Minnesota State to Host Minnesota Duluth Friday & Saturday in Final WCHA Series Before the Holiday Break

Wisconsin Wins Twice at BSU Dec. 9-10 to Gain Six-Point Advantage in League Race as Knight Becomes UW's All-Time Leading Scorer; Minnesota Sweeps Visiting OSU; UMD at UND, MSU at SCSU Series End in Splits as Huskies Gain First Conference Victory of 2011-12; WCHA-Member Teams Sport 30-7-4 (.780) Record vs Other Div. 1 Teams; Five WCHA Clubs Again Ranked Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Weekly Poll ... Wisconsin Unanimous No. 1, Minnesota at No. 2, North Dakota at No. 6, Bemidji State at No. 8, Minnesota Duluth Up to No. 9

MADISON, Wis. – Just one two-game series is on the docket in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the upcoming weekend of Dec. 16-17 as Minnesota State plays host to No. 9-ranked Minnesota Duluth at All Seasons Arena (750) in Mankato. The Mavericks (6-12-0, 2-10-0 WCHA) and Bulldogs (9-8-1, 6-7-1-1 WCHA) will face-off at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and again at 3:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

With that being the final league series remaining before the two-week holiday break, the race for first place in the WCHA is currently a two-team affair between long-time rivals Wisconsin and Minnesota. The defending NCAA and WCHA-champion Badgers and Golden Gophers continue to also hold down the top spots in the weekly national polls and, after scoring series sweeps over the recent Dec. 9-11 weekend, the border rivals are No. 1 and No. 2 in the WCHA.

No. 1-ranked Wisconsin has won a nation's best 14 games in a row after winning twice at Bemidji State, 3-1 and 6-1. The No. 8-ranked Beavers were swept for only the second time in their new home, with both times by the UW. No. 2-ranked Minnesota, which hosts the Badgers when post-holiday play resumes Jan. 6-7, stayed within sight of the leaders by downing visiting Ohio State by 3-1 and 4-1 margins. The Gophers remain two full games down on Wisconsin, but their lead over third place and No. 6-ranked North Dakota grew to five points with two games in hand. Minnesota, incidentally, handed Wisconsin

its only loss, a 3-2 decision back on Oct. 16 in Madison.

Heading into the one remaining league series before the break, a look at the WCHA standings shows Wisconsin (19-1-0, 13-1-0 WCHA) at the top with 39 points, six more than Minnesota's (17-3-0, 11-3-0 WCHA) 33. North Dakota (12-7-1, 9-5-1 WCHA) is in third place with 28 points while Ohio State (8-7-1, 6-7-1-1 WCHA) is currently tied with Minnesota Duluth (9-8-1, 6-7-1-1 WCHA) for fourth place with 20 points apiece. Bemidji State (10-7-2, 6-7-1-0 WCHA) stands sixth with 19 points – just one back of OSU and UMD – in the battle for the final home playoff spot. Minnesota State (6-12-0, 2-10-0 WCHA) has six points for the seventh position while St. Cloud State (2-16-2, 1-13-0 WCHA) is eighth with three points.

In conference play last weekend, visiting Wisconsin won twice at Bemidji State (3-1, 6-1) as senior forward Hilary Knight became the all-time scoring leader at the UW with 239 points to surpass the mark set by Meghan Duggan last season at 238 points. With those 239 career points, Knight also cracked the top five for career points in NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey. She had four goals, including a three-goal hat trick in last Saturday's 6-1 victory over the host Beavers at Sanford Center, while teammate Brianna Decker extended her point-scoring streak to 31 consecutive games. Decker also has recorded at least one assist in the past 13 games and the junior forward leads the nation in point scoring with 48 (21g, 27a). Her 21 goals ranks second in the nation, behind Knight's 23. For Bemidji State in the series, goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova was credited with 51 saves in the 3-1 setback last Friday while yielding two power-play goals and an empty-netter. Scoring for the Beavers against the Badgers were right winger Emily Erickson, who staked BSU to a 1-0 second period lead on Dec. 9 and right winger Kristi King, who tallied in the first period on Dec. 10.

At Ridder Arena in Minneapolis on Dec. 10-11, the Golden Gophers kept pace with the Badgers, beating visiting Ohio State twice, 4-1 and 3-1, as center Jen Schoullis had three points --an assist in the series opener last Saturday and a game-winning goal and an assist last Sunday. Leading the way in the series opener were right winger Amanda Kessel (1g, 1a) and left winger Rachael Bona, who scored the game-winner. In the second contest, Kessel again added a goal and an assist. Minnesota goaltender Noora Rätty made 46 saves in what was the Gophers' sixth series sweep (all games) of the 2011-12 season. She leads the WCHA and is second nationally in goals-against average at 1.26. Minnesota's defensive corps leads the nation in scoring defense, allowing only 1.20 goals per game. Last weekend, Rätty and the Gopher defense held the sixth-ranked goal scorer in the WCHA, Natalie Spooner, without a goal.

