a perfect start this season, moved to 4-0-0 overall after coach Jim Roque's Lakers won back-to-back road tilts at Union on October 18-19 by scores of 6-5 (ot) and 3-2. LSSU won a pair of season-opening 3-1 games over visiting Robert Morris on October 11-12.

Bowling Green and Ferris State, who both played three games in five nights last week, opening their home schedules on October 18-19. The Falcons made it a 2-0-1 week when they followed up a 1-1 (ot) tie with Colgate (ECAC Hockey) last Friday with an impressive 7-0 verdict last Saturday, while the host Bulldogs split with St. Lawrence, 2-3 and 5-3, to stand 2-1 for the week.

Minnesota State (2-2-0), pre-season favorites in the WCHA, bounced back from a pair of opening weekend losses at Providence with 2-1 and 6-1 home-ice victories over visiting ECAC Hockey-member Connecticut in Mankato last weekend.

Up in Marquette on October 18-19, Northern Michigan went up against Nebraska Omaha (NCHC). The Wildcats dropped a 2-1 decision last Friday, surrendering the winner at 17:09 of the third period, but stormed back on Saturday to prevail 6-3 over the Mavericks.

In the two other non-conference series contested last weekend by WCHA teams, host Bemidji State dropped 6-3 and 5-1 games to Minnesota while Michigan Tech was upended 3-2 at Notre Dame last Friday and 7-3 on Sunday. The Beavers played



their first two series of 2013-14 at St. Cloud State (NCHC) and vs Minnesota (Big 10) while the Huskies have played four straight away from home at Minnesota Duluth (NCHC) and Notre Dame (Hockey East Association).

Looking ahead to next week, Bowling Green and Lake Superior State both play single games on Tuesday (October 29) prior to a busy weekend of league and non-conference match ups. The Falcons play at Ohio State (Big 10) while Lake Superior State hosts Laurentian University in an exhibition.

On Friday (November 1) and Saturday (November 2), there will be four, two-game conference series contested as Alaska Anchorage travels to Bowling Green, Alabama Huntsville hosts Ferris State, Bemidji State entertains Minnesota State and Northern Michigan heads to Alaska. That will mark the second straight week Bowling Green skates in three games in just five days.

In non-conference series involving WCHA teams November 1-2, Michigan Tech and Lake Superior State both engage Big 10 Conference opponents. The Huskies play a pair at Michigan while the Lakers head to Wisconsin.

Minnesota State Tabbed as 2013-14 Preseason Favorite in Mankato Free Press WCHA Men's Hockey Preseason Coaches Poll

Poll Has Ferris State Second, Michigan Tech Third, Bowling Green Fourth; Minnesota State Forward Matt Leitner is WCHA Preseason Player of the Year; Mavericks' Forward Zach Stepan is Preseason Rookie of the Year

September 25, 2013 – Minnesota State has been tabbed as the favorite to win the MacNaughton Cup, garnering nine of 10 first-place votes in the Mankato Free Press WCHA Men's Hockey Preseason Coaches Poll. The Mavericks, who are coming off their best season in a decade, also have the Preseason Player of the Year in junior forward Matt Leitner and the Preseason Rookie of the Year in freshman forward Zach Stepan.

Ferris State was picked to finish second in the league, edging Michigan Tech, which received the other first-place vote. Bowling Green was fourth, followed by Alaska, Northern Michigan, Bemidji State, Lake Superior State, Alaska Anchorage and Alabama Huntsville.

Leitner, a third-team All-WCHA pick last season and the fourth returning point-scorer in the nation (17-30=47), received five votes for Preseason Player of the Year. Michigan Tech sophomore forward Alex Petan (15-19=34) an All-WCHA Rookie Team selection last season, received two votes.

Stepan, a forward who comes to Minnesota State from the USHL's Waterloo Blackhawks, received eight votes for Preseason Rookie of the Year. He was a fourth-round draft pick of the NHL's Nashville Predators in 2012.

Leitner and a pair of Minnesota State teammates, junior defenseman Zach Palmquist and sophomore goaltender Stephon Williams were selected to the Preseason All-WCHA team, along with Petan, Bowling Green junior forward Ryan Carpenter and Ferris State junior defenseman Jason Binkley. Williams was the WCHA's Rookie of the Year last season, as well as a first-team and All-WCHA Rookie Team pick. Carpenter was a second-team All-CCHA selection last season.

Minnesota State Nearly Unanimous in The Bemidji Pioneer WCHA Preseason Media Poll, But League has Parity

Leitner, Stepan Named Player, Rookie of the Year

September 24, 2013 – With six new teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association this season, many predicted more parity in the new-look league.

