## North Dakota, Denver, Minnesota Duluth Win at Home in First Round WCHA Playoff Action Friday; Wisconsin, Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State Claim Series Opening Victories on Road Six First Round Series Continue Saturday; Tickets Still Available for 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul

MADISON, Wis. – It was an even split between home and road victors on Friday (March 11) night as the six Western Collegiate Hockey Association first round, best-of-three playoff series opened. No. 1 playoff seed North Dakota, No. 2 seed Denver and No. 4 seed Minnesota Duluth successfully defended their home ice while No. 7 seed Wisconsin, No. 8 seed Alaska Anchorage and No. 10 seed Bemidji State came up with big victories on the road.

The host Sioux defeated No. 12 seed Michigan Tech, 8-0, the Pioneers skated past No. 11 seed Minnesota State, 4-2 and the Bulldogs won 4-2 over No. 9 seed St. Cloud State. Wisconsin prevailed 3-1 at No. 6 seed Colorado College, visiting Alaska Anchorage upended No. 5 seed Minnesota, 4-3, and Bemidji State took a 4-2 decision from No. 3 seed and host Nebraska Omaha. North Dakota, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Wisconsin, Alaska Anchorage and Bemidji State are now one victory away from clinching a berth in next week's 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, set for March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn.

**#12 Michigan Tech 0 @ #1 North Dakota 8:** Wingers Matt Frattin and Jason Gregoire (3g, 1a) both netted three-goal hat tricks and defenseman Chay Genoway had four assists as the host Sioux toppled the Huskies, 8-0, before 11,606 at Ralph Engelstad Arena to take a 1-0 advantage in their best-of-three playoff series. UND scored three times in the first 5:12 of the game, with Gregoire's tally at 3:12 standing as the game-winner. Frattin and Gregoire both completed their hat tricks in the second period.

**#11 Minnesota State 2 @ #2 Denver 4:** The host Pioneers, behind two late goals from right winger Shawn Ostrow, overcame a 2-0 third period deficit to claim a 4-2 victory over the Mavericks before 3,647 at Magness Arena. First period goals from winger Zach Lehrke and defenseman Kurt Davis on the power-play game MSU a 2-0 lead which held up until DU right winger Beau Bennett scored a game-tying goal at 8:00 of the third. Ostrow then put the Pioneers up 3-2 at 17:35 before also scoring an empty-net goal at 19:05. DU leads the best-of-three series, 1-0-0.

**#10 Bemidji State 4 @ #3 Nebraska Omaha 2:** Goaltender Dan Bakala made 46 saves and left winger Jamie MacQueen scored the game-winner at 18:07 of the third period as the visiting Beavers captured a 4-2 victory over the Mavericks before 7,219 at Qwest Center Omaha. In moving to 4-0-1 vs UNO this season, BSU was outshot 48-17 in the contest but jumped out to a 2-0 first period lead on goals from forwards Jordan George and Ian Lowe. For UNO, right winger Terry Broadhurst knotted the score at 2-2 with a goal at 6:44 of the second before the Beavers' MacQueen and Matt Read (at 18:28) scored late in the third to seal the win.

**#9 St. Cloud State 2 @ #4 Minnesota Duluth 4:** Left winger Mike Connolly scored the winner at 15:01 of the second period and left winger Kyle Schmidt added a goal and an assist as the host Bulldogs won 4-2 over the Huskies in game one of their playoff series before 5,070 at AMSOIL Arena. SCSU winger Jared Festler scored an extra-attacker goal at 15:53 of the third period to pull the Huskies within one before Schmidt scored into an empty-net to give UMD the victory.

**#8 Alaska Anchorage 4 @ #5 Minnesota 3:** The visiting Seawolves jumped out to a 3-0 lead over the Golden Gophers in the second period on a shorthanded goal from center Alex Gellert at 9:19 and then prevailed 4-3 when right winger Mitch Bruijsten scored on the power-play at 13:28 of the third to take a 1-0 lead in their best-of-three playoff series. A Mariucci Arena crowd of 9,320 saw UM rally for three straight goals, including a penalty-shot tally from Jake Hansen at 12:12 of period two that made it 3-2 and a goal from defenseman Kevin Wehrs at 11:18 of the third that tied it at 3-3. CC took a 1-0 lead on a power-play goal from center Nick Dineen at 5:53 of the second before UW defenseman Joe Faust scored his first goal of the season to knot the score at 1-1.

SAINT PAUL, Minn. – A limited number of all-session ticket packages as well as single game tickets are still available and on sale now for the 2011 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, to be held Thursday – Saturday, March 17-19 at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul.

There will be a new twist on the popular tournament with the addition of Bemidji State and Nebraska-Omaha bringing WCHA membership to 12 teams. For the first time, six teams will advance, battling it out over five games for the Broadmoor Trophy and entrance to the NCAA Tournament.

The WCHA will finalize the Final Five schedule once the first round of playoffs are over. Teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their regular season finish. The No. 1 and No. 2 seeds will receive a bye.

The brackets at the Final Five are pre-set. The #1 seed is set for Friday evening. The normal bracket for Thursday is the #4 seed vs #5 seed game in the evening game and the #3 seed vs #6 seed game is the afternoon game.

The only changes will be if Minnesota enters the Final Five as a #2, #3 or #6 seed.

In that case, the Thursday game matching the #3 seed vs the #6 seed is moved to the evening. There is no re-seeding. The #3 vs #6 Thursday evening game winner would then play the #2 seed in the evening game on Friday. (It was determined by the league that it was not fair for the Thursday evening winner to come back and play Friday afternoon.) The Friday afternoon semifinal would then have the #4/5 winner vs #1."
