Another Weekend, Another Tough Rival for Streaking Golden Gophers

Top-Ranked Minnesota Goes on Road with NCAA-Record 53-Game Winning Streak and Visits Minnesota Duluth in One of Three October 18-19 WCHA Series; Ohio State Heads to North Dakota, Wisconsin Entertains St. Cloud State; WCHA Teams Stand 11-3-3 in Non-Conference Play and Bemidji State Hopes to Add to That Record by Hosting Lindenwood; Latest National Polls Have Minnesota No. 1, North Dakota No. 4/5, Wisconsin No. 4/6, Minnesota Duluth Tied at No. 7 ... OSU Also Receives Votes

Madison, Wis. – After extending its NCAA-record winning streak to 53 games and disposing of a traditional women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association rival last weekend in Minneapolis, Minnesota turns its attention to another long-time opponent with national championships in its trophy case this Friday and Saturday, Oct. 18-19.

The top-rated Golden Gophers (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 6 points) travel up 35W to face Minnesota Duluth (2-1-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) at AMSOIL Arena with face-offs at 6:07 pm CT both evenings. The two teams have combined to win three of the last four NCAA championships – UMD in 2010 and Minnesota in 2012 and 2013 – but the Gophers have held the upper hand in the intra-state rivalry recently. Minnesota is 36-24-6 all-time against Minnesota Duluth. The Gophers swept UMD in two series last season for the first time ever, and the Gophers have won 10 of the last 11 meetings

between the two teams. UMD is 15-13-2 all-time in Duluth against UM and have been swept just twice at home versus the Gophers in program history.

The Minnesota vs Minnesota Duluth match up is one of three league series being contested this weekend. St. Cloud State (0-2-2, 0-1-1-1 WCHA) continues a four-game conference road trip by visiting Wisconsin (2-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA) while North Dakota (3-0-1, 1-0-1-1 WCHA) hosts Ohio State (2-0-1, 1-0-1 WCHA). The Huskies and Badgers will play at LaBahn Arena in Madison on Friday night at 7:07 pm CT and then on Saturday afternoon at 3:07 pm CT. The Buckeyes and North Dakota will engage at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks in a pair of 7:07 pm CT encounters.

Bemidji State (1-2-1), which does not play its first WCHA series until Oct. 25-26 at home against Minnesota, continues its season-opening non-conference schedule, entertaining Lindenwood at Sanford Center this Friday and Saturday in a pair of 2:07 pm CT afternoon match ups.

Idle from competition this week is Minnesota State (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA).

Last weekend, Minnesota took a pair of league games from visiting Wisconsin in an early season showdown matching the teams that WCHA head coaches picked to finish 1-2 in the conference race in 2013-14. In the series opener on Oct. 11, Minnesota picked up a 2-1 win at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis as sophomore Milica McMillen broke a 1-1 tie midway through the third period. Sophomore Amanda Leveille outdueled Wisconsin's All-American goaltender Alex Rigsby and made a career-high 34 saves, and fellow sophomore Maryanne Menefee scored Minnesota's first goal after Wisconsin took a 1-0 lead on a goal by Erika Sowchuk. In the series finale on Oct. 12, Kelly Terry scored two third-period goals to lead the Gophers to a 2-0 win. Minnesota outshot the Badgers, 33-27, in the game, after being outshot 22-19 through the first two periods. Leveille made 27 saves in her first shutout of the season.

In Grand Forks this past Saturday and Sunday, host North Dakota took five points from Minnesota Duluth in a battle of ranked teams. UND battled back from two third-period deficits to win 4-3 in the series opener and record a 3-3 (ot) tie in game two. In the first game, North Dakota started with a two-goal deficit to start the third period. Michelle Karvinen recorded assists on two goals within the first four minutes of the third

period to help UND tie the game at 3-3. Josefine Jakobsen redirected a shot from Samantha Hanson to give UND the winning tally. The three-goal third-period comeback marked the first time in program history that UND has won a game after starting the third period with a two-goal deficit. In the second game of the weekend, North Dakota took a 2-0 lead in the second period, but visiting Minnesota Duluth capitalized on a momentum swing and scored three goals, two by Meghan Huertas, within five minutes to take the lead. Jakobsen scored another third-period goal, this time to force a 3-3 tie. UND won the shootout, 1-0 in three rounds, for the extra point in the standings. Lara Stalder had a goal and four assists for the Bulldogs.

