Intrastate Rivalries Highlight Three Upcoming WCHA Weekend Series for October 25-26

Bemidji State Opens Conference Play by Hosting Streaking Minnesota ... Gophers in Midst of NCAA-Record 55-Game Winning Streak; Minnesota Duluth Visits Minnesota State; North Dakota Travels to St. Cloud State; Wisconsin Entertains Lindenwood in Friday-Saturday Non-Conference Set; WCHA Teams Stand 13-4-2 in 2013-14 Non-Conference Play; Four WCHA Teams Ranked in This Week's Top Ten with Gophers No. 1, Badgers No. 2, North Dakota No. 6, Buckeyes No. 10 ... UMD Also Receives Votes

MADISON, Wis. – Minnesota has established itself as the team to beat again in the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association after sweeping rivals Wisconsin and Minnesota Duluth in the first two weeks of the 2013-14 conference season. This weekend the two-time defending national champions take their NCAA-record 55-game winning streak to northern Minnesota for one of three WCHA series October 25-26.

The top-rated Golden Gophers (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 12 points) are the first conference opponent of the season for Bemidji State, who has gone 3-2-1 in six non-conference games. The two contests at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji, home of the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, get underway at 7:07 pm CT on Friday night and 4:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon.

Minnesota's Division 1-record 55-game winning streak dates back to February 17, 2012, when the Gophers were upended 2-1 in overtime at home against North Dakota. The streak includes the last eight consecutive games of 2011-12, all 41 games in 2012-13 and six so far in 2013-14. The

Gophers' have also compiled a record 32-game WCHA winning streak, with their last conference defeat occurring on February 19, 2011 when they fell 5-3 at North Dakota in the regular season finale.

In other league and intrastate rivalries this weekend Minnesota State (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) hosts Minnesota Duluth (2-3-1, 0-3-1 WCHA) at All Seasons Arena (750) in Mankato while St. Cloud State (0-4-2, 0-3-1-1 WCHA) plays its first WCHA games in the newly-renovated Herb Brooks National Hockey Center and welcomes North Dakota (4-1-1, 2-1-1-1 WCHA). The Mavericks, who were idle last week, take on the Bulldogs at 7:07 pm CT on Friday evening and 3:07 pm CT on Saturday afternoon. The two SCSU vs UND match ups will get underway at 7:07 pm CT Friday night and 3:07 pm CT Saturday.

In non-conference play this weekend, Wisconsin (4-2-0) hosts Lindenwood (0-7-1). Puck drops at LaBahn Arena (2273) in Madison are set for 7:07 pm CT Friday and 2:07 pm CT Saturday.

Minnesota heads into weekend play with 12 points in the league standings and tied with Wisconsin, but the unbeaten Gophers have two games in hand. North Dakota is in third place with eight points, one point better than Ohio State. St. Cloud is in fifth place with two points, one point ahead of Minnesota Duluth and two ahead of Minnesota State and Bemidji State.

In action last weekend (October 18-19), Wisconsin, turned back St. Cloud State in 4-1 and 6-0 conference wins in Madison. Blayre Turnbull had a five-point series and each UW goaltender scored a victory. All-American Alex Rigsby played last Friday when Katy Josephs had a hand in all four goals while Ann-Renée Desbiens made her debut in nets and earned the shutout last Saturday.

In Duluth, Minnesota kept its record winning streak alive, adding 4-0 and 6-3 wins over host Minnesota Duluth to the ledger. Amanda Leveille made 26 saves and Meghan Lorence had one goal and an assist in last Friday's shutout, and senior Sarah Davis and freshman Dani Cameranesi each scored three goals in the series. After dominating the intrastate rivalry in the first years of the women's WCHA, the Bulldogs are now 24-38-6 against the Gophers all-time and have not triumphed over Minnesota since Jan. 13, 2012 (a 4-2 UMD win). The Bulldogs are 15-15-2 all-time against the Gophers in Duluth.

