OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Topping the Charts:** For the fourth week in a row, the WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national rankings. Minnesota and Wisconsin are Nos. 2 and 3, respectively, in both polls, while Minnesota Duluth is No. 6/7 and Bemidji State is No. 9.
- **Winning Hockey:** WCHA teams also an NCAA-best four of the nation's top 10 winning percentages: Minnesota (2nd at .895, 16-1-2), Wisconsin (3rd at .875, 17-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (8th at .675, 12-5-3), Bemidji State (10th at .639, 11-6-1).
- **Streking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding hot stretches. Wisconsin's 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) is the second-longest active streak in the country, while Minnesota is third with a nine-game winning streak. Minnesota Duluth is 11-1-1 in its last 13 contests, while Bemidji State is on a 7-2-1 roll.
- **Pairing Up:** With just two games remaining before the holiday break, the WCHA has six teams in the PairWise rankings: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin and No. 7 Minnesota Duluth are all in the top eight, followed by Bemidji State (ninth), Ohio State and North Dakota (both tied for 13th).
- **High Attendance Marks:** WCHA schools rank 1-4 in national attendance leaders, led by the fans at Mariucci Arena (Minnesota) LaBahn Arena (Wisconsin), Ralph Engelstad Arena (North Dakota) and AMSOIL Arena (Minnesota Duluth).

BY THE NUMBERS

- **5 and 7:** The number of points separating the top two teams and the third through sixth place teams in the WCHA standings, setting the stage for a thrilling second half race for postseason home-ice advantage.
- **19:** The number of current and former WCHA student-athletes invited to participate in the USA Hockey Women's Winter Training Camp, set for December 27-31 at the Schwan's Super Rink in Blaine, Minn. A full list of WCHA participants can be found on page two of this release.
- **.779:** The WCHA's non-conference winning percentage (26-7-1), the best mark in the country.

THE WEEK AHEAD

- **Ohio State at Bemidji State:** The lone WCHA series of the weekend pits two teams vying for home-ice advantage in the league playoffs. Ohio State is five points behind Bemidji State, but swept the Beavers earlier this season at the OSU Ice Rink.

BEMIDJI STATE AND OHIO STATE TO WRAP UP 2014 CALENDAR YEAR

The first half of women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association season concludes in Bemidji, Minn. this weekend (Dec. 19-20), when Bemidji State plays Ohio State in the lone series before the holiday break.

The Buckeyes hold the edge in the all-time series, with a record of 35-18-11 against the Beavers. Earlier this season (Oct. 17-18), the Buckeyes swept two games from BSU at the OSU Ice Rink. In the first game of the series, Ohio State handed the Beavers their first loss of the season with a dominating 5-1 performance. The Buckeyes recorded a 1-0 shutout over BSU in game two.

Every team has completed half of their 28-game league schedule. The standings with two games remaining before the break show a two-team race for the league title, with a tight bunch for spots three through six.

League-leading Wisconsin (15-2-1-0, 40 points in the WCHA; 17-2-1 overall) takes a 12-game winning streak into the break and has a five-point lead on second place Minnesota, the two-time defending league champion (which has played two fewer games than the Badgers). The Gophers have an 11-1-2-0 league record (35 points), while they have also won nine in a row and now sport a 16-1-2 overall mark.

There is a tight race for the final two home playoff spots, third and fourth place. Minnesota Duluth currently is in third place with 25 points and has gone 11-1-1 in its last 13 games. The Bulldogs (7-5-2-2 in league play and 12-5-3 overall) are two points ahead of Bemidji State (7-6-1-1, 23 points, 11-6-1 overall). The Beavers, who have tied their victory total from all of last season, is 7-2-1 in their last 10 games.

North Dakota (6-8-2-1 in the WCHA and 9-9-2 overall) is in fifth place with 21 points, but has played two more games than UMD and Bemidji State. Ohio State (5-7-2-1, 18 points; 8-8-2 overall) is in sixth place, but sits just three points out of fourth place and - with it - home-ice advantage for the first round of the playoffs.

The rest of the standings show that St. Cloud State (3-10-1-1, 11 points; 6-14-1 overall) is in seventh place and Minnesota State (0-13-1-0, 1 point; 0-15-1) in eighth.

Following the holidays, WCHA teams resume play Jan. 2-3 when Bemidji State plays a non-conference series at Lindenwood. Ohio State visits Penn State from Jan. 3-4. Minnesota State hosts St. Lawrence on Jan. 3 and Minnesota entertains St. Lawrence on Jan. 4 and Jan. 6.