In Columbus last weekend, Ohio State skated to a 2-2 (ot) tie with St. Cloud State in game one on Friday, lost the shootout point, and then came back for a 4-2 victory in the series finale. St. Cloud State got a game-tying shorthanded goal from Cari Coen in the series opener, clutch goaltending from Julie Friend and a shoot-out game-winner from Molli Mott to pick up two points. In the Buckeyes' 4-2 win over the Huskies last Saturday, junior Danielle Gagne, senior Ally Tarr, sophomore Kendall Curtis and junior Kari Schmitt all scored goals for OSU. Sisters Kari and Sara Schmitt each had four-point series with a goal and three assists apiece.

The WCHA has done well against other leagues so far this season, going 11-3-3 in non-conference games. In non-conference play Oct. 11-12, Minnesota State went on the road and won twice over host Lindenwood. The Mavericks used five first-period goals – including four on the power-play – to down the Lady Lions 7-1 in the series opener last Friday. MSU then completed the series sweep last Saturday afternoon with a 3-1 win. The Mavs had a 37-18 advantage in shots on goal. Junior Kathleen Rogan registered a team-best five points (2g, 3a in the series) and factored in on all four MSU power-play goals with one goal and a trio of first assists.

Bemidji State, meanwhile, dropped a pair of non-league games to visiting Robert Morris by scores of 2-1 and 3-0. Senior forward Tess Dusik scored the eighth goal of her career in last Friday's game.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, October 25 and 26, there are three WCHA series and one non-conference set on the docket. In league play, Minnesota heads to Bemidji State, Minnesota State hosts Minnesota Duluth, and North Dakota travels to St. Cloud State. Outside the loop, Wisconsin entertains Lindenwood of College Hockey America.

2013-14 WCHA Head Coaches' Preseason Poll

It's never a bad choice to pick a team that has won 49 games in a row. That is the message from the hockey coaches who have seen their league win the last 14 Division 1 women's national championships.

The University of Minnesota has swept to the NCAA Women's Frozen Four title in each of the last two seasons and, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches, the Golden Gophers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association title again in 2013-14.

The Gophers, who also won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship the last two seasons and are the defending WCHA regular season champions, collected seven first place votes and 49 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches. Last season Minnesota outscored their opponents 216 to 36 and became the first women's hockey team to ever post an unbeaten season, going 41-0-0. They have 49 straight victories dating back to a 2-1 (ot) loss to North Dakota on Feb. 17, 2012.

Wisconsin placed second in the coaches poll with 42 points and one first place vote and North Dakota, another NCAA tournament qualifier last season, finished in third place in the poll with 36 votes. Ohio State, with 31 points, was selected to finish fourth, followed by Minnesota Duluth in fifth place and Minnesota State in sixth. Bemidji State and St. Cloud State tied for seventh place.

Minnesota sophomore forward Hannah Brandt, an All-WCHA First Team performer last season, was the coaches' pre-season choice for WCHA Player of the Year. She had five votes, while Wisconsin goaltender Alex Rigsby, the league's goaltending champion in 2011-12, received three votes. Minnesota freshman forward Dani Cameranesi is the head coaches' choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year, edging out Wisconsin forward Sarah Nurse in the balloting.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji Next March

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will take one of the showcases in women's hockey to northern Minnesota next season.

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be held at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8, as announced by WCHA women's commissioner Sara Martin on June 18, 2013.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

In the 13 years of NCAA-sponsored women's national championships, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams have won all 13 titles – Minnesota Duluth has five while Minnesota and Wisconsin each have four. Minnesota also won the first AWCHA Women's Division 1 title in 2000.

