CO-LEADERS MINNESOTA, NORTH DAKOTA COLLIDE THIS WEEK AFTER POSTING WCHA SWEEPS; BSU PLAYS AT OSU

GOPHERS, UND MEET IN GRAND FORKS SATURDAY-SUNDAY; UMD HEADS TO BOSTON COLLEGE; SCSU OFF TO PROVIDENCE, MSU TRAVELS TO MERCYHURST, UW HOSTS NEW HAMPSHIRE; BEMIDJI STATE TAKES FOUR POINTS FROM BADGERS IN FIRST GAMES AT UW'S NEW LA BAHN ARENA OCT. 19 & 21; MINNESOTA STATE EARNS FIVE POINTS FROM UMD; LATEST USCHO.COM WOMEN'S DIV. 1 COLLEGE HOCKEY POLL HAS UM AT NO. 1, UND AT NO. 8, MSU AT NO. 10 ... OSU, UW, UMD ALSO RECEIVE VOTES; WCHA STANDS 11-1-0 (.917) IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY THIS SEASON

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Minnesota (8-0-0, 4-0-0 WCHA) and No. 8 North Dakota (4-2-0, 4-2-0 WCHA), a pair of nationally-ranked teams coming off two-game sweeps, face-off this weekend in Grand Forks, N.D. in an early season battle for the lead in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association. The Saturday-Sunday series, with face-offs at 2:07 pm CT both afternoons, is one of two league matchups on the docket, but the games at Ralph Englestad Arena are the marquee shows, matching two teams that qualified for the NCAA tournament last year.

The Gophers lead the all-time series against UND, 33-5-0, but North Dakota and Minnesota have split the last 10 games between them and have split the last three regular-season series. UND was the last team to sweep a series (coming in the first half of the 2010-11 season in Minneapolis). The Gophers defeated North Dakota twice in elimination games last year in both the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Tournament. During Minnesota's 2011-12 national championship season, UND was the only team in the nation to shutout the Gophers (Dec. 3) and defeat them twice (3-0, 2-1).

North Dakota stayed tied for first place with Minnesota and picked up its first series sweep of the season last weekend (Oct. 19-20) grinding out 3-1 and 1-0 wins over visiting St. Cloud State. Jocelyne Lamoureux led the way offensively with three goals on the weekend while Jorid Dagfinrud allowed just one goal in the two games to backstop UND to both wins. In four games played and 199:00 minutes, Dagfinrud has allowed just one goal and has 3-0-0 record with two shutouts. She has a 0.30 goals-against average and a .981 save percentage which both lead the nation. Lamoureux has eight goals this season, while the rest of her teammates have combined for seven.

The only other conference series being contested this weekend features Bemidji State (2-3-1, 1-2-1 WCHA) traveling to Ohio State (5-3-0, 3-3-0 WCHA) for a Friday (7:07 pm ET) and Saturday (4:07 pm ET) series at the OSU Ice Rink.

Outside the WCHA, Minnesota Duluth (2-3-1) will play at Hockey East Association-member and No. 6-ranked Boston College (1-2-0) on Thursday and Friday, No. 10-ranked Minnesota State (4-2-2) heads to No. 5 Mercyhurst College (6-1-1) of College Hockey America for Friday and Saturday match ups, St. Cloud State (2-4-0) takes on host Providence College (3-3-0) of Hockey East on Saturday and Sunday, and Wisconsin (3-3-2) plays host to Hockey East's New Hampshire (3-2-0) on Friday at 7:07 pm CT and Sunday at 2:07 pm CT. For St. Cloud State, this will mark the Huskies' fourth consecutive road series to start the 2012-13 season.

In another WCHA contested last weekend, Oct. 19 & 21, Bemidji State (2-3-1, 1-2-1 WCHA, 4 points) ruined the house-warming party at Wisconsin's new LaBahn Arena by taking four of six points from the Badgers in the first games in the \$34 million rink. Abby Ryplanski made 27 saves between the pipes last Friday and blanked the Badgers, 1-0, while the teams skated to a 3-3 tie in the series finale on Sunday and Wisconsin, which had gone 10 straight periods without a goal until scoring in the second period Sunday, picked up the extra point by winning the shootout.