In Grand Forks last Friday and Saturday, North Dakota split with Ohio State. North Dakota won the series opener 5-2 and posted a program-best 4-0-1 start to the season. UND freshman Halli Krzyzaniak scored her first goal and added an assist. But visiting Ohio State made the celebration short-lived. Senior

goaltender Lisa Steffes made 36 saves, including 27 over the last two periods, in her first start of the season and the Buckeyes took a 2-1 victory behind first period goals by Kendall Curtis and Taylor Kuehl.

Overall this season, Western Collegiate Hockey Association member teams have gone 13-4-2 (.737) in 19 non-conference games and Bemidji State added to that winning percentage by prevailing in a pair of Oct. 18-19 games at home against Lindenwood. Beavers' freshman goalie Brittni Mowat recorded her first collegiate shutout Friday in the 5-0 victory and turned away 33 shots. She allowed just one goal in the series as BSU took a 4-1 decision Saturday. Hanna Moher and Kaitlyn Tougas scored shorthanded goals :35 seconds apart to secure Bemidji State's first sweep since Feb. 17-18, 2012.

A look at the first weekend of on-ice competition in November finds all eight WCHA-member teams playing two-game conference series. On Friday (November 1) and Saturday (November 2), Bemidji State hosts North Dakota, Minnesota Duluth welcomes St. Cloud State and Minnesota and Minnesota State play a home-and-home set. On Saturday and Sunday (November 3), Wisconsin hosts Ohio State.

2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji Next March

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association will take one of the showcases in women's hockey to northern Minnesota next season.

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be held at the Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minn. on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8, as announced by WCHA women's commissioner Sara Martin on June 18, 2013.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

In the 13 years of NCAA-sponsored women's national championships, Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams

have won all 13 titles – Minnesota Duluth has five while Minnesota and Wisconsin each have four. Minnesota also won the first AWCHA Women's Division 1 title in 2000.

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA playoff championships and last two NCAA titles. The Gophers beat North Dakota, 2-0, to win the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF in Minneapolis.

All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series Feb. 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners from that weekend will play for the conference playoff championship with the semifinals on Friday, March 7. Friday's two winners will then play for the tournament championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey Tournament.

Ticket information for the 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be announced at a later date.

Located on the south shore of Lake Bemidji, the Sanford Center provides the people of northern Minnesota with a signature sports and entertainment facility. The home of Bemidji State men's and women's hockey, the facility has enabled Bemidji to attract a variety of civic, convention and entertainment events and enhance its position as a regional center for northern Minnesota.

The Sanford Center encompasses approximately 185,000 square feet and include all amenities required to host concerts, family shows, trade shows and community events. It has also been designed as an elite Division 1 hockey facility, providing the BSU programs with one of the finest home venues in the nation.

The arena seats 4,373 around a 200'x85' ice sheet for hockey and can be reconfigured to accommodate approximately 6,000 guests for concerts and trade shows. Seating includes a club level and 26 luxury suites, and all areas of the arena have access to full-featured concessions areas. The building also includes convention facilities, featuring a 10,000-square-foot dividable ballroom and 4,000 square feet of meeting space. WCHA Team Notebooks



Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Beavers (3-2-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) open 2013-14 WCHA play with two games against defending national champion Minnesota Friday and Saturday at the Sanford Center.
- The Golden Gophers have a 54-4-6 record against the Beavers all-time. Last season (2012-13), Minnesota won all six meetings between the two schools including two victories over the Beavers in the WCHA playoffs. The last win for BSU in the series came on Oct. 29, 2011 at home by a 2-1 score.
- Bemidji State won two non-conference games at home last weekend and improved to 4-0-1 all-time against Lindenwood University with its sweep.
- BSU's nine-goal output in the series against Lindenwood on Oct. 18-19 was more than it had in the previous four games combined (five).
- Goaltender Brittni Mowat recorded her first collegiate shutout last Friday in the 5-0 win over Lindenwood. Mowat turned away 33 shots and allowed just one goal last weekend.
- The two-game sweep over Lindenwood on Oct. 18-19 was the first sweep for the Beavers since a pair of victories over St. Cloud State on Feb. 17-18, 2012.
- Sophomore forward Hanna Moher recorded two goals in one of the victories against Lindenwood. It was the first two-goal game for a BSU skater since sophomore Kaitlyn Tougas accomplished it in a game against Minnesota on Feb. 16, 2013.
- Bemidji State had a pair of two-assist performances last weekend as Alex Citrowske and Ivana Bilic each accomplished the feat. It was the first two-assist game for a BSU player since Sadie Lundquist had two helpers in a Feb. 8, 2013 contest at North Dakota.
- After going all of last season without any shorthanded goals, the Beavers had two in last Saturday's 4-1 win over Lindenwood when Moher and Tougas scored shorthanded goals just :35 seconds apart.
- The Beavers have had nine different players score a goal this season including three newcomers.
- 13 different Bemidji State players have registered points in six games this season.



Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1 Golden Gophers (6-0-0, 4-0-0 WCHA, 12 points) remained perfect on the season with a series sweep over No. 7 Minnesota Duluth last weekend. The Gophers topped the Bulldogs, 4-0 and 6-3, to extend their NCAA-record winning streak to 55 games.
- Eleven Gophers recorded points, including nine players with multiple points, in the series against the Bulldogs. Freshman Dani Cameranesi led Minnesota with four points (3g, 1a). Three Gophers had three-point series in junior Rachael Bona (1g, 2a), senior Sarah Davis (3g) and senior Kelly Terry (1g, 2a).
- Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille played both games in net for Minnesota at UMD, combining for 53 saves. She made 26 saves in last Friday's shutout before stopping 27 shots in Saturday's win. Leveille posted 176:30 scoreless minutes in four games from Oct. 11-19, including 48:57 (Oct. 11), 60:00 (Oct. 12), 60:00 (Oct. 18) and 7:33 (Oct. 19).
- Last Friday, Minnesota recorded its second-straight shutout with a 4-0 win over the Bulldogs after topping Wisconsin, 2-0, in its previous game. All three lines contributed to the scoring, led by junior Meghan Lorence's two points (1g, 1a). Last Saturday's 6-3 win at UMD saw eight Gophers record points, including seven multi-point efforts. Cameranesi had two goals and one assist, while Terry scored once and tallied two helpers. Davis (2g), Bona (2a), sophomore Hannah Brandt (2a), freshman Kelsey Cline (2a) and sophomore Maryanne Menefee (1g, 1a) each had two points. Freshman defenseman Megan Wolfe tallied her first two career points with a pair of assists against the Bulldogs.
- Minnesota (6-0-0) and Cornell (2-0-0) are the only teams with perfect records intact this season.
- The Gophers travel to Bemidji State this weekend. Puck drop is 7:07 pm Friday and 4:07 pm Saturday at Sanford Center. Minnesota is 54-4-6 all-time against Bemidji State. The Gophers swept BSU in three series last season, including the first round of the WCHA playoffs. UM is 8-1-1 in the last 10 meetings with BSU.
- Leveille ranks sixth in the nation and second in the WCHA with a .952 save percentage and a 1.34 goals-against average. She is the WCHA's only goalie with a perfect 1.000 winning percentage.
- The Gophers have the nation's second-best offense, averaging 4.17 goals per game. Minnesota has allowed 1.33 goals per game in six games, good for fifth in the NCAA.
- Bona is tied for the league lead with 1.67 points per game, 0.83 goals per game and two game-winning goals, and Brandt leads the WCHA with 1.33 assists per game.
- Cameranesi is on a team-best three-game point streak (3g, 3a).

