## Three WCHA Series Featuring UM at BSU, UND at UMD, OSU at MSU Headline Play for Final Weekend of October Non-Conference Matchups for Oct. 28-29 Have Boston University at UW in NCAA Frozen Four Title Game Rematch, Robert Morris at SCSU; Defending League Champ Wisconsin, Minnesota Lead Early WCHA Race After Sweeps; High-Scoring North Dakota Sets Records in Sweep vs OSU; Latest Div. 1 Women's Polls Have UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UND No. 6, UMD No. 7 ... BSU and OSU Receive Votes; Nine WCHA Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup in Sweden Nov. 9-13

MADISON, Wis. – Defending conference and national champion Wisconsin and Minnesota, ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the country respectively, jumped into a first place tie in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's race after impressive series sweeps last weekend (Oct. 20-22).

Both teams will be tested this weekend, Oct. 28-29, as Minnesota travels to high-scoring Bemidji State in one of three league series and Wisconsin completes a four-week stretch of playing nationally-ranked opponents when the top-ranked Badgers host No. 5-ranked Boston University at the Kohl Center in a rematch of last season's national championship game.

The Golden Gophers (7-1-0, 5-1-0 WCHA) and host Beavers (5-1-2, 2-1-1-0 WCHA) will face-off at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday evenings.

The two other WCHA series on the docket this weekend have No. 6-ranked North Dakota (5-3-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) at No. 7 Minnesota Duluth (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) and Ohio State (3-2-1, 3-2-1-1 WCHA) at Minnesota State (4-4-0, 0-2-0 WCHA). The Sioux and host Bulldogs will skate at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) at 3:07 pm CT on Saturday and Sunday. The Buckeyes and host Mavericks engage in puck-drops at All Seasons Arena

Wisconsin (7-1-0) and Boston University (5-1-1), meanwhile, will hook up in a pair of afternoon matinees at the Kohl Center (15,325) at 2:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday.

Last weekend, Wisconsin beat Minnesota Duluth twice at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. Hilary Knight's shorthanded goal at 18:46 of the third period gave UW a 4-3 victory in the series opener on Oct. 21 and then goaltender Alex Rigsby made a career-high 46 stops in a 6-3 win against the Bulldogs on Oct. 22. Rigsby is currently second in the nation for most saves with 198.

Minnesota also received superb goaltending in beating visiting Minnesota State last Thursday (Oct. 20) and Friday (Oct. 21) at Ridder Arena, 3-0 and 7-0. Minnesota has featured the country's stingiest defense, yielding just six goals through eight games for an average of .75 goals per game. On home ice, their performance has been downright miserly, allowing a single power-play goal to Union and nothing else in six games. Going into last week's series Minnesota State hadn't been held to less than three goals in any game before playing at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, and they were unable to score in 120 minutes. In nets for the Gophers, Noora Rätty recorded her third shutout of the season in the series opener and 19th of her collegiate career in the series finale. She needs two more to tie the school record of 21 shutouts set by Erica Killewald.

North Dakota had a record-setting weekend in opening its 2011-12 WCHA season with an impressive 11-1 and 7-1 series sweep against Ohio State before crowds of 3,010 and 3,058 at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks. In the series opener last Friday, 13 different skaters collected at least one point. Rookie sophomore forward Michelle Karvinen collected her first collegiate three-goal hat trick and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls collected four assists to tie the school record. In the win, the Sioux broke the school record for most goals scored in a game (11) and largest margin of victory (10) and with its 7-1 win on Saturday broke the record for largest margin of victory in a series (16) and most goals in a series (18). Lamoureux-Kolls recorded back-to-back five-point games, each tied the school record and she also had a hat trick last Saturday. Heading into Saturday and Sunday's series at No. 7 Minnesota Duluth, Jocelyne Lamoureux leads the country with 21 points and is tied with her twin sister Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (19 points) for the team-lead in goals with eight. Lamoureux and Lamoureux-Kolls are No. 1 and 2 in the nation in points, respectively, and the line of Lamoureux, Lamoureux-Kolls and Karvinen have combined for 23 goals, 32 assists and 55 points on the season.

In other league play last weekend, host Bemidji State beat St. Cloud State twice, taking an 8-1 and 5-2 sweep. The Beavers have scored 20 goals in the last three games and they have only had one game this season in which they scored under three goals. Montana Vichorek scored two goals and had four assists for six points last Friday to

## Nine WCHA Players to Compete in Four Nations Cup Tournament Nov. 9-13 in Sweden

Nine Western Collegiate Hockey Association member-team players, including six from Team USA, will take a break from their collegiate careers next month to compete in the Four Nations tournament.

