### FROZEN FOUR HIGHLIGHTS

#### 2001 - MINNEAPOLIS, MN

A NCAA Women's Frozen Four is held for the first time as Minnesota Duluth defeats St. Lawrence, 4-2, in Minneapolis to take home the first crown. Harvard was third, Dartmouth fourth.

#### 2002 - DURHAM, NH

Minnesota Duluth wins its second straight NCAA Women's Frozen Four with a 3-2 victory over Brown in the title game in Durham, NH. Niagara and Minnesota shared third place.

#### 2003 - DULUTH, MN

Minnesota Duluth wins the NCAA Women's Frozen Four, its third consecutive, by a 4-3 (ot) count over Harvard in front of a record crowd of 5,167, in its home arena - the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center. Dartmouth was third, Minnesota fourth.

#### 2004 - PROVIDENCE, RI

Minnesota outscores its two opponents, 11-3, to dominate the NCAA Women's Frozen Four in Providence, RI. The Golden Gophers beat Harvard, 6-2, in the championship game. St. Lawrence was third, Dartmouth was fourth.

#### 2005 - DURHAM, NH

The national tournament field expands to eight teams with Mercyhurst, Providence and Wisconsin all making their first appearances. Minnesota wins its second straight national title after a 4-3 win over Harvard in Durham, NH. St. Lawrence finished third, Dartmouth fourth. The third place game was discontinued after the 2005 tournament. Since then, both teams defeated in the semi-finals are awarded third place.

#### 2006 - MINNEAPOLIS, MN

Wisconsin claims its first NCAA Women's Frozen Four title in Minneapolis after defeating Minnesota, 3-0, the two-time defending national champion. The Badgers become the first team in tournament history other than the Golden Gophers or Minnesota Duluth to win the championship. The other semi-finalists were New Hampshire and St. Lawrence.

#### 2007 - LAKE PLACID, NY

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four was held in historic Lake Placid, N.Y., where the 1980 Winter Olympic games took place. Wisconsin successfully defended its title after defeating Minnesota Duluth, 4-1, in the championship game. Boston College and St. Lawrence were the other semi-finalists.

#### 2008 - DULUTH, MN

Minnesota Duluth capture its fourth national championship at the DECC in Duluth with a 4-0 shutout of Wisconsin in the final to avenge a loss to the Badgers in the 2007 championship game. The other semi-finalists were Harvard and New Hampshire.

#### 2009 - BOSTON, MA

Wisconsin captures its third NCAA Women's Frozen Four title in the past four seasons. The Badgers defeat Mercyhurst, 5-0, in the title game at Agganis Arena in Boston, Mass. Wisconsin won 5-1 over Minnesota Duluth in one semi-final while Minnesota fell 5-4 to Mercyhurst in the other.

#### 2010 - MINNEAPOLIS, MN

Minnesota Duluth completes a hat trick of titles (WCHA, WCHA Playoff, NCAA) by winning the Frozen Four at Ridder Arena in stunning fashion over Cornell, 3-2, when Jessica Wong scores at 19:26 of the third 20-minute overtime. The WCHA's streak of consecutive national championships won reaches 11. Host Minnesota falls 3-2 to UMD in one of the two semi-finals while Cornell upends Mercyhurst 3-2 (ot).

February 26, 2009/MADISON, Wis. – The University of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota Duluth and the University of Wisconsin, the teams which have won national championships and turned the Western Collegiate Hockey Association into the best league in women's hockey over the last decade, each placed three players on the WCHA's Top 10 Players of the First 10 years, as announced Feb. 26, 2009. The WCHA is marking its 10th season of women's hockey in 2008-09, with the first season of league play coming in 1999-2000.

The top players of the decade includes two Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winners (Jessie Vetter went on to win the Kazmaier in 2009), WCHA Players of the Year, All-Americans and Olympic Gold medalists. It includes one active player. In addition to players from Minnesota, Wisconsin and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth, the team also includes one player from Ohio State.

"In this our anniversary season of celebrating 10 years of women's WCHA hockey, we recognize 10 of the names that have helped make this Association such a success," said Sara R. Martin, WCHA Associate Commissioner. "In a decade that has seen such tremendous development and growth of our sport, we today salute our 10 best players.

"These outstanding young women have made a significant impact on the history of this league and also left a lasting impression on the game of ice

hockey itself," added Martin.

"We are most grateful that we had the opportunity to watch them play in the WCHA and cherish the idea that we will always have them as special members of our extended family."

The top ten players from the first ten years are: Sara Bauer, F, University of Wisconsin; Tessa Bonhomme, D, Ohio State University; Ronda Curtin, D, University of Minnesota; Natalie Darwitz, F, University of Minnesota; Molly Engstrom, D, University of Wisconsin; Caroline Ouellette, F, University of Minnesota Duluth; Jenny Schmidgall Potter, F, University of Minnesota Duluth, University of Minnesota; Maria Rooth, F, University of Minnesota Duluth; Jessie Vetter, G, University of Wisconsin; and Krissy Wendell, F, University of Minnesota.
