Trio of WCHA Series on Tap for October 5-6 as MSU is at UND, UM Entertains SCSU, UMD Hosts OSU; BSU Opens at Providence, Badgers Head to Lindenwood for Non-Conference Series

Defending National Champion Minnesota Starts with a Bang as Top-Ranked Gophers Outscore Colgate 18-0 in Season-Opening Non-Conference Series; Defending WCHA Champ Wisconsin Takes Five Points from Minnesota State in Sept. 28-29 League Openers; Ohio State Peppers Lindenwood with Record Number of Shots in Two Non-Conference Victories; Latest USCHO.com Women's Division 1 Poll has UM Unanimous No. 1, UW No. 4, UND No. 5, UMD No. 8

MADISON, Wis. – Defending Western Collegiate Hockey Association champion Wisconsin started league play by taking five of six points from Minnesota State at Mankato and defending national champion and top-rated Minnesota rolled out of the gate with two impressive home victories against Colgate on the opening weekend of the 2012-13 women's college hockey season.

Ohio State swept Lindenwood, 4-0 and 7-2, in two non-conference games in Columbus on Sept. 28-29, but the loudest September song came from Minnesota who scored 7-0 and 11-0 victories over visiting Colgate at Ridder Arena.

On the second weekend of the season, this Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as Minnesota (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) hosts St. Cloud State (0-0-0), Minnesota Duluth (0-0-0) entertains Ohio State (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) and North Dakota (0-0-0) welcomes Minnesota State (0-1-1, 0-1-0-1 WCHA). Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State. The Beavers (0-0-0) open their non-conference season Oct. 5-6 at Providence College (0-0-0) while Wisconsin (1-0-1) travels to Lindenwood (0-2-0).

scored the first three goals in last Friday's 7-0 whitewash of Colgate and all-American goalie Noora Rätty made 20 saves in recording her 27th collegiate shutout. Last Saturday, junior forward Amanda Kessel, Brandt and fellow freshman Maryanne Menefee each had two goals and freshman goaltender Amanda Leveille recorded her first shutout (with 21 saves) in an 11-0 whitewash. The non-conference sweep solidified Minnesota's spot as the unanimous No. 1 pick atop the USCHO.com Women's Division 1 Poll this week.

That poll also shows four WCHA teams in the top seven this week as Wisconsin is at No. 4, North Dakota is at No. 5 and Minnesota Duluth is at No. 7. UMD started its season with two home exhibition victories over the Minnesota Whitecaps, 5-2 and 5-3, last weekend at AMSOIL Arena.

The 112-game conference season began in Mankato with a hotly contested series between the host MSU Mavericks and two-time defending league champion Wisconsin at All Seasons Arena. Last Friday (Sept. 28), Minnesota State's Danielle Butters made 41 saves and Lauren Zrust and Lauren Smith had goals, but UW's Katy Josephs tied the game with :49 seconds left in regulation and Madison Packer picked up the extra point for the Badgers with the shootout-winning goal. In the series finale last Saturday (Sept. 29), senior forward Brianna Decker, the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner and WCHA Player of the Year last season, had two goals and freshman Kim Drake had the game-winner in the Badgers' first victory this season. UW goaltender Alex Rigsby made 16 saves, bringing her series total to 39 stops. Butters made 36 saves, including 22 in the second period alone.

Ohio State set a school record for shots on goal, with over 60 in each game, in sweeping visiting Lindenwood last weekend. Junior goaltender Chelsea Knapp was between the pipes in both games for the Buckeyes, making 35 saves. Senior forward Paige Semenza scored three goals in the series and had five points overall, including a four-point day in the series finale with two goals and two assists. Junior defenseman Annie Svedin had five points in the win last Saturday on two goals and three assists, including a shorthanded tally early in the second period. Ohio State outshot Lindenwood 124-37 in the series. The previous high for shots on goal in a game for Ohio State was 55.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday, Oct. 12 through Sunday, Oct. 14, all eight WCHA-member teams will be in action. Two-game conference series have Ohio State hosting North Dakota (Friday/Saturday), St. Cloud State traveling to Bemidji State (Friday/Saturday) and Minnesota Duluth hosting Wisconsin (Saturday/Sunday). In non-conference match ups, Minnesota heads east to take on St. Lawrence while Minnesota State entertains Lindenwood.

2012 Four Nations Cup Roster for Team USA Announced by USA Hockey

13 Skaters Have WCHA Ties

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twelve Olympians highlight the 23-player U.S. Women's National Team roster that will compete in the 2012 Women's Four Nations Cup in Vantaa and Kerava, Finland from Nov. 5-10.