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Bulldogs (2-3-1, 0-3-1 WCHA) were swept over the weekend at AMSOIL Arena by No. 1 Minnesota by scores of 4-0 and 6-3. The Bulldogs are now 24-38-6 against the Gophers all-time and have not triumphed over Minnesota since Jan. 13, 2012 (a 4-2 UMD win). The Bulldogs are 15-15-2 all-time against the Gophers in Duluth.
- After being shut out last Friday, seven UMD players notched a point Saturday night, including two by junior winger Jenna McParland, who picked up a goal and an assist.
- The Bulldogs were called for nine penalties in Saturday but were almost even with Minnesota in shots (37-30).
- The Bulldogs surrendered three power-play goals last Saturday, their first power-play goals surrendered in six games. UMD now ranks No. 6 in penalty-kill in the NCAA with a 90.3% success rate.
- With a goals per game average of 3.67, UMD also ranks No. 6 in the NCAA in scoring.
- Lara Stalder still leads the Bulldogs in scoring despite being held scoreless in both outings this past weekend, owning nine points (2g, 7a) in six games. Jenna McParland rings in second with eight points on a team-high five goals and three helpers. Stalder remains the No. 2 scoring rookie in the nation with a 1.50 points per game average and sits sixth among all defenseman in points. McParland and Stalder each have had three games with two or more points and has twice recorded three points in an outing.
- UMD heads to Mankato to face Minnesota State this weekend. The Bulldogs are 49-7-1 all-time against the Mavericks, but went just 1-2-1 against MSU in 2012-13. Last season the Bulldogs outshot the Mavericks 134-93, but scored the same amount of goals – eight – in four skates. In their last match-up on Feb. 10, UMD secured a 4-2 triumph with two goals by then junior Brienna Gillanders.



Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA), idle last weekend, host Minnesota Duluth at All Seasons Arena Oct. 25 and 26. Minnesota State finished 2-1-1 against the Bulldogs a year ago with a 3-3 draw and 1-0 victory in Mankato. MSU and UMD were dead-even with eight goals each in the four contests a year ago.
- The Mavs evened their overall ledger with a sweep of host Lindenwood on Oct. 11-12.
- Minnesota State ranks second nationally in combined special teams (61.8%), while owning the fourth-best power-play (26.1%) and 13th-ranked penalty-kill (87.5%).
- Junior Kathleen Rogan registered a team-best five points off two goals and three assists in the Oct. 11-12 series at Lindenwood as she factored on all four MSU power-play goals with one marker and a trio of first assists. The Vancouver, B.C., native also scored both game-winners in the series bringing her season goal total to four, a team-best. Rogan's 4-3=7 this season ties her for fourth in the conference in points and first in goals, in addition to tying for the league-lead in power-play points (5), power-play goals (2) and game-winning goals (2).
- Seniors Nicole Germaine and Lauren Barnes continued their strong starts to the 2013-14 campaign as both posted three points in the series-opening win at Lindenwood on Oct. 11. Barnes used two power-play goals to set a new career-high for goals in a game, while Germaine's goal and two assists matched a career-best. Each piece of the senior duo has 17 shots and produced 2-4=6 through six games to tie for second on the squad in scoring.
- Seniors Kari Lundberg and Tracy McCann posted team-best +4 ratings on Oct. 11-12. Lundberg tallied goals in both contests and a pair of helpers in the series finale for 2-2=4 on the weekend along with a team-high 11 shots, while McCann recorded a goal and two assists in the Saturday victory.
- Junior Shelby Moteyunas continues to pace all Maverick blueliners in points after a pair of assists on Oct. 11 to elevate her season total to 1-3=4. Fellow defender and freshman Anna Fiegert earned her second career point in the 7-1 rout as well and finished the weekend with a +3 rating.