Ohio State senior forward Natalie Spooner, Wisconsin defenseman Stefanie McKeough and Minnesota Duluth forward Haley Irwin are three of 23 players selected to represent Team Canada at the 2011 Four Nations Cup, taking place Nov. 9-14 in Nyköping, Sweden.

The Four Nations Cup brings together the top four women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the international tournament. Former Wisconsin defenseman Bobbi Jo Slusar also is on Team Canada.

USA Hockey announced their first 20 players on Oct. 14, including Wisconsin's Hillary Knight and Brianna Decker, Minnesota's Amanda Kessel and Jen Schoullis, and North Dakota's Monique Lamoureux-Kolls

and Jocelyne Lamoureux for its roster for the U.S. Women's National Team. The U.S. will add two goaltenders to its final roster following its training camp in Hamden, Conn., Nov. 1-6. Former Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner Jessie Vetter, the ex-Wisconsin netminder, is one of three goalies who will compete for the job.

The USA roster includes 15 players who won the gold medal for Team USA at the IIHF Women's World Championship this past April. That group includes former Wisconsin players Meghan Duggan, Molly Engstrom and Vetter, former Minnesota Duluth forward Jenny Potter, and ex-Minnesota player Gigi Marvin plus Knight, Decker and the Lamoureux twins.

Rosters for the Swedish and Finnish teams have yet to be announced.

## Mark Johnson Among Four Lester Patrick Trophy Winners Recognized by NHL

Award Ceremony Set for Wednesday, Oct. 26 in Saint Paul

NEW YORK, N.Y. – Distinguished player and coach Mark Johnson, Hockey Hall of Famer Bob Pulford, long-time USA Hockey executive Tony Rossi and college coaching legend Jeff Sauer have been named recipients of the 2011 Lester Patrick Trophy for outstanding service to hockey in the United States.

The recipients will be honored at an evening reception on Wednesday, Oct. 26 at the RiverCentre in St. Paul, Minn.

Johnson, a Minneapolis, Minn. native, is not only an accomplished athlete, but has distinguished himself as an outstanding coach as well. He played 11 years in the NHL (1979-90), where he amassed 508 points in 669 games with the Pittsburgh Penguins, Minnesota North Stars, Hartford Whalers, St. Louis Blues and New Jersey Devils.

Johnson may be best known as the leading scorer for Team USA at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, where he scored twice in Team USA's iconic victory against the Soviet Union en route to the gold medal. All total, Johnson represented the United States as a player in 13 international tournaments. He also enjoyed a three-year collegiate playing career at the University of Wisconsin where he was a two-

time All-American and was named the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Freshman of the Year in 1977.

Johnson is currently the head coach of the women's hockey team at his alma mater, having led Wisconsin to four NCAA championships (2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011). He also served as the head coach of the 2010 silver-medal winning U.S. Olympic women's ice hockey team and twice as an assistant coach for the U.S. men's national team at the International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship (2000, 2002). Johnson, the son of legendary college and NHL coach "Badger" Bob Johnson, was inducted into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2004.

Pulford was one of the most reliable players in the NHL during a 16-year career that spanned three decades. The Ontario native played 1,079 regular-season NHL games, winning four Stanley Cups with the Toronto Maple Leafs (1962-64, 1967) before being traded to the Los Angeles Kings in 1970. He took his first coaching role with the Kings, guiding them to their first playoff appearance in five years in 1974, and won the Jack Adams Award as coach of the year in 1975. That season, the Kings amassed 105 points, still a club record.

Pulford then joined the Chicago Blackhawks, where he spent more than 30 years in various roles. He served as the club's coach on three separate occasions from 1977 to 1987. He was promoted to senior vice president in 1990 and took on the general manager's duties three separate times. Pulford was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1991.

Outside of a highly successful business career, Rossi has generously donated significant time, resources and expertise to USA Hockey for parts of five decades at the grassroots and executive leadership levels. After beginning his volunteer career with the National Governing Body in the mid-1970s, Rossi was elected to the USA Hockey Board of Directors in 1983 and served as a director from the Central District until 1988. After that, he was elected to the USA Hockey Executive Committee and transitioned into the role of USA Hockey treasurer in 1995. He currently serves as vice president of the organization and its international council chair.

During his time with USA Hockey, Rossi helped guide the formation and growth of The USA Hockey Foundation, a charitable and educational non-profit corporation that provides long-range financial support for USA Hockey and promotes the growth of the game in the United States. He was elected to the International Ice Hockey Federation council in 2008.

