(2273) on Friday, Dec. 6 at 2:07 pm CT and Sunday, Dec. 8 at 2:07 pm CT. The No. 2-ranked Badgers' unbeaten string has put them on the heels of two-time defending champion and league-leading Minnesota which finishes up the 2013 part of its 28-game league schedule with games at Ohio State Dec. 7-8.

The No. 1-ranked Golden Gophers (17-1-0, 11-1-0 WCHA) and host Buckeyes (5-9-2, 2-8-2 WCHA) play this Saturday and Sunday at the OSU Ice Rink (800) in Columbus, with puck drops set for 6:07 pm ET and 12:07 pm ET, respectively.

In the one other WCHA series, Minnesota State (5-9-0, 2-8-0 WCHA) travels to St. Cloud State (2-11-3, 1-7-2-1 WCHA) for Friday and Saturday encounters. Game times at Herb Brooks National Hockey Center are at 7:07 pm CT for game one and 3:07 pm CT for game two.

Two WCHA clubs, North Dakota and Minnesota Duluth, will play outside the conference this weekend. No. 4-ranked North Dakota (9-3-2) skates at ECAC Hockey-member and No. 6-ranked Clarkson (12-3-2) on Friday afternoon at 3:00 pm ET and Saturday afternoon at 3:00 pm ET. Minnesota Duluth (7-6-3), meanwhile, goes up against host and No. 9-ranked Boston University (11-3-1) of the Hockey East Association at 5:00 pm ET on Dec. 6 and 3:00 pm ET on Dec. 7.

So far this season, WCHA-member teams have combined for a 24-8-2 record and .735 winning percentage in 34 non-conference games. WCHA teams are 11-4-1 (.719) vs College Hockey America opponents, 6-3-1 (.650) vs ECAC Hockey teams, and 7-1-0 (.875) vs members of the Hockey East Association. WCHA teams are also 10-0-1 on the road in non-conference match ups.

This week's Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings show that Minnesota (17-1-0, 11-1-0-0 WCHA, 33 points) continues to lead the league but Wisconsin (12-2-2, 8-2-2-1 WCHA, 27 points) has supplanted North Dakota (9-3-2, 7-3-2-1 WCHA, 24 points) in second place. Minnesota Duluth (7-6-3, 5-6-3-2 WCHA, 20 points) is in fourth place, six points ahead of fifth place Bemidji State (7-7-2, 4-5-1-1 WCHA, 14 points). Ohio State (5-9-2, 2-8-2-0 WCHA, 8 points) stands alone in sixth while St. Cloud State (2-11-3, 1-7-2-1 WCHA,

Last weekend, Wisconsin took four of six points at Minnesota Duluth in the only league matchup over Thanksgiving. The Badgers rallied to earn a 2-2 (ot) tie with UMD last Friday. Demi Crossman and Jamie Kenyon scored for the Bulldogs and Courtney Burke and Madison Packer had the UW goals. After a scoreless overtime, the Bulldogs' Meghan Huertas got the only goal in the shootout so UMD earned the extra league point. On Saturday, Wisconsin got a scare when all-American goalie Alex Rigsby was knocked from a scoreless game with an apparent leg injury. Freshman Ann-Renée Desbiens came on, completed a 1-0 shutout, and Karley Sylvester scored the game's only goal early in the final period.

In non-conference play over the holiday weekend, Minnesota rolled over Princeton 6-0 and 9-1 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. In last Saturday's win, freshman Dani Cameranesi led the way with three points (2g, 1a). Five Gophers put up multiple points in the victory and 12 Minnesota players had at least one point. Sophomore goaltender Amanda Leveille made 11 saves in her fifth shutout of the season as the Gophers out-shot the Tigers, 48-11. Nine different Gophers then scored goals as Minnesota cruised to a 9-1 win over Princeton last Sunday. Senior Sarah Davis joined Kelly Terry and Hannah Brandt with three points (each had one goal and two assists).