At Mankato, Minnesota State took five of six points from visiting Minnesota Duluth, tying 3-3 (ot) in the series opener and then blanking the visitors 1-0. Minnesota Duluth built a 3-0 lead over the Mavericks last Friday, but were unable to hold it through the final 10 minutes, as Kathleen Rogan scored an extra-attacker goal at 19:49 of the third period. After a scoreless overtime, the Mavericks changed to backup goaltender Erin Krichiver for the shootout, which they won to gain the extra point. Danielle Butters was back in the Mavs' net last Saturday and saved all 28 shots while Tracy McCann scored the game's only goal in the third period. McCann had four points in the series.

Minnesota State and Ohio State each have nine points in the standings to share third place, three points behind league co-leaders

Minnesota and North Dakota. Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin are tied for fifth place with seven points each, one point ahead of St. Cloud State and three better than Bemidji State.

Looking ahead to the first week of November, Bemidji State will get things started on Thursday (Nov. 1) when the Beavers take on the Minnesota Whitecaps in an exhibition match at Eveleth, Minn. On Friday (Nov. 2) and Saturday (Nov. 3), WCHA series will feature Ohio State at St. Cloud State and Minnesota at Minnesota Duluth while North Dakota entertains Clarkson of ECAC Hockey in a non-conference set. On Saturday and Sunday (Nov. 4), Wisconsin will host Minnesota State for a two-game WCHA series.

Through 12 non-conference games as of Oct. 23, WCHA-member teams stand 11-1-0 (.917) against other Div. 1 opponents. The WCHA is 6-0 vs College Hockey America, 4-0 vs ECAC Hockey and 1-1-0 vs Hockey East.

In this week's (Oct. 22) USCHO.com Women's Div. 1 College Hockey Poll, defending national champion and unbeaten Minnesota continues as a unanimous No. 1, North Dakota is at No. 8 and Minnesota State has moved up to No. 10. Also receiving votes from the WCHA were Ohio State, Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth.

2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP ROSTER FOR TEAM USA ANNOUNCED BY USA HOCKEY 13 SKATERS HAVE WCHA TIES

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twelve Olympians highlight the 23-player U.S. Women's National Team roster that will compete in the 2012 Women's Four Nations Cup in Vantaa and Kerava, Finland from Nov. 5-10.

Also included are 13 skaters with WCHA ties. They are goaltenders Alex Rigsby (UW), Jessie Vetter (UW alum), defensemen Megan Bozek (UM), Lisa Chesson (OSU alum), Gigi Marvin (UM alum), Anne Schleper (UM alum), and forwards Brianna Decker (UW), Meghan Duggan (UW alum), Sarah Erickson (UM), Amanda Kessel (UM), Hilary Knight (UW alum), Jocelyne Lamoureux (UND), and Monique Lamoureux (UND).

"We've got a terrific team assembled to compete in the Four Nations Cup," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "I feel this tournament will provide an excellent gauge of where we are as a team as we continue to evaluate players and progress toward the 2014 Olympics."

Among the 12 Olympians are Julie Chu (Fairfield, CT), who has not only played in three Olympic Winter Games, but also in 10 previous Four Nations Cups. Others include defensemen Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA), Lisa Chesson (Plainfield, IL), and Gigi Marvin (Warroad, MN); forwards Meghan Duggan (Danvers, MA), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID), Jocelyne Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Monique Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), and Karen Thatcher (Blaine, WA); and goaltenders Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) and Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI).

"From the veteran Olympians to the newcomers, we are confident in this team's ability to give our program a great start to the 2012-2013 season," said Reagan Carey (Colorado Springs, CO), director of women's hockey for USA Hockey.

Prior to the start of the Four Nations Cup, the team will participate in a training camp at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y., from Oct. 30 - Nov. 4.

The camp will include 12 players from the team headed to the Four Nations Cup and select skaters from the 2012 U.S. Women's Under-18

Select Team player pool. At the conclusion of the camp, the 11 NCAA players who complete the U.S. roster will meet the rest of the team in Finland.

CANADA'S NATIONAL WOMEN'S TEAM ROSTER ANNOUNCED FOR 2012 FOUR NATIONS CUP SEVEN PLAYERS HAVE WCHA TIES

CALGARY, Alta. – Hockey Canada announced Tuesday the 23 players that have been selected for Canada's National Women's Team for the 2012 4 Nations Cup, taking place November 6-10 in Kerava and Tikkurila, Finland.

