2012 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship a True Feast for Hockey Fans as Three of Nation's Top Five Teams, Four 20-Game Winners in Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth Hit the AMSOIL Arena Ice this Weekend

UND's Lamoureux is WCHA Scoring Champion, UW's Rigsby is Goaltending Champion; 12 WCHA Players Among 30 Nominees for Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award; Latest National Polls have UW No. 1, UM No. 2, UND No. 5 ... UMD, BSU Receive Votes; WCHA-Member Teams 33-7-6 (.783) in Non-Conference Play

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's FINAL FACE-OFF, which has established itself as the best annual women's hockey tournament in the country, moves to AMSOIL ARENA in Duluth, Minnesota March 2-3 with a field that includes three of the top-five ranked teams in the country and four clubs that have already won 20 games this season. Taking the ice Friday and Saturday for the league playoff championship are No. 1-ranked Wisconsin, No. 2-ranked Minnesota, No. 5-ranked North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth.

The WCHA playoff champions have gone on to win the national title each of the last nine years and no

Division 1 collegiate conference – in any sport – can top the impressive list of national accomplishments of the WCHA. Since its founding in 1999-2000, teams representing the women's WCHA have captured a record 12 consecutive national championships – including the 2010-11 campaign when Wisconsin earned the program's fourth women's NCAA Frozen Four title.

The two teams which have combined to win the last six national titles will collide in the first semifinal this Friday, March 2, with No. 4 seed Minnesota Duluth (20-13-1) taking on No. 1 seed Wisconsin (31-3-2) at 4:37 pm CT followed by No. 3 seed North Dakota (22-10-3) skating against No. 2 seed Minnesota (29-5-2) at 7:37 pm CT. Friday's two winners will then play for the league playoff championship on Saturday, March 3, at 7:07 pm CT.

The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Div. 1 Women's Ice Hockey Tournament, which begins the weekend of March 9-10 with regional play and ends with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four back at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, March 16-18.

During the WCHA regular season, Wisconsin posted its first-ever regular-season sweep over Minnesota Duluth and its first sweep in Duluth since 2002. The series at AMSOIL Arena back on Oct. 21-22 saw the Badgers put up a combined score of 10-6 against the Bulldogs, winning 4-3 and 6-3. The series at the Kohl Center in Madison on Jan. 20-21 was a lower scoring affair as the Badgers shutout UMD in the first game, 2-0, before needing overtime on the second night for a 4-3 win. Overall, the series between the two powers stands 26-26-10 with 20 games going to overtime.

Minnesota and North Dakota split four regular season games, with each team winning and losing one game in its home arena. This will mark the first neutral-site game between the two teams. Minnesota leads the all-time series 31-5-0, but North Dakota has won five of the last eight games.

Three of the tournament participants – No. 1 Wisconsin, No. 2 Minnesota and No. 5 North Dakota – are ranked in the top 10 in the Feb. 27 USCHO.com Women's Division 1 Weekly Poll, with UMD receiving honorable mention. The tournament will be streamed live on the league website (www.wcha.com <<http://www.wcha.com/>>) and televised live in northern Minnesota on My9. Veteran announcers Tom Hansen and Jack Swanson will provide commentary on all three tournament games.

The first round of the WCHA playoffs went according to seed as all four home teams scored two-game sweeps in the best of three series. Wisconsin, the defending FINAL FACE-OFF champion, whitewashed Minnesota State with 7-0 and 4-0 shutouts. Badgers' goaltender Alex Rigsby had 48 saves in the back-to-back shutouts and forward Brooke Ammerman responded with four goals in game one and another goal

Minnesota breezed by St. Cloud State, 6-1 and 6-0, on Feb. 24-25 and forward Amanda Kessel had three goals in the clinching victory.

North Dakota advanced to its second straight FINAL FACE-OFF semifinal by eliminating Bemidji State for the second year in a row, winning 3-1 and 2-0 while surrendering just one goal in the two-game playoff series. Last year their first round series went three games. Last weekend, UND limited Bemidji State to 15 shots in the 3-1 win Friday, and followed up with a 19-save shutout by goaltender Stephanie Ney last Saturday.

Minnesota Duluth, meanwhile made sure it will host the WCHA party by taking out Ohio State with a pair of one-goal wins. Jennifer Harss had a big series in goal, helping UMD to win, 4-3, last Friday despite being outshot 37-23. The next night freshman Shara Jasper punched the Bulldogs' ticket to the WCHA dance with the biggest goal of her career at 6:40 of overtime to propel her team to a 3-2 triumph.

During the regular season North Dakota's Jocelyne Lamoureux was the WCHA scoring champion for 2011-12 with 27 goals, 37 assists and 64 points, 10 more than Wisconsin's Brianna Decker. Rigsby had the league's best goals-against average, 1.47, to claim the goaltending championship – besting Minnesota's Noora Rätty who had a 1.57 mark. Lamoureux and Rigsby will receive plaques for their accomplishments at a league awards banquet this Thursday night, March 1, in Duluth.