St. Cloud State had the edge in shots on goal, but Rensselaer beat the Huskies twice – 4-1 and 2-1 victories – in St. Cloud.

Ohio State won two of three games last week. The Buckeyes lost to Robert Morris, 2-1 on home ice last Tuesday (Nov. 26), to run its winless streak to nine games. But OSU bounced back on the road last Saturday and Sunday at New Hampshire, getting 3-2 and 2-0 victories. It marked the first time this season the Buckeyes won back-to-back games. Senior goaltender Lisa Steffes started both games for the Buckeyes, making 23 saves Saturday and 21 on Sunday. Sophomore Kendall Curtis and junior Danielle Gagne had

the game-winning scores on Saturday and Sunday, respectively. Sophomore Julia McKinnon finished with three points in the series.

Three WCHA-member teams – Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State and North Dakota – also played five exhibition games last week, going 2-2-1 against a touring Russian national team. UMD started the Russians’ tour by handing them an 8-0 loss in Duluth on Nov. 26. The Russians, who are preparing for the Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia in February, beat Bemidji State 5-4 in Bemidji the next night and then went to North Dakota for the weekend. UND tied the Russians 3-3 on Nov. 29 and took a 2-0 decision the next day. The Team Russia tour then ended where it started when they defeated host Minnesota Duluth 5-2 on Monday, Dec. 2.

Looking forward to the second week of December, there are two league series on the docket in what will be the final WCHA games prior to the new year. On Friday and Saturday, Dec. 13-14, St. Cloud State will host Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State will entertain North Dakota. Bemidji State, Minnesota, Ohio State and Wisconsin will all be idle.

## Minnesota’s Amazing NCAA-Record Winning Streak Reached an Amazing 62 Games

Coach Brad Frost’s Minnesota Golden Gophers stretched their NCAA Division 1 hockey record winning streak to 62 games before falling by a single goal – 3-2 – to North Dakota on Sunday, November 17.

The record winning streak, which included back-to-back NCAA Women’s Frozen Four championships, dated back to Feb. 17, 2012, when the Gophers were upended 2-1 in overtime at home against North Dakota. The streak included the last eight games of 2011-12, all 41 games in 2012-13 and 13 more to launch the 2013-14 campaign. The Gophers’ also compiled a record 39-game WCHA winning streak before being upended last Sunday, with their last previous conference defeat occurring Feb. 19, 2011 when they fell 5-3 at UND in the regular season finale.

“For everybody who has been a part of it, it’s been a really special thing,” said Frost of the winning streak. “I think they helped grow the game of women’s hockey here in Minnesota and nation-wide, and that’s a huge testament to them. There was a lot of pressure, a lot of media attention and a lot of excitement every time we stepped on the ice, which was great, but it’s over, and we’re happy to have been a part of it.”



Minnesota's 62-game winning streak toppled the previous NCAA Div. 1 women's hockey winning streak of 21 games set by Harvard and the Div. 1 women's unbeaten streak of 32 games set twice by Wisconsin. It also topped the NCAA Div. 1 men's hockey winning streak of 30 games held jointly by Rensselaer and Cornell and men's hockey unbeaten streak of 38 straight games set by Rensselaer.

## 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championship Headed to Sanford Center in Bemidji March 7-8

The 2014 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, the playoff championship for the women's league, will be held at Sanford Center in Bemidji, Minnesota on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8.

Bemidji will be the seventh city to host this event in the 15-year history of the WCHA playoff championships. It has been held four of the last five years at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis.

"We are happy that the WCHA will get to take the excitement of our post-season tournament to a new venue," said commissioner Sara Martin, who added that Bemidji State University officials are helping in the planning of the event. "The Sanford Center is a beautiful facility and great spot to show off the skills of our players."

Minnesota has won the last two WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF championships as well as the last two NCAA Frozen Four titles. All eight WCHA-member teams will play best-of-three playoff series February 28-March 2 at the site of the higher-seeded team. The four winners will then play for the conference playoff championship at the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, with two semifinals on Friday, March 7 and the championship on Saturday, March 8. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Women's Hockey Tournament.