WEEKEND REWIND

In games last weekend, Bemidji State and host St. Cloud State split a two-game weekend series. **Hanna Moher** had a goal and two assists in the series opener and the Beavers beat the Huskies, 4-1. BSU's **Kristine Grenier** had three assists, the second-most in program history in a road game, while **Kristin Huber**, **Ivana Bilic** and **Madison Hutchinson** also scored for the Beavers. St. Cloud roared back behind goalie **Katie Fitzgerald** in the series finale and took a 3-0 victory. Fitzgerald stopped all 34 shots for her second shutout, while **Amanda Arbogast**, **Audrey Hanmer** and **Lauren Hespeneide** each scored for the Huskies.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The No. 9 Beavers (7-6-1-1, 23 points, 11-6-1) split their series at St. Cloud State over the weekend. The Beavers defeated the Huskies 4-1 on Friday before dropping a 3-0 decision Saturday.
- With the victory Friday, the Beavers matched their win total from all of last season with 11 victories.
- **Hanna Moher** posted her first career three-point (1g, 2a) game in Friday's 4-1 victory. It was also Moher's second career two-assist game, with the first coming earlier this season against Vermont (Oct. 5).
- **Kristine Grenier** tallied three assists on three of BSU's goals Friday, which is the second-most in program history in a road game. The three-point game is also the first of Grenier's career.
- **Ivana Bilic** tallied her fourth goal in the last six games in Friday's game, which brings her point total to 14 (4g, 10a) this season. The 14 points, a new career-high for Bilic, is tied for the ninth-most by a defenseman in a single season in program history.
- **Alexis Joyce** tallied an assist Friday, which was her fourth in the last six games. Joyce leads all WCHA freshmen blueliners with nine points (2g, 7a) this season.
- Bemidji State's penalty-killing unit ranks second in the WCHA and fourth nationally with a 91.1 percent success rate.
- When the Beavers hold a lead at intermissions, they have seen quite a bit of success this season. BSU is 7-0-0 when leading after the first period and 10-0-0 when leading after the second.
- Bemidji State returns home to close out the 2014 portion of its schedule with a series against Ohio State University on Dec. 19-20.
- The Beavers are 18-32-10 all-time against the Buckeyes, including an 11-13-6 mark in Bemidji, Minn.
- Ohio State swept Bemidji State earlier this season in Columbus, Ohio by scores of 5-1 and 1-0.
- Kaitlyn Tougas has enjoyed the most success against the Buckeyes of any other BSU player with three points (1g, 2a) in seven career games.

Gophers University of Minnesota

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (11-1-2-0, 35 points; 16-1-2) have a four-week break from competition, returning to action to host St. Lawrence on Sunday, Jan. 4 and Tuesday, Jan. 6.
- Last weekend, the Gophers swept St. Cloud State, winning 12-0 and 7-0. **Hannah Brandt** (2g-7a), **Rachael Bona** (2g-4a), **Dani Cameranesi** (6a) and **Kelly Pannek** (6a) led the Gopher offense as 15 of Minnesota's 16 skaters recorded at least one point in the series and 11 different Gophers scored at least one goal. **Sidney Peters** and **Amanda Leveille** each earned one shutout win over the weekend in net as well.
- The Gophers tied Minnesota's program record with 12 goals in Friday's 12-0 win over the Huskies. Brandt and Cameranesi set a new Gopher program record with six assists each in the win, and Brandt's seven points (1g-6a) tied the Minnesota record for individual points in a game. **Paige Haley** and **Nina Rodgers** each scored their first career goals.
- Six different Gophers scored goals as Minnesota completed the sweep with a 7-0 win in game two of the series. **Sydney Baldwin's** first career goal was the game-winner, and **Kelsey Cline** recorded a career-high three assists. **Milica McMillen** scored two goals, while Leveille made 14 saves in her 20th career shutout.
- At the midway point of the regular season, 10 Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, led by Brandt (16g-21a), Cameranesi (15g-15a) and Bona (6g-17a). All 18 skaters have at least one point, and 14 players have scored at least one goal. Brandt and Cameranesi lead the WCHA and rank third and fourth in the NCAA with 2.06 points per game and 1.67 points per game, respectively. Brandt's 16 goals lead the WCHA and rank fourth in the nation.
- McMillen leads the NCAA with seven power-play goals each this season, and the Gophers have the nation's top power-play unit, converting on 27 of 74 opportunities for a .365 percentage.
- Cameranesi leads the nation with five game-winning goals this season.
- The Gophers' defensemen lead the WCHA blueliners in scoring, averaging 3.63 points per game. McMillen (10g-8a) ranks fifth in the nation and leads the WCHA defensemen with 18 points in 19 games for a 0.95 points per game average this year.
- Pannek (4g-16a) ranks third in scoring among the nation's rookies, averaging 1.05 points per game. She has 12 points (3g-9a) during a career-best five-game point streak.
- Leveille ranks second in the WCHA and fifth in the nation with a .942 save percentage, while she is second in the league (sixth nationally) with a 1.29 goals against average. She also leads the WCHA and ranks second in the NCAA with a .900 winning percentage (13-1-1).
- With 86 goals in 19 games, the Gophers' offense leads the WCHA and ranks second in the nation, averaging 4.53 goals per game behind Boston College (5.94). Meanwhile, Minnesota's 1.11 goals against average is second in the WCHA and fourth in the NCAA.

