Three WCHA Series Headline On-Ice Play for Dec. 2-3 as North Dakota Hosts Minnesota, Wisconsin Visits Minnesota State, Minnesota Duluth Welcomes St. Cloud State

Ohio State Entertains Niagara in Non-Conference Match-Up; Defending WCHA Champion Badgers Back in First Place; WCHA-Member Teams Combined 29-7-3 (.782) Record vs Other Div. 1 Teams; Five WCHA Clubs Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest Div. 1 Women's Weekly Polls ... Wisconsin Unanimous at No. 1, UM at No. 2, UND Up to No. 5, BSU at No. 8/9, UMD at No. 8/9 ... OSU Also Receives Votes

MADISON, Wis. – Three two-game conference series featuring four of the nation's top nine ranked teams and headlined by a Minnesota at North Dakota match-up, are on the docket in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the upcoming weekend of December 2-3. The two other league series Friday and Saturday find Wisconsin traveling to Minnesota State and Minnesota Duluth hosting St. Cloud State.

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (14-2-0, 8-2-0 WCHA) head to Grand Forks to take on the No. 5-ranked Fighting Sioux (10-5-1, 7-4-1 WCHA) in a pair of 7:07 pm CT face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634). Minnesota, winners of six straight games, is currently in second place in the league race, three points out of first and two ahead of North Dakota, but UM does have two games in hand on UND. The two foes will then meet again on Feb. 17-18 in Minneapolis on the final weekend of the 2011-12 regular season.

No. 1-ranked and defending national and WCHA champion Wisconsin (15-1-0, 9-1-0 WCHA) puts a nation's best 10-game winning streak on the line when the Badgers venture to Mankato and All Seasons

And up at AMSOIL Arena (6,726) in Duluth, the No. 8/9-ranked UMD Bulldogs (6-7-1, 3-6-1-1 WCHA) will entertain St. Cloud State (1-13-2, 0-10-0 WCHA) in back-to-back 7:07 pm CT evening engagements. The four-game regular season series between Minnesota Duluth and the Huskies will then conclude on Jan. 27-28 in St. Cloud.

In a lone non-conference series set for Dec. 2-3, Ohio State (8-5-1) will play host to Niagara (7-6-4) from College Hockey America. Face-offs at the OSU Ice Rink (800) in Columbus are at 7:07 pm ET on Friday night and 2:07 pm ET on Saturday afternoon.

Idle from on-ice play this week is No. 8/9-ranked Bemidji State (10-5-2).

A look at the WCHA standings heading into the month of December shows defending league champion Wisconsin (15-1-0, 9-1-0-0 WCHA) back on top. The Badgers celebrated Thanksgiving weekend with a couple of home-ice victories over St. Cloud State and jumped back into first place with 27 points, three more than Minnesota (14-2-0, 8-2-0-0 WCHA, 24 points). North Dakota (10-5-1, 7-4-1-0 WCHA) is in third place with 22 points and Ohio State (8-5-1, 6-5-1-1 WCHA) is in fourth place with 20 points, one ahead of Bemidji State (10-5-2, 6-5-1-0 WCHA, 19 points) in the battle for the final first round home playoff spot. Minnesota Duluth (6-7-1, 3-6-1-1) is in sixth place with 11 points, Minnesota State (5-9-0, 1-7-0-0 WCHA) has three points for the seventh spot while St. Cloud State (1-13-2, 0-10-0-0 WCHA) is eighth and has yet to record a point.

The strength of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is reflected again in this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll which shows five of the circuit's eight-member teams ranked in the top nine in the country, including the top two – Wisconsin as the unanimous No. 1 and Minnesota which is No. 2. North Dakota has moved up to No. 5 nationally this week, Bemidji State has climbed to No. 8 and Minnesota Duluth is at No. 9. Also receiving votes in the poll this week was Ohio State.

In the Nov. 29 USA Hockey/USA Hockey Magazine Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Wisconsin is No. 1, Minnesota is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 5, Minnesota Duluth is No. 8 and Bemidji State is No. 9. Also receiving votes was Ohio State.

In conference action over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend of Nov. 25-27, Wisconsin won twice over St. Cloud State, North Dakota split at Bemidji State and Ohio State split with visiting Minnesota Duluth.

At the Kohl Center in Madison, the Badgers defeated the Huskies 5-0 and 6-1 on Nov. 25 and Nov. 27 and Wisconsin remains one of two

teams in the nation to have only suffered one loss so far this season. Last Friday, sophomore goaltender Alex Rigsby made 19 saves to record her 10th career shutout as a Badger and Brooke Ammerman recorded three assists while Brianna Decker, currently on a school record 27-game point-scoring streak, and Hilary Knight both scored two goals. In the series finale last Sunday UW's Brooke Ammerman had a goal and three more assists. With her two goals on Nov. 25 vs SCSU, Knight surpassed her coach Mark Johnson's school record of 125 career goals. Knight also became the eighth player in NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey history to record both 100-career goals and 100 career assists after recording an assist on Nov. 27. Knight currently sits with 127 goals and 100 assists for 227 career points. She needs 12 more points to top Meghan Duggan as the UW career-points leader.

North Dakota split two road games with Bemidji State. The Sioux won 5-2 last Friday, but the Beavers rallied at home to take a 3-2 decision last Saturday. In the series opener played in Crookston, Minn., BSU's Marlee Wheelhouse and Erika Wheelhouse returned to their home town and each scored a goal but it wasn't enough as the Sioux stormed back with five different goal scorers – Monique Lamoureux-Kolls, Alyssa Wiebe, Sara Dagenais, Candace Molle and Michelle Karvinen – and Jocelyne Lamoureux had a career-high four assists. In the series finale, BSU jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first 10 minutes of the game and Beavers' netminder Zuzanna Tomcikova made 45 saves.