## WCHA Team Notebooks



### Beavers Bemidji State University

- The Bemidji State Beavers (7-7-2, 4-5-1-1 WCHA, 14 points), idle last weekend, travel to Madison to face No. 2-ranked Wisconsin in a two-game league series Dec. 6 & 8.
- The Badgers lead the all-time series against Bemidji State 51-4-3, and have a 22-2-1 record against the Beavers in Madison.
- BSU spoiled opening night at UW's LaBahn Arena last year beating the Badgers 1-0 on Oct. 19, and the two teams tied 3-3 in the series finale on Oct. 21. The Badgers went on to sweep the Beavers in Bemidji on Feb. 22 (2-0) and Feb. 23 (3-1).
- Bemidji State lost in overtime to the Russian National Team, 5-4, in an exhibition contest last Wednesday (Nov. 27). The Beavers are now 9-4-2 all-time in exhibitions games.
- The Beavers have earned conference points in four straight WCHA series, which is the first time they have achieved that since the 2011-12 season.
- BSU is fifth in the WCHA standings, which is the highest it has been in the conference standings since 2011-12.
- Bemidji State's Brittini Mowat continues to be one of the top freshmen goaltenders in the country. She is currently second in the nation among freshman goaltenders in both save percentage (.930) and goals-against average (2.10). Mowat's seven wins this season are two shy of tying the BSU record for most wins by a freshman goaltender, which was set during the 1999-2000 season by Bre Dedrickson (9).
- BSU's sophomore class has accounted for the bulk of the Beavers' scoring this season. BSU's eight second-year players have posted 17 goals (52%) and 21 assists (44%) for 38 points, or 46%, of the team's 82 points (33g, 49a).
- After finishing last in the WCHA last season on the power-play, BSU has seen improvement in that area as it has scored a power-play goal in seven of its last eight games.
- Bemidji State has the third best penalty-killing unit in conference games this season behind Wisconsin and Minnesota (33-of-37 attempts, .892).
- The Beavers have the fourth best winning percentage on the road this season among WCHA schools (67%).
- This week BSU will head to Madison as it takes on No. 2 Wisconsin. The series finale will be played on Sunday, Dec. 8 and it will be the first Sunday the Beavers will be in action this season. BSU went 0-3-1 in 2012-13 in games played Sunday.



### Golden Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 1 Golden Gophers (17-1-0, 11-1-0 WCHA, 33 points) improved to 6-0 in non-conference play with a sweep over visiting Princeton last weekend. The Gophers skated to 6-0 and 9-1 victories.
- Hannah Brandt (2g, 3a) and Kelly Terry (2g, 3a) led the Gophers against the Tigers. Ten different Gophers scored goals in the series. All six defensemen and everyone on Minnesota's top three lines had at least one point against Princeton. The Gophers' 15 goals in the series was the highest output of the season.
- In last Saturday's 6-0 win, freshman Dani Cameranesi led the way with three points (2g, 1a). Five Gophers put up multiple points and 12 players had at least one point. Sophomore G Amanda Leveille made 11 saves in her fifth shutout of the season as the Gophers out-shot the Tigers, 48-11. Nine different Gophers then scored goals as UM cruised to a 9-1 win over Princeton last Sunday. Led by three players with three-point efforts, eight players had multiple points in Minnesota's 17th win. Senior Sarah Davis joined Terry and Brandt with three points as each recorded one goal and two assists. Leveille made 11 saves over the first two periods before junior Shyler Sletta made eight in the third.
- The Gophers have out-scored their opponents a combined 11-0 in the first period of their last four games.
- Minnesota has won its last 21 non-conference games. The Gophers' last non-conference loss was a 4-1 decision at Boston College in the 2011 NCAA Regional.
- This week, Minnesota travels to Ohio State for its final series of 2013. The Gophers face-off against the WCHA-rival Buckeyes at 5:07 pm CT on Dec. 7 and 11:07 am CT on Dec. 8. The Gophers are then off until Jan. 10-11, 2014, when they host the Buckeyes at Ridder Arena.
- Minnesota owns a 55-8-1 all-time mark vs Ohio State. The last meeting between the two teams was a 5-0 Gopher win in the semifinals of the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. The Gophers have won the last 26 meetings. The first match-up was a 3-0 UM win at OSU on 11/12/99.
- Davis enters this week's series on a 10-game point streak (6g, 12a).
- Four Gophers have cracked the 20-point mark through 18 games this season, led by Brandt's 29 points (9g, 20a). Rachael Bona is second with 27 points (8g, 19a), and Terry (12g, 12a) and Davis (10g, 14a) each have 24. Brandt leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation in total points (29), points per game (1.61) and assists per game (1.11). She leads the nation with 20 assists.
- Leveille is second in the league with a 1.31 goals-against average (fifth in the nation) and a .943 save percentage (sixth in the nation). She leads the WCHA with five shutouts.
- UM is the second-least penalized team in the nation, averaging 7.1 penalty minutes per game. Over the last three games, the Gophers have taken just five penalties (10 min) and averaged 3.3 PIM/game.
- The Gophers lead the nation with a +3.39 scoring margin, led by the NCAA's top offense averaging 4.67 goals per game.
- Minnesota has the nation's fifth-best defense, allowing 1.28 goals per game in 18 games.

### Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The Bulldogs (7-6-3, 5-6-3-2 WCHA, 20 points) picked up two WCHA points on the weekend against No. 2 Wisconsin with a tie and a shootout win Friday and a 1-0 loss Saturday.
- UMD's two goals vs Wisconsin came from rookie Demi Crossman, who had a tip to secure the first score of the game, and senior winger Jamie Kenyon who netted her seventh goal of the season. Junior winger Meghan Huertas struck for the only score in the shootout and Kayla Black turned away all three Badgers shooters and had 35 saves on the evening to help pick up the two WCHA points.
- Last Saturday night the Bulldogs put 28 shots on net, including 10 in the third period, but could not solve either Wisconsin goaltender in the skate. Black made 31 saves in the loss and Huertas had a team-high five shots.
- Last Friday's game was the 22nd overtime skate between the two programs, and the Bulldogs are 29-29-11 all-time against the Badgers.
- UMD faced Team Russia last Tuesday, beating the Russians 8-0 on two goals apiece from Jamie Kenyon and Huertas.
- Jenna McParland leads UMD with 16 points (7g, 9a), while Kenyon checks in with 15 (7g, 8a).
- Rookie blueliner Lara Stalder owns 14 points on four goals and 10 assists.
- Freshman Bailey Wright missed both games in the Wisconsin series last weekend and the exhibition Monday, where the Russians concluded their tour with a 5-2 victory over the Bulldogs.
- Minnesota Duluth will step out of WCHA play this weekend to face No. 9 Boston University in Boston on Friday and Saturday. All-time, the Bulldogs are 19-4-2 against Hockey East Association opponents and swept Connecticut in the first series of the season 7-0 and 6-1. Last year UMD came up with two ties against the Terriers, a 2-2 overtime tie at AMSOIL on Dec. 8 and a 0-0 overtime tie on Dec. 9.