According to members of the WCHA media, that prediction should hold true – although most think Minnesota State will finish on top a year after a fantastic season and an NCAA tournament appearance.

The Bemidji Pioneer WCHA Preseason Media Poll shows the Mavericks as a near-unanimous choice to win the league, garnering 22-first place votes. A panel of 25 members of the WCHA media voted on a predicted order of finish, as well as individual awards.

Despite nearly everyone in the media selecting MSU to take first in the league, the disparity between the Mavericks (who earned 244 total points) and the second place team was just 26 points.

Ferris State earned two first place votes and 218 points for a solid second place finish. Alaska was picked to finish third with 168 points.

The teams in the middle of the pack were separated by 12 points. Bowling Green (149 points) was picked to finish fourth, followed by Michigan Tech (144) and Northern Michigan (137). Lake Superior State (117) was chosen to finish seventh, Bemidji State eighth (108) and Alaska Anchorage ninth (54). Alabama Huntsville, who was an independent last season, was picked to finish 10th out of 10 teams with 36 points.

The media also selected the league's Preseason Player and Rookie of the Year as well as an All-WCHA team. Minnesota State swept the Player and Rookie of the Year awards. MSU forward



Matt Leitner was the league media's near-unanimous pick for preseason Player of the Year while Mavericks' forward Zach Stepan was the media's pick for preseason Rookie of the Year.

Leitner was also named to the All-WCHA team as a forward along with Bowling Green's Ryan Carpenter and Michigan Tech's Alex Petan. Defensemen named to the All-WCHA team were Minnesota State's Zach Palmquist and Ferris State's Jason Binkley. MSU's Stephon Williams was the All-WCHA goaltender.

The first round of Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoffs will be contested the weekend of March 14-16, a best-of-three series format that will feature the top eight finishers in regular season competition. The No. 1 seed will host the No. 8 seed, No. 2 will host No. 7, No. 3 will host No. 6 and No. 4 will host No. 5.

Following the first round, the four winners will advance to the 2014 WCHA Final Five, to be contested Friday and Saturday, March 21 and 22, at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids, MI. - Chad Brears scored two of the three Alabama Huntsville goals at Northeastern that weekend, after scoring just one goal all of last season.
- Regan Soquila and Brandon Clowes recorded their first collegiate points on October 12 (at Northeastern), both recording a pair of assists.
- Matt Larose and Carmine Guerriero both made their collegiate debuts over the October 11-12 weekend at the goaltending position. Larose allowed nine goals at Northeastern on that Friday while Guerriero gave up three goals to go along with 42 saves.
- UAH ended the first weekend of play averaging 28 shots per game. Last season, the Chargers averaged only 17 shots per game.
- The 11 freshman that made their collegiate debut at Northeastern over the October 11-12 weekend was tops for the most in the conference.
- Alabama Huntsville was shutout in the first period in both games at Northeastern, but did score a pair of third-period goals.

- Alaska Anchorage will have a bye weekend before starting conference play on Nov. 1-2 at Bowling Green. Bowling Green leads the all-time series record with the Seawolves, 2-0-0. The last and only series between the teams was on Oct. 14-15, 1988. BGSU won 7-3 and 10-2 in UAA's season-opening series.
- The Seawolves were handed their first loss of the season when Western Michigan claimed a 6-2 win last Friday (Oct. 18) in front of 3,101 fans at Carlson Center in Fairbanks. UAA and WMU are now tied in the all-time series record, 2-2.
- The Seawolves scored on the man-advantage for the third straight game, going 1-for-7. UAA allowed its first power-play goal of the season on Oct. 18, as WMU went 2-for-9. UAA also allowed the first shorthanded strike of the short season. The Seawolves out shot WMU, 26-25 – the first time they have out shot an opponent this season.