In the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll released for Feb. 28, three Western Collegiate Hockey Association teams were among the nation's top 10 ranked teams. Defending national champion Wisconsin was No. 1, Minnesota was No. 2, and North Dakota was No. 5. Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State also received votes.

And in this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll released on Feb. 27, the WCHA had three of the top 10 ranked teams and two that received votes. Wisconsin continued at No. 1, Minnesota was at No. 2, and North Dakota was at No. 5. Also receiving votes were both Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State.

WCHA teams have a .778 winning percentage against opponents from other Division 1 conferences this season, WCHA teams are 33-7-6 overall. WCHA teams are 6-0-2 (.875) vs ECAC Hockey, 13-2-1 (.844) vs. the Hockey East Association, 8-5-3 (.594) vs. College Hockey America, and 6-0-0 vs. Independents.

Home to a record 12 consecutive national championship teams, including the NCAA Frozen Four crown won by Wisconsin last spring, the women's WCHA marks its 13th season in 2011-12.

League to Announce Individual Award Winners on Thursday Night, March 1

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will announce it's individual awards for the 2011-12 season on Thursday night, March 1 in conjunction with the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship in Duluth. The announcements will be for an 8:30 pm CT release.

WCHA individual awards include the WCHA Player of the Year, WCHA Outstanding Student of the Year, WCHA Defensive Player of the Year, WCHA Rookie of the Year, WCHA Coach of the Year, WCHA Scoring Champion, WCHA Goaltending Champion, the All-WCHA First Team, All-WCHA Second Team, All-WCHA Third Team and All-WCHA Rookie Team.

Twelve WCHA Players Among 30 Nominated for 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award

Group Includes UM's Bozek, Kessel, Raty and Schoullis, UW's Rigsby, Knight and Decker, UND's Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls, BSU's Tomcikova, UMD's Irwin, OSU's Spooner

A dozen Western Collegiate Hockey Association players, representing six member teams, are among the 30 skaters who have been nominated for the 15th annual Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, which is presented annually to the top women's player in Division 1 hockey.

Four of the 12 nominees are from Minnesota. They are junior defenseman Megan Bozek (Buffalo Grove, IL), sophomore forward Amanda Kessel (Madison, WI), junior goaltender Noora Rätty (Espoo, Finland), and senior forward Jen Schoullis (Erie, PA). Rätty was one of 10 finalists for the award a year ago.

Three nominees are from league champion Wisconsin in sophomore goaltender Alex Rigsby (Delafield, WI), senior forward Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID) – who was a top ten finalist last season – and junior forward Brianna Decker (Dousman, WI).

North Dakota has two nominees. They are twin sisters Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls of Grand Forks, ND. Both are juniors. Lamoureux is a forward while Monique has played at both forward and on the blue line.

Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth and Ohio State each have one nominee. Senior goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova (Bratislava, Slovakia), is the BSU nominee; senior forward Haley Irwin (Thunder Bay, ON) is UMD's nominee and senior forward Natalie Spooner (Scarborough, ON) is OSU's nominee.

The 34 Division 1 coaches will pick the 10 Patty Kazmaier finalists, which will be announced March 1. A 13-member selection committee will then select the final three, which will be announced March 8, and the winner, which will be announced March 17 at a brunch in Duluth in conjunction with the NCAA Women's Frozen Four.

WCHA Announces Record Number of 110 Scholar-Athletes for 2011-12

Seventh Annual Class Includes 54 Repeat Honorees; MSU's Lee, UMD's Reiter are Four-Time Recipients

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association, through Commissioner Bruce M. McLeod, Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, Michigan Technological University Athletic Director Suzanne Sanregret (Chair, men's league) and University of Minnesota Faculty Representative Perry Leo (Chair, women's league) announced on Feb. 15 that a record total of 110 men's and women's student-athletes make up the seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients for 2011-12. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

"It is with a great deal of pride that we announce our seventh annual group of WCHA Scholar-Athletes," said McLeod, Martin, Sanregret and Leo (Chair, women's league) in a joint statement.

"This announcement has become one of the real highlights for the Western Collegiate Hockey Association each season as it focuses attention on a truly exceptional group of student-athletes. These outstanding young men and women have gone above and beyond to achieve great success both on and off the ice and their accomplishments are a testimony to the amount of dedication and hard work they put in throughout the school year. Together, they represent their teams and their league in a most impressive way and we could not be more proud of each and every one of them. On behalf of the entire WCHA, We wish them all the success in the world."

The WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award was developed through Association member team Faculty Representatives and approved by the conference membership beginning with the 2005-06 season. To earn recognition as a WCHA Scholar-Athlete, conference-member student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at their present institution prior to the current academic year and must also have a grade-point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale for each of the previous two semesters or three quarters, or may qualify if his or her overall GPA is at least 3.50 for all terms at his or her present institution.

Over the first seven years of the award, there have now been 525 honorees representing all 12 men's-member and all eight women's-member institutions. The previous record for honorees in one season was 90 in 2010-11.