Bulldogs University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 6 Bulldogs (7-5-2-2, 25 points; 12-5-3) will be off from outside competition until Jan. 10-11, when Bemidji State travels to AMSOIL Arena. UMD is 1-1 against the No. 9 Beavers this season.
- Before the break, UMD picked up four WCHA points Dec. 5-6 in Columbus against Ohio State with a 2-2 tie and shootout win Friday, followed by a 4-1 triumph over the Buckeyes on Saturday.
- On Friday night, UMD trailed OSU twice, finding the equalizers on goals from **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** and **Katerina Mrázová** to force the game in extra time after a 2-2 regulation. After a scoreless overtime, **Jenna McParland** kept the Bulldogs perfect in shootouts this season with the lone goal, while goaltender **Kayla Black** held OSU scoreless on three attempts.
- Saturday night, OSU again got on the board first with an early second period goal, but UMD scored three unanswered second period goals, including a shorthanded game-winner by **Meghan Huertas** 13:04 into the stanza, to bury the Buckeyes. **Zoe Hickel**, Mrázová and McParland had the games goals, while Brykaliuk had two assists.
- UMD is unbeaten in its last three games and has gone 11-1-1 in its last 13 games.
- Brykaliuk had four points in the series (1g, 3a), and now has seven games where she has recorded two or more points. She leads the Bulldogs with 22 points on 10 goals and 12 assists, tying her rookie output for points only 20 games into the current season. Brykaliuk is averaging 1.10 ppg for UMD.
- Hickel leads the Bulldogs in goals, with 12 tallies in 19 skates and has scored five goals in her last six outings. Hickel is currently tied for 12th in the NCAA for goals per game.
- Black is ranked 4th in the nation with six shutouts and is ninth with a 1.73 GAA. Black is one shutout shy of setting a single-season record for shutouts at UMD.

- Junior **Katie Johnson** had a stellar game Friday in Bemidji. Johnson scored two of MSU's four goals and added an assist. It's the first time in her career scoring two goals and having three points in a game.
- Freshman **Amanda Conway** recorded her first career points for the Mavericks in Friday's loss, tallying two assists.
- Junior **Erin Krichiver** had 62 saves last weekend. She has 480 total saves this season, ranking her third in the NCAA.

- North Dakota (6-8-2-1, 21 points, 9-9-2) wrapped up the 2014 part of the schedule by sweeping College Hockey America's RIT over the Dec. 12-13 weekend in Rochester, N.Y.
- Senior forwards **Andrea Dalen** and **Josefine Jakobsen** led the way for UND, as the two turned in five-point and four-point efforts over the weekend, respectively.
- In the first game of the series against the Tigers, it took a while for UND to warm up. Jakobsen broke a 0-0 stalemate with less than two minutes remaining in the second period while on the power play. **Amy Menke's** man-advantage goal in the game's final three minutes was the game-winner, while Dalen would score on an empty net to secure the 3-1 win for UND.
- After going scoreless in the first period the day before, UND netted four first-period goals to open the game on Dec. 13. Dalen, **Gracen Hirschy**, Menke and Jakobsen all scored to give UND the 4-0 lead.
- **Meghan Dufault** scored her first of the weekend and Jakobsen netted her second of the game to give UND the 6-1 win.
- All of UND's 19 skaters have recorded a point this season, including 15 goal scorers. **Becca Kohler** leads UND in five major scoring categories, points (21), goals (8), assists (13), power-play goals (3) and game-winning goals (2).
- North Dakota is undefeated (7-0-1) this season when scoring three or more goals in a game.
- In the nation, Jakobsen is sixth among all skaters, first among forwards, with a total of 39 blocked shots (.95 blocks per game).
- Both Jakobsen and Kohler are tied for 15th in the nation with three power-play goals on the year. Additionally, with 21 points, Kohler is 33rd in the nation averaging 1.05 points per game.
- North Dakota's junior class is sixth in the nation in offensive production, having registered 64 points (22g, 42a). Boston College's junior class leads the nation with 121 points.
- UND has scored 11 goals on 53 power-play opportunities so far this season, and its .208 power-play efficiency ranks second in the WCHA. UND has also scored a total of two shorthanded goals so far this season.
- North Dakota is undefeated when scoring on the power play (7-0-0) and has scored more than one power-play goal in four games this season.
- With a .892 efficiency rate while shorthanded, UND has the nation's fifth best penalty-kill unit in the nation and second in the WCHA. North Dakota has conceded nine power-play goals in 83 opportunities.
- North Dakota is one win away from picking up its 100th all-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory. Head coach **Brian Idalski** has recorded 88 of UND's 99 conference wins.
- Attendance at North Dakota women's hockey home games has ranked in the top five of the nation for the past four years. So far this season, UND is averaging 1,061 fans per game at Ralph Engelstad Arena.
- With 88 points, Dufault is the closest to becoming the sixth member of the 100-point club at UND.