Sauer, a Fort Atkinson, Wis., native, is one of the most successful and distinguished coaches in the history of college hockey. Following his playing career at Colorado College, where he played for Bob Johnson, Sauer spent more than 30 seasons as an NCAA Division 1 head coach – both at Colorado College from 1971-80 and then at the University of Wisconsin from 1983-2002. Sauer won national championships as coach of the Badgers in both 1983 and 1990 and ranks eighth on the all-time wins list of college hockey coaches with more than 650 victories (655-532-57) and a winning percentage of .549.

Sauer also is closely involved with preparing and coaching the USA Deaf Olympic Team, having participated in seven Deaflympics and earning a gold medal in 2007 at the IIHF Winter Deaf Olympics. In April 2009, he also coached Team USA to a bronze medal in the first ever World Deaf Hockey Championships. Sauer earned the John "Snooks" Kelley Founders Award from the American Hockey Coaches Association in 2003, presented to individuals in the coaching profession who have contributed to the overall growth and development of the sport of ice hockey in the United States. He is a member of USA Hockey's International Council and the Disabled Hockey Committee and also currently works for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association as assistant to the commissioner. Sauer was recently named head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

The Lester Patrick award, one of the most prestigious in hockey, was presented to the National Hockey League by the New York Rangers in 1966. It honors the memory of Lester Patrick, who spent 50 years in hockey as a player, coach and general manager and was a pioneer in the sport's development.

## Beavers

### Bemidji State University

The Beavers (5-1-2, 2-1-1-0 WCHA) picked up six points in the WCHA last weekend with two victories over St. Cloud State University at Sanford Center ... The Beavers scored an 8-1 victory over the Huskies last Friday which was the most goals BSU has scored since Oct. 26, 2001 in a game that was also against SCSU ... The Beavers have been potent offensively, scoring 20 goals in the last three games ... They have only had one game this season in which they scored under three goals ... The 15 goals in back-to-back games against Maine and St. Cloud State is the best two-game total since Jan. 7 and Jan. 8 of 2000 when BSU tallied 16 goals in back-to-back games against Concordia ... Montana Vichorek scored two goals and tallied four assists last Friday night to tie the school record for most points in a game with six ... Vichorek also tied BSU's school record for assists and set the school record for assists by a defenseman ... Center Sadie Lundquist had a strong weekend against SCSU as well with two goals and six assists for eight points ... The points in each game for Lundquist set career highs for her ... At 5-1-2 overall, the Beavers are off to their best start since the 2002-03 season ... Bemidji State hosts No. 2-ranked Minnesota this Friday and Saturday night for two league games as they look to continue their hot start.

## Golden Gophers

### University of Minnesota

The Minnesota Golden Gophers (7-1-0, 3-1-0-0 WCHA) are ranked No. 2 in the national polls this week as they travel to Bemidji State to play the Beavers in a pair of WCHA matchups this Friday and Saturday night ... The 7-1 Gophers have outscored their opponents 39-6 in eight games so far this season ... Sophomore forward Amanda Kessel leads the UM team in points this season with 17 ... Freshman forward Stephanie Anderson scored her first collegiate goal against Minnesota State last Thursday in a 3-0 WCHA victory at Ridder Arena ... Freshman Rachel Ramsey is leading the team in plus/minus rating with a +14 ... Goaltender Noora Rätty earned her 19th collegiate shutout last Friday in the team's 7-0 triumph over Minnesota State, and now needs just two more to tie Minnesota's career shutout record ... Minnesota is 34-of-35 on the penalty-kill for a 97.1% success rate this season, and has killed every penalty in the last seven games against Minnesota Duluth.

## Bulldogs

### University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 7-ranked Bulldogs (3-3-0, 0-2-0-0 WCHA) were swept by No. 1 Wisconsin last weekend in AMSOIL Arena, the first time the Bulldogs have been swept in Duluth since Oct. 10-11, 2008 by Minnesota ... UMD suffered a 4-3, late game setback last Friday night when UW scored a shorthanded goal with just 1:14 remaining in the contest ... Despite two goals from rookie forward Jenna McParland, two assists from senior forward Haley Irwin and 39 saves from goaltender Jennifer Harss, UMD could not beat the national champions ... Wisconsin outshot the Bulldogs 43-37 in the game, but UMD outshot the Badgers badly in the final period of play, 15-6 ... Both Irwin and junior defenseman Jessica Wong had two assists in the skate ... It was the first time UMD has outshot an opponent by 17 or more shots and suffered defeat since the Bulldogs were bumped by North Dakota last season on Dec. 11, 2010, UMD's last game at the DECC ... The Bulldogs outshot the Sioux 44-27 but lost 4-3 ... The Bulldogs are now 26-24-10 all-time against Wisconsin and have lost their last three games against UW ... ### WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