Canada's roster for the 2012 4 Nations Cup includes three goaltenders, seven defencemen and 13 forwards, who were selected following Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival, which took place Sept. 22-29 in Calgary, Alta. Seven of those players have Western Collegiate Hockey Association ties in defensemen Tessa Bonhomme (OSU), Jocelyne Larocque (UMD), Meaghan Mikkelson (UW) and Bobbi Jo Slusar (UW) and forwards Haley Irwin (UMD), Caroline Ouellette (UMD), and Natalie Spooner (OSU).

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will bring together four top women's hockey countries in the world – Canada, Finland, Sweden and the United States – for the 17th annual international tournament. Canada's National Women's Team has won the gold medal at the event a total of 12 times, and has claimed silver on four occasions.

Canada's National Women's Team for the 2012 4 Nations Cup includes ... 21 members of Canada's National Women's Team that won gold at the 2012 IIHF Women's World Championship in Burlington, Vt. (Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Bonhomme, Bram, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Lacasse, Larocque, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 13 members of Canada's gold medal-winning team from the 2010 Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, BC (Agosta, Apps, Bonhomme, Hefford, Irwin, Johnston, Labonté, Mikkelson, Ouellette, Poulin, Szabados, Ward and Wickenheiser) ... 17 players who represented Canada at the 2012 4 Nations Cup in Nyköping, Sweden (Agosta, Apps, Bendus, Birchard, Hefford, Irwin, Jenner, Johnston, Labonté, Larocque, Ouellette, Poulin, Slusar, Spooner, Szabados, Wakefield and Wickenheiser).

"As always, there are no easy decisions when it comes to naming the roster for Team Canada, but we believe we've assembled a strong team for this year's 4 Nations Cup," said Dan Church, head coach of Canada's National Women's Team. "There is a good mix of veterans and young players. We look forward to seeing all of them represent Canada in November."

Church will be joined behind the bench at the 2012 4 Nations Cup

by assistant coaches Danielle Goyette (St-Nazaire, Que./University of Calgary, CIS) and Lisa Haley (Westville, N.S./Ryerson University, CIS), who also served alongside him at Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival.

The 2012 4 Nations Cup will serve as an evaluation opportunity for Canada's National Women's Team coaching staff and Hockey Canada scouts, led by head scout of women's national team programs Melody Davidson, for the 2013 IIHF Women's World Championship in Ottawa, Ont., and 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Players will continue to be evaluated with their club teams during the 2012-13 season.

The 2013 IIHF Ice Hockey Women's World Championship, taking place April 2-9 at SBP Arena and the Nepean Sportsplex, will mark the sixth time Canada has hosted the tournament. Canada also hosted in 1990 in Ottawa, 1997 in Kitchener, Ont., 2000 in Mississauga, Ont., 2004 in Halifax, N.S., and 2007 in Winnipeg, Man.

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA WOMEN'S FROZEN FOUR TO BE HELD AT RIDDER ARENA IN MINNEAPOLIS IN MARCH; 112-GAME CONFERENCE SLATE LAUNCHES SEPT. 28-29 AS MINNESOTA STATE HOSTS DEFENDING WCHA REGULAR SEASON CHAMP WISCONSIN; MINNESOTA REIGNS AS DEFENDING WCHA PLAYOFF AND NCAA FROZEN FOUR CHAMPION; BADGERS OPEN NEW HOME IN LABAHN ARENA

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across

the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24. WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-

Four WCHA-member teams ranked among the nation's top 10 in the final two weekly national polls for 2011-12. WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.

The Beavers (2-3-1, 1-2-1 WCHA, 4 points) rebounded from being swept against St. Cloud State in their home and WCHA openers by beating and tying defending WCHA champion Wisconsin on the road on Oct. 19 & 21, 1-0 and 3-3 (lost 2-0 in a shootout) ... She followed that game up with her sixth collegiate hat trick, which included one shorthanded goal, as the Gophers shutout the Buckeyes, 8-0, last Saturday ... She also led the team with 13 shots (.308) and was +6 on the weekend ... Senior goaltender Noora Rätty matched the Minnesota career record for wins with last Saturday's 8-0 shutout over Ohio State ... She now sits at 83 wins, which is tied with Jody Horak ... Last Friday, the senior goaltender recorded 15 saves and helped Minnesota to a 7-2 win ... On her record-tying night, Rätty denied 20 shots ... Rätty, who has 30 career shutouts, is also nine shutouts and 17 wins from tying the NCAA records ...

Minnesota has outscored its opponents 55-3 through eight games ... That is the largest goal differential for the Gophers in the first eight games of any season.