Fifty-four (54) of this season's 110 men's and women's WCHA Scholar-Athletes are repeat honorees, including two four-time recipients and 15 three-time winners.

Earning this distinguished honor for the fourth time are Minnesota Duluth's Kenny Reiter (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12) and Minnesota State's Austin Lee (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12), who also become only the fourth and fifth conference student-athletes to do so. The Beavers also achieved their first-ever ranking during the season and rose as high as No. 7 before dropping out of the polls ... BSU received votes or was ranked in every national poll from Oct. 1 until Feb. 27 when they were knocked out of the WCHA Playoffs ... Bemidji State was led by Zuzana Tomcikova, their netminder who was nominated for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award and who set every school record as a senior this season ... Tomcikova finished her career ranked 3rd all-time in saves in NCAA history ... BSU picked up five wins over ranked opponents during the course of the season ... The Beavers also played in front of the largest crowd in NCAA history against No. 1 Wisconsin at the Kohl Center, the total attendance was 12,402 ... The Beavers graduate six seniors from this squad but return a plethora of talent to the fold for next year's campaign.

Forward Amanda Kessel had her fourth hat trick of the season when she scored three goals last Saturday in the playoff win over St. Cloud State ... Defenseman Anne Schleper moved into second place in the Minnesota record book for career points by a defenseman with her 113th point last Friday.

The fourth-seeded Bulldogs (20-13-1 overall) swept fifth-seeded Ohio State in a first round WCHA Playoff series at AMSOIL Arena last weekend, the first back-to-back wins for the Bulldogs against the Buckeyes since Feb. 11-12, 2011 ... UMD has won eight of its last 10 and four consecutive games heading into their WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF semi-final game with top-seed Wisconsin this Friday at AMSOIL ... UMD defeated OSU 4-3 last Friday, spreading out the scoring with a goal in the first and third periods and two in the second ... Sophomore winger Jamie Kenyon scored two of UMD's goals, including a shorthanded tally at 5:52 of the first period and a power-play goal at 10:51 of the second stanza ... UMD was outshot 37-23, but Jennifer Harss turned away 34 shots to secure the win ... The Bulldogs needed overtime Saturday night to overcome the Buckeyes 3-2 ... It was the first overtime win for UMD this season, and the Bulldogs are 1-1-1 in extra time in 2011-12 ... Senior center Haley Irwin, who also scored a goal last Friday night, tallied two goals Saturday in the first period ... The first goal came at 2:06 of the first period and the second at 19:43 ... Rookie forward Shara Jasper scored the game-winner, her fourth goal of the season ... Harss had 27 saves and UMD outshot OSU 30-29 ... UMD is now 48-7-4 all-time against the Buckeyes and more impressively, has never lost a first round WCHA playoff series since the league went to the best-of-three format in 2006 ... The Bulldogs are just 5-7 all-time in WCHA semifinal contests and overall 31-8 in the

WCHA playoffs ... Irwin is now tied as the fifth-highest scorer in Bulldog program history with 204 points (79g, 125a) ... With 52 points in 30 games (16g, 36a), Irwin is averaging 1.62 points per game ... Irwin's 36 assists are the sixth most by a Bulldog in a single-season, trailing by one her rookie effort of 37 in 2007-08 ... Freshman winger Jenna McParland's 20 goals is the seventh most goals scored by a rookie in UMD history ... Game time is set for 4:37 pm CT and if the Badgers win they will play the winner of Minnesota/North Dakota on Saturday at 7:07 pm CT for the tournament championship ... Currently, the all-time series record between UMD and UW is tied at 26-26-10, with the Badgers having won the last seven of nine games ... This year Wisconsin posted its first-ever regular-season sweep over Minnesota Duluth and its first sweep in Duluth since 2002 ... The series in Duluth Oct. 21-22 saw the Badgers put up a combined score of 10-6 against the Bulldogs, winning 4-3 and 6-3 ... The series in Madison was a lower scoring affair as the Badgers shutout UMD in the first game, 2-0, before needing overtime on the second night for a 4-3 win ... The group of Prévost, Decker, Ammerman and Knight have combined for a total of 121 goals and 141 assists so far this season ... The four account for over half (.601) of the team's point production and have scored more than two-thirds (.716) of the team's goals so far this season ... Compared to other team's top-four scorers, they are the highest scoring group in the nation with 262 points ... Rigsby leads the nation with a .952 save percentage, while her 938 saves is the third most in the nation ... Rigsby also has the best goals-against average in the nation (1.34) ... Wisconsin has the second-best power-play and best penalty-kill units in the conference ... The 24.4% on the power-play also ranks fourth nationally, while the 89.1% on the penalty-kill ranks first ...

Knight has tied the program mark for most shorthanded goals in a season with three ... Her seven career shorthanders is also tied for the program's most ... With 1398 total shots on goal so far this season, the Badgers are averaging 39 shots on goal per game, the third most in the nation ... WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