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA playoff championships and last two NCAA titles. The Gophers beat North Dakota, 2-0, to win the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis.

All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series Feb. 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners from that weekend will play for the conference playoff championship with the semifinals on Friday, March 7. Friday's two winners will then play for the tournament championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information for the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be announced at a later date.

The home of Bemidji State men's and women's hockey, the facility has enabled Bemidji to attract a variety of civic, convention and entertainment events and enhance its position as a regional center for northern Minnesota.

The Sanford Center encompasses approximately 185,000 square feet and include all amenities required to host concerts, family shows, trade shows and community events. - Against the current members of College Hockey America the Beavers are 9-13-3 all-time.

- The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA) maintained their unblemished record with a series sweep over visiting No. 4/5 Wisconsin last weekend. The Gophers skated to 2-1 and 2-0 wins to improve to 4-0-0 on the season and extend their NCAA-record winning streak to 53 games.
- Senior Kelly Terry led Minnesota with three points (2g, 1a) against the Badgers. Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille combined for 61 saves and allowed just one goal for a .984 save percentage in the series. She earned her first shutout of the season and improved to 4-0-0 on the year.
 - Last Friday, Minnesota picked up a 2-1 win at Ridder Arena. Sophomore Milica McMillen broke a 1-1 tie midway through the third period when she netted her second power-play goal of the season. Leveille made a career-high 34 saves, and fellow sophomore Maryanne Menefee scored Minnesota's first goal after Wisconsin took a 1-0 lead on a goal by Erika Sowchuk. Last Saturday's game saw Terry score two third-period goals to lead the Gophers to a 2-0 win. Minnesota outshot the Badgers, 33-27, in the game, after being outshot 22-19 through the first two periods. Leveille made 27 saves in her first shutout of the season.
 - Freshman forward Dani Cameranesi tallied her first two career points in last Saturday's win, picking up assists on both of Minnesota's goals.
 - With the 2-1 win on Oct. 11, the Gophers improved to 11-1-0 all-time in home-openers at Ridder Arena.
 - Last Friday's attendance of 2,754 was the highest attendance in a home-opener at Ridder Arena since it first opened to a crowd of 3,239 against St. Cloud State (W, 8-0) on Oct. 19, 2002. Friday's attendance was also the 11th-best crowd for women's hockey all-time at Ridder Arena.
 - Minnesota (4-0-0), Boston College (3-0-0) and Clarkson (5-0-0) are the only three teams with perfect records this season.
 - The Gophers travel north to face Minnesota Duluth in their first road league series of the season this week. Puck drop is set for 6:07 pm both Friday and Saturday nights at AMSOIL Arena. Minnesota is 36-24-6 all-time vs Minnesota Duluth. The Gophers swept UMD in two series last season, and the Gophers have won 10 of the last 11 meetings between the two teams.
 - Amanda Leveille leads the WCHA with a .955 save percentage (fourth in the nation) and a 1.25 goals-against average (fifth in the nation). She is also the league's only goaltender with a 1.000 winning percentage.
 - Kelly Terry is on a team-best three-game point streak (2g, 2a).