In a series featuring two top-10 ranked teams at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, host North Dakota split with Minnesota Duluth, winning 2-0 last Saturday before falling 5-1 last Sunday. UMD, who carried a three-game winning streak into that two-game set, captured

the four-game regular season series against UND, 2-1-1. Despite a strong effort in nets by UMD's Jennifer Harss in the series opener, the Sioux took a 2-0 decision in a goaltending battle, as Jorid Dagfinrud ran her personal shutout streak to over eight periods. Left winger Alyssia Wiebe scored the game-winner with a shortanded tally at 5:03 of the second period. Dagfinrud's string came to an end the next day, however, as UMD's Pernilla Winberg scored :65 seconds into the game enroute to a 5-1 victory and the Bulldogs climbed into a fourth place tie in the league race. Also for UMD, winger Audrey Cournoyer (1g, 1a) and defensemen Mariia Posa (2a) and Jessica Wong (2a) each had two points. Scoring the lone goal for North Dakota was center Josefine Jakobsen, who had a power-play, extra-attacker marker at 17:21 of the third.

At the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, Minnesota State goaltender Alli Altmann made 26 saves and 11 players had points as the visiting Mavericks recorded their first shutout, 6-0, in the series opener against St. Cloud State on Dec. 9. Seven players had two-point games for MSU, with center Lauren Smith scoring a pair of goals, and centers Kari Lundberg and Kelsie Scott and defenseman Ariel Mackley all netting a goal and an assist each. Then last Saturday, St. Cloud State used second period goals by left wingers Sydney Burghardt and Alex Nelson and 29 stops by goaltender Julie Friend to post a 2-1 victory over Minnesota State. It was the Huskies' first league victory of the season.

Through games of Dec. 12, six of the WCHA's eight-member teams own winning records overall this season. Wisconsin sports a 19-1-0 mark and .950 winning percentage, Minnesota is 17-3-0 with a .850 winning percentage, North Dakota is at 12-7-1 and .625, Bemidji State is at 10-7-2 and .579, Ohio State is at 9-7-2 and .556, and Minnesota Duluth is at 9-8-1 and .528.

Against opponents from other Division 1 conferences so far this season, WCHA teams are a combined 30-7-4 overall for a .780 winning percentage. League-member teams are 6-0-0 (1.000) vs ECAC Hockey, 13-2-1 (.844) vs the Hockey East Association, 6-5-3 (.535) vs College Hockey America, and 5-0-0 vs. Independents.

In this week's (Dec. 12) USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, the WCHA again has five teams ranked among the nation's top 10, led by Wisconsin as a unanimous No. 1. Minnesota is ranked No. 2, North Dakota is at No. 6, Bemidji State is at No. 8 and Minnesota Duluth is at No. 9. Also receiving votes in the poll was Ohio State.

Following the conclusion of the Dec. 16-17 MSU vs UMD series, there

will be no games played by league teams until New Year's weekend. On Friday, Dec. 30 and Saturday, Dec. 31, Bemidji State will travel east to take on Robert Morris of College Hockey America while Ohio State will play host to ECAC Hockey-member Princeton in Columbus. On Wednesday, Jan. 4, North Dakota will entertain Lindenwood University. Conference play will not resume until the weekend of Jan. 6-7 when Bemidji State hosts Minnesota State, Minnesota entertains Wisconsin, and Ohio State visits St. Cloud State.

Home to a record 12 consecutive national championship teams, including the latest NCAA Frozen Four crown won by Wisconsin last spring, the women's WCHA marks its 13th season in 2011-12.