### Mavericks Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks (5-9-0, 2-8-0 WCHA, 6 points) moved into a tie for seventh place in the WCHA by sweeping visiting Ohio State by margins of 4-1 and 2-1 two weeks ago at All Seasons Arena. The sweep was the Mavericks first over the Buckeyes since Nov. 12-13, 2010, and their first at home since Nov. 9-10, 2007. MSU claimed a 4-1 victory in series opener (Nov. 22) behind three third-period goals from three different seniors in Kelsie Scott, Kari Lundberg, and Nicole Germaine. The series finale (Nov. 23) saw Ohio State jump out to a 1-0 first-period lead, before the Mavericks responded with a single goal in the second and third periods to secure the sweep.
- MSU's power-play unit converted 2-of-5 chances vs OSU with markers from Scott and junior Kathleen Rogan. Meanwhile, the Maverick penalty-kill also had an improved showing, denying the Buckeyes on two-of-eleven power-play chances in the series. The Purple and Gold power-play catapulted to sixth in the country with a 20.4% (11/54) efficiency led by Rogan's five PPGs which are tied for first in the country. Rogan's 5-4=9 on the man-advantage to date are tied for first in the league in power-play production.
- Senior netminder Danielle Butters had 79 saves, a 1.00 goals-against average, and a .975 save percentage against OSU in the team's last action, while racking up double-digit saves in all six periods. She continues to rank second nationally in saves (449) and stands ninth in minutes played (822:12).
- Lundberg, Germaine, and Tracy McCann all 1-1=2 in the OSU series with McCann's marking the game-winner in the first contest. Lundberg's 5-5=10 this season have already matched her point total from a year ago as she is riding a four-game point scoring streak totaling 2-2=4 in the process. Germaine's 4-6=10 to date give her a new career-high for points in a season. McCann and Rogan are tied with Ryann Geldner for 10th all-time in scoring at Minnesota State having generated 30-30=60 and 31-29=60, respectively, while Lundberg's 17-26=43 in her career bring her within one point of cracking the top-25.
- Freshman Savannah Quandt scored her first career goal vs OSU. Quandt is also the first Mankato native to ever play for the Mavericks and earned WCHA Rookie of the Week accolades.
- Senior Lauren Barnes has moved from center back to defense for MSU, where she played a year ago, and tallied her team-leading seventh assist in the Friday game vs. OSU. Fellow blue-liner junior Shelby Moteyunas continues to pace all qualified MSU defensemen with 1-6=7.
- Minnesota State hopes to feature three Olympians in the upcoming 2014 Sochi Winter Olympic Games. Alumni Emilia Andersson and Nina Tikkinen are both strong candidates to make the Swedish and Finnish National Teams, respectively, while freshman Anna Fiegert hopes to make the German National Team.
- The Mavericks return to conference action to challenge rival St. Cloud State Friday at 7:07 pm and Saturday at 3:07 pm at Herb Brooks National Hockey Center. MSU stands 27-28-6 all-time vs the Huskies after going 1-2-1 against SCSU a year ago.

### University of North Dakota

- No. 4 North Dakota (9-3-2, 7-3-2-1 WCHA, 24 points) travels to Potsdam, N.Y., this weekend, Dec. 6-7, for a non-conference series against No. 6 Clarkson. Both games will be played at 2 pm CT.
- North Dakota took a break from the norm, hosting the Russian Women's National Team for a pair of exhibition games over the Thanksgiving break. After a sluggish first two periods in last Friday's contest, North Dakota battled back to force a 3-3 tie. Becca Kohler scored twice on the power-play to give UND the tie. Freshman goaltender Lexie Shaw made 31 saves for a shutout in the series finale. Halli Krzyzaniak provided the game-winner while on the power-play, and Josefine Jakobsen scored unassisted for the insurance goal.
- Before the series against Team Russia, UND hosted No. 2 Wisconsin, Nov. 22-23. UND ran into a stifling Wisconsin defense, playing the Badgers to a scoreless tie on Nov. 22, before dropping a 3-1 decision on Nov. 23. Michelle Karvinen scored the lone UND goal of the weekend, finishing off a string of passes from Amy Menke and Meghan Dufault on the power play. Shelby Amsley-Benzie recorded her first shutout of the season in the scoreless tie, making 21 saves, including 12 in the third period and overtime combined.
- With a record of 9-3-2 (.714), North Dakota is enjoying its best start through 14 games in program history. The previous record through 14 games was set in 2011-12 when UND started 9-4-1 (.679).
- 19-of-20 skaters that have seen action this year have recorded points. Additionally, 17 skaters have recorded at least one goal this season.
- North Dakota's D-corps has created 12 goals and 21 assists. The 33 points is 10th in the nation for most points by a team's defense. Additionally, the UND defense is third the nation in goals (12) and is sixth in shots on goal with 156 (11.14 per game). Gracen Hirschy is 17th among defensemen in the nation with 40 shots on goal, and Halli Krzyzaniak is 21st with 35 shots on goal. Hirschy is sixth among the nation's defensemen with a +15 plus/minus rating. Sam LaShomb is tied for 11th with a +11 rating while, Krzyzaniak is tied for 17th with a +9 rating.
- UND's freshmen have accounted for 41 points (13g, 28a) this season. The class leads the nation in freshman assists (28) and shots on goal (187), and is second in the nation in points (41) and power-play points (14). Susanna Tapani leads the UND class with 4-9=13. Her 13 points ranks sixth in the nation among freshmen, while her nine assists ranks fifth. Hirschy is second among the nation's freshmen with a +15 plus/minus rating. Krzyzaniak is tied for 13th with a +9 rating. UND's freshmen accounted for 13 points (2g, 11a) during the season-opening weekend against Lindenwood.
- North Dakota has the second-best scoring margin in the third period among all teams in the nation, with a +0.86 margin. UND has scored a total of 16 third-period goals, tied for 11th-most in the nation, while the four third-period goals is the fewest in the country.