Also included are 13 skaters with WCHA ties. They are goaltenders Alex Rigsby (UW), Jessie Vetter (UW alum), defensemen Megan Bozek (UM), Lisa Chesson (OSU alum), Gigi Marvin (UM alum), Anne Schleper (UM alum), and forwards Brianna Decker (UW), Meghan Duggan (UW alum), Sarah Erickson (UM), Amanda Kessel (UM), Hilary Knight (UW alum), Jocelyne Lamoureux (UND), and Monique Lamoureux (UND).

"We've got a terrific team assembled to compete in the Four Nations Cup," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "I feel this tournament will provide an excellent gauge of where we are as a team as we continue to evaluate players and progress toward the 2014 Olympics."

Among the 12 Olympians are Julie Chu (Fairfield, CT), who has not only played in three Olympic Winter Games, but also in 10 previous Four Nations Cups. Others include defensemen Kacey Bellamy (Westfield,

MA), Lisa Chesson (Plainfield, IL), and Gigi Marvin (Warroad, MN); forwards Meghan Duggan (Danvers, MA), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID), Jocelyne Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Monique Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), and Karen Thatcher (Blaine, WA); and goaltenders Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) and Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI).

"From the veteran Olympians to the newcomers, we are confident in this team's ability to give our program a great start to the 2012-2013 season," said Reagan Carey (Colorado Springs, CO), director of women's hockey for USA Hockey.

Prior to the start of the Four Nations Cup, the team will participate in a training camp at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y., from Oct. 30 - Nov. 4.

The camp will include 12 players from the team headed to the Four Nations Cup and select skaters from the 2012 U.S. Women's Under-18 Select Team player pool. At the conclusion of the camp, the 11 NCAA players who complete the U.S. roster will meet the rest of the team in Finland.

Team USA opens Four Nations Cup play on Nov. 6 against Sweden at 4 p.m. local time at the Tikkurila Valtti Arena in Vantaa, Finland. For the complete U.S. team roster, visit: <http://usahockey.cachefly.net/2012%20Four%20Nations%20Roster.pdf>.

Notes: Team USA is the defending Four Nations Cup champion. Kelli Stack was named the top forward in the event a year ago with seven points in four games ... Members of the U.S. Women's National Team hail from 12 states, including four each from Massachusetts and Wisconsin, three from Minnesota and Illinois; two from North Dakota; and one each from Idaho, New York, Connecticut, Arizona, Georgia, Ohio, and Washington ... A total of 19 players on the U.S. roster have played in at least one IIHF Women's World Championship ... The Four Nations Cup is an annual tournament featuring the four of the top women's hockey teams in the world – the United States, Canada, Finland and Sweden.

Head Coaches Tab Defending National Champion Minnesota as WCHA Favorite for 2012-13

Defending Conference Champ Wisconsin and North Dakota Chosen Second in Annual Preseason WCHA Head Coaches' Poll; Badgers' Returning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Winner and Forward Brianna Decker Picked as Preseason WCHA Player of the Year ... Minnesota Forward Hannah Brandt is Unanimous Choice for League Rookie of the Year

When in doubt, go with the defending national champions. That is the message from the coaches who have seen their league win the last 13 Division 1 women's national championships. The University of Minnesota swept to the NCAA Women's Frozen Four crown in a memorable playoff run last season (2011-12) and, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches, the Golden Gophers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association title again in 2012-13.

The Gophers, who also won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship a year ago before beating WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin 4-2 to win the national title, return 15 players this season. Minnesota collected six first place votes and 48 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches.

Wisconsin and North Dakota, another NCAA tournament qualifier last season, finished tied for second place in the poll with 40 votes, including one first place vote apiece. Minnesota Duluth, with 32

points, was selected to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State in fifth place, Bemidji State in sixth, Minnesota State in seventh and St. Cloud State in eighth.

Wisconsin senior forward Brianna Decker, the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner as women's college hockey's outstanding player and reigning WCHA Player of the Year, was the coaches' pre-season choice for WCHA player of the year. She had four votes, while Minnesota forward Amanda Kessel and North Dakota forward Jocelyne Lamoureux, last season's league scoring champion, each received two votes. Minnesota freshman forward Hannah Brandt is the head coaches' unanimous choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year.

WCHA Announces 2012-13 Women's Schedule WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA Women's Frozen Four to be Held at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis in March; 112-Game Conference Slate Launches Sept. 28-29 as Minnesota State Hosts Defending WCHA Regular Season Champ Wisconsin; Minnesota Reigns as Defending WCHA Playoff and NCAA Frozen Four Champion; Badgers Open New home in LaBahn Arena

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of

the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future.

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.