Beavers

Bemidji State University

The No. 8-ranked Beavers (19 points in the WCHA) ended the first half of the 2011-12 season with a 10-7-2 overall record and 6-7-1 WCHA mark ... The record marks the first time Bemidji State has had 10 wins before New Year's Day in the program's history ... The Beavers end the first half ranked fourth in the nation in power-play with 23 goals on 84 man-advantage opportunities ... In addition, Bemidji State has two players ranked in the top 10 in defensemen scoring nationally with 19 points apiece from Erika Wheelhouse and Montana Vichorek ... The Beavers will return to action on Dec. 30 and Dec. 31 with non-conference games at Robert Morris University of College Hockey America.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

The No. 2-ranked Golden Gophers (17-3-0, 11-3-0 WCHA, 33 points) went into the holiday break with two league victories over Ohio State at Ridder Arena on Dec. 10-11 ... The Gophers are now idle until hosting top-ranked Wisconsin in a big WCHA series Jan. 6-7 at Ridder ... Minnesota is the only team to beat Wisconsin this season ... Forward Jen Schoullis had three points in the weekend sweep over Ohio State, with an assist in last Saturday's 4-1 win, and a goal and an assist in last Sunday's 3-1 victory ... On Saturday, Schoullis had the first assist on Emily West's goal in the first period and was a +2 ... Last Sunday, Schoullis assisted on Megan Bozek's goal six minutes into the game and then scored the game-winning goal shortly into the second period ... She was a +3 on Sunday and recorded two shots ... In 19 games played this season, Schoullis has 10 multiple-point games and she has earned a point in 17 of those 19 games ... Goaltender Noora Rätty had 46 saves against Ohio State last weekend, and held the Buckeyes to just two goals in the series sweep ... Several key saves by Rätty held the scoring lead for the Gophers in both games, and helped Minnesota to its sixth series sweep of the season ... Her 27 saves last Saturday were a season-best ... Rätty led Minnesota's defense in holding Ohio State to just one goal in each game after the Buckeyes came into the weekend averaging 2.93 goals per game ... She leads the WCHA and ranks second nationally in goals-against average at 1.26 ... She also ranks second in the WCHA (seventh nationally) in saves percentage at .939 ... Minnesota's defensive corps leads the nation in scoring defense, allowing only 1.20 goals per game ... Last weekend, Rätty and the Gopher defense held the sixth-ranked goal scorer in the WCHA, Ohio State's Natalie Spooner, without a goal.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

The No. 9-ranked Bulldogs (9-8-1, 6-7-1-1 WCHA, 20 points) split with No. 6-ranked North Dakota in Grand Forks last weekend, losing 2-0 on Saturday and winning 5-1 on Sunday ... The Bulldogs were shutout for the first time this season last Saturday, as North Dakota scored two goals in the second period, including a shorthanded tally to defeat UMD for only the fifth time in Bulldog history ... UMD responded in a big way on Sunday, as Pernilla Winberg scored in the opening 1:05 of play and with two goals in the first and second periods rolled to a 5-1 victory ... Three players had two-point performances in that victory, including Audrey Cournoyer, who added a goal and an assist and blueliner Mariia Posa, who also was +3, tying a career-high ... Gagne leads all Ohio State freshmen with five goals this season and she is second among Buckeye first-years with seven points ... Nelson was assisted on her goal by freshman Abby Ness and senior Brittany Toor ... Ness leads St. Cloud State with seven assists while Toor is second on the team with six ... Senior Jaclyn Daggit picked up an assist last Saturday in her first game back since being injured in the Huskies season opener on Sept. 30 ... St. Cloud State is off until January 6-7, 2012 when they will play host to Ohio State for a two-game WCHA series.

Badgers University of Wisconsin

The No. 1-ranked Badgers (19-1-0, 13-1-0 WCHA, 39 points) enter winter break in first place in the WCHA, with a two-game lead over second-place Minnesota ... The two teams will be pitted against each other as conference play resumes on Jan. 6-7, 2012 ... Both games will be played at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and will start at 7:07 pm CT and 4:07 pm CT ... Scoring four goals and tallying two assists against No. 7-ranked Bemidji State on Dec. 9-10, Hilary Knight became the all-time points leader at Wisconsin surpassing the mark set by Meghan Duggan last season at 238 ... With 239 career points, Knight also cracked the top five for career points in NCAA DI women's hockey ... With her shorthanded goal to lift the Badgers over Minnesota Duluth, 4-3, on Oct. 21, 2011, Knight became the all-time game-winning goals leader at Wisconsin ... Knight currently has 26 game-winners, which eclipses the mark of 22 set by Duggan ... She also sits third on the NCAA Div. 1 Women's career list for game-winning goals, with the top mark of 39 GWG's set by Meghan Agosta of Mercyhurst ... Decker currently has a 31-game point streak ... In those 31 games, she has scored 32 goals and tallied 43 assists to give her 74 points since Feb. 11, 2011 ... The streak also includes four hat tricks ... After ending a point streak on Oct. 22 at Minnesota Duluth, Brooke Ammerman hasn't failed to record a point each game since ... In the past 12 games she has scored 10 goals and tallied 17 helpers ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