### Buckeyes Ohio State University

- The Buckeyes (5-9-2, 2-8-2-1 WCHA, 8 points) earned their first series sweep of the season this past weekend at non-conference New Hampshire. The Buckeyes edged UNH 3-2 last Saturday and finished the sweep with a 2-0 shutout performance on Sunday. It marked the first time this season the Buckeyes won back-to-back games.
- Senior goaltender Lisa Steffes started both games for the Buckeyes at UNH, making 23 saves Saturday and 21 saves Sunday. It was the first shutout for an Ohio State goaltender this season.
- Sophomore Kendall Curtis and junior Danielle Gagne had the game-winning scores at New Hampshire on Saturday and Sunday, respectively.
- Sophomores Julia McKinnon and Melani Moylan, as well as freshman Claudia Kepler, all scored goals for OSU in the UNH series. McKinnon finished with three points over the weekend while Moylan had two.
- Steffes and the Buckeyes' penalty-kill held the host Wildcats scoreless on all six of their power-play chances in the series. Ohio State's penalty-kill is 53-of-63 this season, an 84.1% success rate.
- Steffes is posting career bests in goals-against average (1.61) and save percentage (.942).
- Kari and Sara Schmitt each had an assist in the UNH series. Sara has a team-leading 13 points on four goals and nine assists while Kari is right behind with 12 points on four goals and eight assists.
- Senior Ally Tarr picked up her ninth assist of the season last Saturday. Tarr is tied with Sara Schmitt for the team lead.
- The Buckeyes dropped a non-conference game last Tuesday at the OSU Ice Rink. OSU fell to Robert Morris by a score of 2-1. The lone goal for OSU came off the stick of Kepler. Steffes stopped 24 shots in the loss.
- Four Buckeyes share the team lead in goals scored with four including Curtis, Kepler and Kari and Sara Schmitt.
- Ohio State plays host to league-leading Minnesota at the OSU Ice Rink Dec. 7-8. The Buckeyes and Gophers are set to play at 6:07 pm ET Saturday and 12:07 pm ET Sunday. OSU and Minnesota have not met since last season's WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. The Buckeyes are 8-55-1 all-time against Minnesota.
- Following its series with Minnesota, Ohio State will be off until Jan. 3-4, 2014, when they host Penn State at the OSU Ice Rink.