- No. 6 North Dakota (4-1-1, 2-1-1-1 WCHA, 8 points) heads out on its first road trip of the season, taking on St. Cloud State Friday and Saturday, Oct. 25-26. Friday's game will begin at 7:07 pm while Saturday's will start at 3:07 pm.
- After posting a program-best 4-0-1 start to the season, UND dropped its first contest of the season, losing 2-1 to Ohio State on Oct. 19. UND won the opening game of the series 5-2. North Dakota used a hot start to claim a 3-0 lead over OSU within the first 9:00 of the first game. Tanja Eisenschmid opened the scoring :59 seconds into the start of the game. Halli Krzyzaniak and Andrea Dalen both provided power-play goals to give UND a commanding lead. Ohio State battled back in the second period, scoring two of its own power-play goals, cutting UND's lead to just one. Fortunately, North Dakota played a strong third period and scored two goals in final seven minutes to take back its three-goal lead and claim a 5-2 win. Michelle Karvinen and Becca Kohler scored the two insurance goals. Both Ohio State and North Dakota went 2-2 on the power-play, without a single successful penalty-kill. - North Dakota's freshmen have accounted for 22 points (5g, 17a) so far this season. The class leads the nation in freshman scoring. Susanna Tapani leads the North Dakota freshman class with two goals and six assists. UND's freshmen accounted for 13 points (2g, 11a) during the opening weekend against Lindenwood, Oct. 4-5.



Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The No. 10 Buckeyes (2-1-0-1, 3-1-1 WCHA, 7 points) enter their first bye week of the season after splitting a series at North Dakota on Oct. 18-19.
- The Buckeyes fought back from an early three-goal deficit last Friday night in Grand Forks to make it 3-2 after two periods but eventually fell 5-2. Sophomore Julia McKinnon scored her first goal of the season in the loss. Junior Sara Schmitt scored the other OSU goal. Both came while on the power-play.
- Ohio State picked up a 2-1 victory over host North Dakota last Saturday night, getting a 36-save performance out of senior goaltender Lisa Steffes in her first start of the season. Steffes finished the game with a .973 save percentage and held UND to 1-of-7 on the PP in a game OSU was outshot 37-18. Sophomore Kendall Curtis scored her third goal in five games this season after not scoring a goal last season. Junior Taylor Kuehl also scored her third of the season, tying her with Curtis and junior Kari Schmitt for the team lead in goals scored.
- Sara Schmitt has a team-leading nine points. Schmitt leads the WCHA in points-per-game (1.80), assists-per-game (1.40) and PP points-per-game (1.00). She also leads the league in defensemen scoring while Kari Schmitt is third with seven points. Sara and Kari Schmitt sit nine and ten, respectively, on the Ohio State all-time list of defensemen scoring.
- Taylor Kuehl's game-winner at UND last Saturday was the second of the season and ties her for the league lead.
- Ohio State is 6-of-20 on power-play this season and has the top PP percentage in the league (30.0%).
- OSU is ranked No. 10 in this week's USCHO.com poll, the second week of the season cracking the Top 10. The Buckeyes were featured in at least one of the two national polls last season in 11 different weeks.
- Ohio State is 2-1-0 away from home this season with all games coming against nationally-ranked opponents.

- The No. 2 Badgers (4-2-0, 4-2-0 WCHA, 12 points) play a non-conference series against Lindenwood Friday and Saturday at LaBahn Arena. The Badgers lead the series with the Lady Lions 4-0-0, with 40 goals in the four games. Lindenwood played their first-ever NCAA D1 game against UW on Sept. 23, 2011, losing 11-0.
- The Badgers are coming off two convincing league wins against St. Cloud State last weekend at LaBahn Arena. In Friday's tilt against the Huskies, Katy Josephs tallied four points as the Badgers won 4-1. Freshman netminder Ann-Renee Desbiens made her UW debut last Saturday, and posted a shutout as the Badgers earned a 6-0 triumph.
- The Badgers have one of the nation's best defenses, allowing an average of 1.00 goals per contest – second in the country.
- Wisconsin has moved up to No. 2 in the USCHO.com Poll, its highest ranking in the poll since the beginning of the 2012-13 season.
- Senior goaltender Alex Rigsby ranks fifth in the country in save percentage with a .953 clip and fifth in goals allowed allowing an average of 1.21 goals per game.