It marked the fourth time in the six-year history the Nanooks won the tournament.
- Senior center Cody Kunyk was named the Most Valuable Player of the Brice after scoring two goals and adding an assist.
- Joining Cody Kunyk on the All-Tournament Team were rookie goaltender Davis Jones and junior left wing Garrick Perry.
- Davis Jones notched his first win in his first collegiate game last Friday (Oct. 18) night after making 24 saves (.923) in 64:33. He added a tie to his belt Saturday (Oct. 19) with 30 stops (.915) and finished the weekend with 54 saves, a 2.32 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage.
- Garrick Perry imitated the great Bobby Orr in overtime against Denver. He lunged forward and his entire body went parallel to the ice when he wristed the puck past the Pioneers' Sam Brittain for the game-winning goal with :25.2 seconds to go in the extra period.
- Alaska became the first team this season to score on Denver goalie Sam Brittain, ending his streak of not allowing a goal at 159:47 to start the season. Dating to last season, his streak ended at 193:49.
- Western Michigan scored the go-ahead goal with only 1:51 remaining to take a 3-2 lead but Alaska answered with the game-tying score with only 1:09 to play to force overtime to keep its championship hopes alive. After a scoreless 5:00 overtime, sophomore defenseman Colton Parayko lit the lamp in the third and final round, going top shelf on WMU's Frank Slubowski and Davis Jones made three consecutive saves to allow the Nanooks to claim the Brice title with a 1-0 shootout victory.
- The Nanooks improved their all-time Brice Alaska Goal Rush record to 9-1-2 but last Saturday's tie ended a seven-game win streak at the event. However, they have either won or tied in 11 straight games.
- Cody Kunyk's three points this past weekend upped the program's active-leading scorer's total to 90 career points.
- Alaska closes non-conference play this weekend, Oct. 25-26, on campus at the Patty Ice Arena against Mercyhurst.



Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State men's hockey team dropped a pair of non-conference games to No. 3/5 Minnesota Oct. 18-19, 3-6 and 1-5. Bemidji State is now 1-16-1 vs Minnesota all-time.
- At 0-3-1 this season the Beavers seek their first victory of 2013-14 this coming weekend as they travel to the University of Alabama in Huntsville to open the WCHA season. In a series that dates back to the small college days and got its start in 1994, BSU holds a 38-28-4 edge, which included gaining wins in 14 of the last 16 meetings (14-1-1). The Beavers are 13-19-3 all-time in games played in Huntsville. BSU last loss to the Chargers came Jan. 8, 2011 by the score of 4-3. That also stands as the last game between the teams played at Von Braun Arena.
- After a three-point (1g, 2a) weekend vs Minnesota, Danny Mattson shares the Beavers' scoring lead with Matt Prapavessis (3a) with three points. Mattson contributed a power-play goal last Friday, marking a continuation of his significant role on the man-advantage. Last season, he netted 10 (2g, 8a) of his 19 points on the power-play to lead all BSU players. He assembled his first multi-point game of 2013-14 and the sixth of his career last Friday posting a goal and an assist.
- Coach Tom Serratore opened the 2013-14 campaign with a roster featuring 10 players that didn't have a single game of collegiate experience. Five of those players were in the lineup last weekend and two etched their names in the scoring column for the first time last Friday. Brendan Harms and Ruslan Pedan each posted an assist in the loss.
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of the Beavers' scoring this season. The five second-year players have four goals and four assists for eight of the team's 21 points.
- On a team that returns only 35 goals from last season, sophomore F Cory Ward opened 2013-14 as the team's top returning goal scorer and has come through in the first four games. He leads BSU with two goals. Dating back to the end of the 2012-13 season, Ward has eight points (6g, 2a) in his last 10 games.
- BSU has been outscored 7-1 in the third period this season.
- BSU was out shot 37-21 on Oct. 18 and 31-25 on Oct. 19. BSU is averaging just 20.75 shots per game while its opponents have posted an average of 35.75 (143-83).
- The penalty-kill unit held Minnesota to 1-for-8 on the man-advantage Oct. 18-19. BSU has now snuffed out 17-of-20 (.850) opponent power-plays this season.
- BSU's power-play has converted 2-of-15 opportunities (13.3%).
- Following two losses to No. 5 UM, BSU is 0-3-1 vs teams ranked in the top 15 this season. BSU was 1-11-3 vs the nations' top 15 teams a year ago.