### Huskies St. Cloud State University

- The Huskies (2-11-3, 1-7-2-1 WCHA, 6 points) were back in action last weekend after being off for a week and started an eight game home stint playing host to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. RPI took both games against the Huskies, winning 4-1 and 2-1.
- In the series opener, RPI had a 2-0 lead in the third period, but SCSU came back to make it a 2-1 game on a power-play goal by freshman Payge Pena with assists going to freshman Kelsey Saelens and senior Julia Gilbert. St. Cloud could not hold on as they gave up two more goals to RPI. The Huskies ended the game outshooting RPI 45-21 and went 1-for-5 on the power-play. Junior goalie Julie Friend had 17 saves for the Huskies. In the series finale, RPI capitalized on back-to-back power-play goals by the halfway point of the first period, leading 2-0. The Huskies were able to start a comeback at the 4:54 mark of the third period as Mollie Mott fired a shot from right in front of the net, scoring a shorthanded goal to make it a 2-1 game. Mott was assisted by Gilbert and Cari Coen. This was the second shorthanded goal for the Huskies this season. Cari Coen scored the first one at Ohio State on Oct. 11. St. Cloud sophomore goalie Katie Fitzgerald made 18 saves. She has 1-4-1 record on the season. The Huskies finished the game outshooting RPI, 32-20.
- The Huskies have outshot their opponent in the last three straight games 106-68 and posted a 1-2 record.
- Leading the Huskies in scoring are seniors Mott and Gilbert with 11 points in 16 games played. Mott and Gilbert have both recorded five goals and six assists on the season.
- This year's freshmen have recorded three goals, four assists and a total 53 shots on goal. Lauren Hesperheide posted her first collegiate goal against #1 Minnesota. Pena recorded the other two goals for the freshmen – against Minnesota on Nov. 8 and against RPI on Nov. 29. Kelsey Saelens has also recorded her first collegiate points with three assists so far this season and Hesperheide with one as well.
- St. Cloud State will continue their homestand Dec. 6-7 as the Huskies hosts WCHA-rival Minnesota State in the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center. Game times are slated for 7:07 pm and 3:07 pm respectively.



### Badgers University Wisconsin

- The No. 2 Badgers (12-2-2, 8-2-2-1 WCHA, 27 points) enter this weekend's series against Bemidji State riding a 12-game unbeaten streak, the nation's longest such streak. It marks UW's longest unbeaten streak since the 2010-11 season, when the Badgers were unbeaten in 14 such contests.
- During its unbeaten streak, Wisconsin has allowed an average of 0.90 goals per game while scoring 3.3 per game. Wisconsin has a conversion rate of .298 during the 10-game span. UW has outshot opponents by an average of 38.0 to 23.1, and has outscored opponents 40-11. Wisconsin also has four wins against ranked opponents during the streak, and has four shutouts.
- The Badgers' power-play ranks third nationally with a conversion percentage of 28.1%, while the penalty-kill unit ranks fifth with a 90.6 percent clip.
- The Badgers lead the series against Bemidji State 51-4-3, and have a 22-2-1 record against the Beavers in Madison. BSU spoiled opening night at LaBahn Arena last year beating UW 1-0 on Oct. 19, and the two teams tied 3-3 in the series finale on Oct. 21. The Badgers went on to sweep the Beavers in Bemidji on Feb. 22 (2-0) and Feb. 23 (3-1).
- The Badgers have allowed an average of 1.00 goals per game, which is tied for the nation's lead. UW has five shutouts this year, and hasn't allowed more than two goals in a game this year.
- Junior Brittany Ammerman ranks 14th in the nation in points per game averaging 1.31 points per contest. She also ranks in the top-20 in goals per game (0.62) and assists per game (0.69).
- Senior Madison Packer has 91 career points while at Wisconsin, which ranks 20th in program history. Packer needs nine more points to become the 18th UW player to reach the 100 point mark.
- Wisconsin is 22-3-1 in its 26 games at LaBahn Arena, and its 12-game home winning streak is the longest in arena history. In the Badgers' 26 games at LaBahn, they have outscored opponents 91-30 and have posted seven shutouts.
- UW's longest home winning streak took place during the 2006-07 season, when the Badgers won 15 straight home games.
- The second period is where the Badgers have shined, outscoring opponents 21-6. Wisconsin has outshot opponents 235-143 in the second frame. UW has outscored teams 10-5 in the first periods, and 16-6 in the third periods.