At Columbus, Ohio State and Minnesota Duluth split their conference series. Ohio State received four goals from senior forward Natalie Spooner, including three in a span of eight minutes in the second period, and took a 4-1 decision last Friday night. Then on Saturday it was the Bulldogs that erupted for three goals in the second period, including two from Pernilla Winberg in the first five minutes. UMD Goaltender Jennifer Harsz made 38 saves for the victory.

Outside the WCHA, visiting Minnesota swept two games from then-No. 9 Harvard in Cambridge, Mass., winning 2-1 last Saturday and 7-3 last Sunday. Emily West, who had five points in the series, scored UM's first goal in the 2-1 victory on Nov. 26. In the 7-4 win on Nov. 27, she tallied a goal and three assists for four points, tying her career best for points in a game. One of her assists on Sunday was on Kelly Terry's game-winning goal. West was also a +4 on the weekend, and the only Gopher to score goals in both wins. The Gophers have now outscored their opponents 77-17 in 16 games this season.

Against opponents from other Division 1 conferences so far this season, WCHA teams are 29-7-3 overall for a .782 winning percentage.

Bemidji State University

No. 8-ranked Beavers (10-5-2, 6-5-1-0 WCHA, 19 points) split a WCHA series with No. 6 North Dakota, losing 5-2 in Crookston, Minn., last Friday and winning 3-2 at home on Saturday ... It was their fourth win of the season over a ranked team and improved BSU's record to 7-1-0 in the second game of a series this season, with their only loss coming to Ohio State early in the season ... The Beavers continue to be strong on the power-play against UND as they scored their 22nd and 23rd power-play goals of the season in last Friday's loss ... BSU is ranked No. 3 in the nation in power-play efficiency ... Erika Wheelhouse led the Beavers on the Thanksgiving holiday weekend with a goal and three assists ... Erika and her sister Marlee each tallied a goal and an assist in what was dubbed "The Wheelhouse Homecoming" on Friday in their hometown of Crookston ... The Beavers will have a week off before taking on No. 1-ranked Wisconsin Dec. 9 and 10 at Sanford Center in Bemidji.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (14-2-0, 8-2-0-0 WCHA, 24 points) swept two games from No. 9 Harvard in Cambridge, Mass., winning 2-1 last Saturday and 7-3 last Sunday ... Emily West had five points in the series ... She scored Minnesota's first goal in Saturday's 2-1 victory ... In the 7-4 win on Sunday, she tallied a goal and three assists for four points, tying her career best for points in a game ... One of her assists on Sunday was on Kelly Terry's game-winning goal ... West was a +4 on the weekend and was the only Gopher to score goals in both wins ... Senior defenseman Anne Schleper scored the game-winning goal in last Saturday's 2-1 win over Harvard ... She had four blocked shots and was +3 for the weekend ... She led Minnesota's defense that held Harvard to just one goal on Saturday, the fewest goals allowed by any Harvard opponent in a game this season ... Minnesota is ranked No. 2 in the USCHO.com poll this week ... The Gophers have outscored their opponents 77-17 in 16 games this season ... Amanda Kessel leads in the team in points this season with 37 (17g, 20a) and she ranks third in the WCHA in scoring ... Megan Bozek is tied for first in the nation in scoring by a defenseman (19 points) ... Goaltender Noora Rätty leads the WCHA in goals-against average (1.27) and save percentage (.943) ... The Gophers lead the nation in scoring defense, allowing only 17 goals in 16 games ... Minnesota went 6-0 against non-conference opponents in the regular season and is 5-1 against top-10 teams ... The Gophers travel to No. 5 North Dakota for WCHA games on Friday and Saturday night.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 9-ranked Bulldogs (6-7-1, 3-6-1-1 WCHA, 11 points) split a conference series with Ohio State in Columbus over the Thanksgiving weekend, losing 4-1 last Friday night and picking up a 6-2 triumph on Saturday afternoon ... UMD gave up three goals in less than eight minutes in the second period last Friday to the Buckeyes ... Both teams had 27 shots on goal ... On Saturday it was the Bulldogs that erupted for three goals in the second period, including two from Pernilla Winberg in the first five minutes ... Goaltender Jennifer Harss made 38 saves between the pipes and the Bulldogs were 2-of-7 on the power-play ... OSU outshot UMD 40-35, and five players notched two or more points, including Winberg and Jessica Wong, who each had three points each ... With the series split, UMD is now 45-6-4 all-time against the Buckeyes ... Junior forward Audrey Cournoyer continues to lead UMD in scoring with 19 points (9g, 10a) through 14 games, while junior forward Katie Wilson checks in with 17 points (7g, 10a) in 14 skates ... Wong ranks fifth in the NCAA among all blueliners in scoring with 16 points in 14 games for a 1.14 points per game average ... The Bulldogs are averaging 3.64 goals a game but are allowing a program high of 2.93 goals a game ... UMD is 5-4-1 when the Bulldogs score first, but just 1-3-0 when their opponents have ... Last Saturday's win was the first for UMD this season when they have allowed the first goal ... UMD will host St. Cloud State this weekend on Friday and Saturday at AMSOIL Arena ... The Mavericks (5-7-0, 1-5-0 WCHA, 3 points), idle last weekend, host top-ranked and defending national champion Wisconsin this Friday and Saturday, Dec. 2-3, at the All Seasons Arena in Mankato ... In their last action, Nov. 18-19, the Mavs dropped two games to No. 6 North Dakota at Ralph Engelstad Arena ... After starting the season 3-0-0, the Mavericks have gone 2-9-0 in their last 11 games ... In six of the past eight games, the Mavericks have been held to one goal or less, being shutout four times ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