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 7 Bulldogs (2-1-1, 0-1-1 WCHA) dropped a 4-3 decision last Saturday before earning a 3-3 draw against No. 6 North Dakota in Grand Forks on Sunday. Jenna McParland had two goals Oct. 12, but the Bulldogs, despite leading 3-1 after two periods of play surrendered three third period tallies. UMD erased a two-goal deficit Sunday after trailing UND 2-0, benefiting from junior winger Meghan Huertas' two scores to earn the tie. The Bulldogs lost the WCHA shootout for the extra point.
- All-time, UMD is now 35-9-3 against North Dakota and 1-5-2 in its last eight games. The Bulldogs and UND have gone to overtime in three of their last six games and their last two skates have ended in a league shootout.
- UMD netminder Kayla Black made 71 saves over the weekend on 78 shots. The Bulldogs were outshot 78-38 in both games combined. The series was Black's first back-to-back, injury-free action since she played in both games against Wisconsin Feb. 16-17.
- UMD has the NCAA's most effective penalty-kill, staying a perfect 23-of-23 in its four games despite being called for the nation's fourth most penalty minutes a game (12).
- The Bulldogs rank fourth in the NCAA with a 4.75 goals per game scoring offense and second with a 26.7% success rate on the power-play, having scored four goals on 15 attempts with the extra skater.
- Rookie blueliner Lara Stalder leads UMD in scoring with nine points (2g, 7a) in her first four skates. Junior winger Jenna McParland ranks second with six points (4g, 2a).
- Stalder leads the NCAA with an assist per game average of 1.75 and also tops all rookies with a points per game average of 2.25. She ranks third in overall points with nine as well as second among all defensemen. Stalder owns a four-game scoring streak (2g, 7a) and has recorded two or more points in three of her four first games, including three points twice.
- Jenna McParland ranks fourth in the NCAA in goals with a 1.00 goal per game average.
- UMD will host top-ranked Minnesota and its NCAA-record winning streak of 53 games this Friday and Saturday at AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs are 24-36-6 all-time vs the Gophers and were swept in all four games last season for the first time in program history. UMD is 15-13-2 all-time in Duluth vs UM and have been swept just twice at home by the Gophers. The Bulldogs also netted a program-low three goals vs UM in 2012-13.



Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) evened their overall ledger with a 7-1, 3-1 sweep of host Lindenwood last weekend. The Mavericks used five first-period goals – including four on the power-play – to down the Lady Lions last Friday. MSU completed the sweep Saturday with a win and a 37-18 advantage in shots on goal. - The OSU series is also part of the ND Strong campaign, which will help raise funds and awareness for breast cancer research during the month of October. All proceeds will be donated to Mayo Clinic for breast cancer research and will benefit the community of Grand Forks, including patients of Altru Health System, a proud member of the Mayo Clinic Health Network.
- UND battled back from two third-period deficits last weekend to go undefeated against No. 9 Minnesota Duluth. In the first game (Oct. 12), North Dakota started the third period with a two-goal deficit. After scoring the first goal of the game, Michelle Karvinen recorded assists on two goals within the first 4:00 of the third period to help UND tie the game 3-3. Josefine Jakobsen later redirected a shot from Samantha Hanson to give UND the winning tally at 4-3. In game two (Oct. 13), North Dakota took a 2-0 lead in the second, but UMD capitalized on a momentum swing and scored three goals within 5:00 to take the lead. - Kari and Sara Schmitt each had four-point series vs SCSU with a goal and three assists apiece. Kari leads the team in goals scored and her six points have her tied for the team lead with her sister and defensive pair, Sara, who also had a four-point weekend (1g, 3a). Her goals-against average of 1.26 is sixth-best in the country. Rigsby has amassed 85 wins during her career, and needs only seven wins to pass Jessie Vetter for the top spot in school history.
 - Friday's game starts a six-game homestand for the Badgers, as following the St. Cloud State series UW will face Lindenwood on Oct.25-26 before wrapping the homestand with Ohio State on Nov. 2-3. The six-game homestand is tied for the longest in LaBahn Arena history, as the Badgers opened up their new barn last year with six straight at home.
 - Wisconsin ranks third in the country in scoring defense, allowing an average of 1.25 goals per game.
 - The Badgers are tied for seventh in scoring margin, outscoring opponents by an average of 1.00 goals per contest.
 - Wisconsin is tied for seventh nationally on the power-play, converting on its power-play chances 18.2% of the time.
 - The Badgers are 16-3-1 in LaBahn Arena. In UW's 20 regular season contests at its new arena, the Badgers have outscored opponents 65-25 and have posted six shutouts.