Falcons Bowling Green State University

- Bowling Green State University finished the week 2-0-1, playing Ohio State University and Colgate University over the week in their first home stand of the year. The Falcons are now 2-1-2 on the young 2013-14 season.
- Bowling Green outshot the Raiders by 49 shots on goal over the weekend (89-40). The Falcons had 50 shots on goal last Saturday (Oct. 19), marking it the first time since Oct. 11, 2008 when Bowling Green tied Niagara 3-3 in overtime.
- Bowling Green's 7-0 victory last Saturday night (Oct. 19) was the first time the Falcons won by at least seven goals in the regular season since Dec. 30, 2005 when the Orange and Brown defeated Connecticut 9-2. It also marked the first time the Falcons scored at least seven goals in a shutout victory in a regular season game since Oct. 11, 1996 when they defeated Toronto 9-0.
- Senior forward Bryce Williamson is tied for first overall in the WCHA for scoring. Over his first five games he has seven points (4g, 3a) and is averaging 1.40 point per game. Williamson has scored a goal in three consecutive games for the Falcons, helping him have at least one point in four of the first five games. Williamson had three points in the 7-0 win over Colgate on Oct. 19, giving him a new career high for points in a game.
- Junior forward Dan DeSalvo leads the WCHA in assists with five, averaging one assist per game. DeSalvo had four helpers in the 7-0 victory over Colgate last Saturday, giving him a new career high for assists in a game and breaking his previous-best of two in a game.
- Freshman goaltender Tomas Sholl made his second start in nets last Saturday night against Colgate. Sholl turned away all 20 shots he faced, earning his first collegiate victory with a shutout.
- Defenseman Rusty Hafner and forward Mark Cooper each have had one assist in the past two games, giving them the only Falcons to have at least one assist in the past two games.
- The junior class is responsible for 50% of the team's assists (14-of-28) to date and 35% of the team's total points (16-of-45), while the sophomores are responsible for 47% of the team's goals (8-of-17).
- Seven Falcons have had multi-point games already this season. Bryce Williamson leads the group as the only Falcon to have two multi-point games in the season with six others joining him.
- Sophomore forward Ben Murphy scored two goals on Saturday night, giving him four goals total goals on the week. Murphy had five total points in the week (4-1=5). It was the most points Murphy has in a three game stretch in his career.
- Sophomore Brent Tate had two goals against Colgate on Oct. 19, his first two goals of the season, and set a new career high for goals in a game.
- Bowling Green will not play until Oct. 29 when they travel to Columbus to take on Ohio State. The Falcons will be looking for back-to-back wins vs the Buckeyes for the first time since 2005-06.



Bulldogs Ferris State University

- The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team fought back from a two-goal deficit to earn an impressive 5-3 victory over previously unbeaten St. Lawrence in non-league action last Saturday (Oct. 19) during the school's first-ever "Pink In The Rink" contest at the Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs donned pink jerseys for the special contest, which benefited breast cancer research locally thru the Susan P. Wheatlake fund. A crowd of nearly 1,900 fans were on hand as the Bulldogs split the weekend series against the Saints to improve to 3-2 overall on the season.
- Ferris State scored five consecutive goals in last Saturday's win over the Saints after St. Lawrence had taken a 2-0 edge.
- A Bulldog freshman notched his first goal of his collegiate career as Big Rapids (MI) native Seth Adams put one past the St. Lawrence defense with assists going to fellow freshman Kyle Schempp and sophomore Brandon Anselmini. The goal proved to be the eventual game-winner.
- Ferris State junior goaltender CJ Motte tallied a game-best 31 saves on Oct. 19 in improving to 3-0 overall in net this season with the victory. He made 11 saves in the first period, followed by 12 in the second and eight in the third.
- Ferris State will take this weekend off before the Bulldogs open WCHA action for the first-time ever on Nov. 1-2 at Alabama Huntsville. FSU then returns home for three consecutive league weekend stands in the month of November starting with a series against Bemidji State on Nov. 8-9 at the Ewingleben Ice Arena.
- Prior to the weekend series vs St. Lawrence, Ferris State returned to action on Tuesday (Oct. 15) by registering a 3-2 non-league triumph at Mercyhurst. The Bulldogs remained unbeaten all-time vs the Lakers by striking for three-straight goals, including a pair of goals :30 seconds apart in the second period. Mercyhurst struck first early in the opening period, but the Bulldogs responded approximately 10 minutes later when the fourth line combination of sophomore Kenny Babinski along with freshmen Chad McDonald and Seth Adams combined to tie the contest up at a goal apiece. Babinski notched his first goal of the year with a rebound try while both Adams and McDonald picked up their first collegiate points on the assist.
- Ferris State has officially sold out its expanded "Dawg Pound" student section for the second consecutive year with more than 600 student season tickets sold this campaign. FSU increased the size and capacity of the student section a year ago due to high demand. The "Dawg Pound" has been labeled as one of college hockey's top student sections.
- Head Coach Bob Daniels, who was the National Coach of the Year for the second time in 2011-12, is in the midst his 22nd year behind the FSU bench in 2013-14 with a school-record 353 career victories.

- NMU takes its first of two trips to Alaska on the first weekend of November for a meeting with the Nanooks. A trip to Western Michigan (Nov. 9-10) and back-to-back home series with Alabama Huntsville (Nov. 22-23) and Ferris State (Nov. 29-30) wrap up November.