- The Buckeyes (5-7-2-1 WCHA, 18 points; 8-8-2) return from a short hiatus in competition to take on Bemidji State on the road, Dec. 19-20.
- Ohio State holds the edge in the all-time series with Bemidji State, as the Buckeyes have a record of 35-18-11 against the Beavers.
- Earlier this season (Oct. 17-18), the Buckeyes completed a series sweep of BSU at the OSU Ice Rink, winning by scores of 5-1 and 1-0, respectively.
- Ohio State took on No. 8 Minnesota Duluth in its last action. The first game ended in a 2-2 overtime tie, while the second went in the Bulldogs' favor, 4-1.
- In game one, the Bulldogs won the shootout, 1-0 in three rounds, to pick up the extra point in the WCHA standings. Ohio State received goals from senior forwards **Danielle Gagne** and **Taylor Kuehl**.
- Freshman **Lauren Spring** was the lone game two goal scorer for the Buckeyes, claiming her second goal of the season.
- Redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** started in goal for the Buckeyes in game one vs. UMD. She has suited up in seven games for the Scarlet and Gray this season, recording a goals against average of 1.84 and a save percentage of .912.
- Freshman **Kassidy Sauve** has started in 13 games in goal for Ohio State and holds a record of 6-7-0. The Whitby, Ontario, native retains a save percentage of .910 and a goals against average of 2.38. In the matchup with UMD, Sauve recorded 25 stops.
- Ohio State is led in scoring by team captain **Sara Schmitt**. Schmitt has recorded four goals and 11 assists for 15 points on the season. She ranks seventh on Ohio State's all-time list for scoring by a defenseman with 76 career points. With two more points, Schmitt will pass **Shannon Reilly** for sixth all-time.
- In the WCHA, Schmitt ranks tied for third among defensemen in goals (4), fourth in points (15) and sixth in assists (11).
- Nineteen players have recorded one or more points for the Buckeyes this season, including three rookies.
- Three Buckeyes have garnered individual attention from the WCHA so far this season. Sauve received WCHA Rookie of the Week accolades twice (Oct. 17-18; Oct. 31-Nov. 2), while Danczak picked up WCHA Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 7-11) and **Claudia Kepler** earned WCHA Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 3-5).
- In special teams play, Ohio State is 9-for-82 on power play chances (.110) and 52-for-62 on the penalty kill (.839). Against UMD, the Buckeyes went 1-for-10 on the power play and 6-for-7 on the penalty kill.
- Erin Selfe, a fifth-grader at Liking Valley Intermediate, was adopted by the Buckeyes through Team IMPACT, a national nonprofit organization that matches children with life-threatening illnesses with college sports teams. Selfe signed her honorary letter of intent at a press conference following Ohio State's home matchup vs. Minnesota, making her an official Ohio State Buckeye.

- The Badgers rank third in the nation in scoring offense, averaging 4.05 goals per game. UW is also third in the nation in scoring defense, holding opponents to 1.10 goals per contest.
- Ammerman, **Sarah Nurse** and **Sydney McKibbon** are tied for 15th in the country in power-play goals with three.
- Three Badgers rank in the top-18 in points per game, as **Karley Sylvester** averages 1.32 points per contest, good for 12th in the nation, while Pankowski is averaging 1.26 points per game, which ranks 14th nationally. Ammerman has a 1.20 points per game average, good for 18th nationally. In addition, McKibbon is putting up 0.90 points per matchup, as teammates **Emily Clark** and Nurse are each averaging 0.88 points per contest.
- Pankowski leads all NCAA rookies in points per game, averaging 1.26 points per game, while Clark checks in at eighth with her 0.88 points per contest.
- **Ann-Renée Desbiens** enters the break with an 14-2-1 record this season, and a .853 winning percentage. Desbiens has a career record of 25-3-1, with her three losses coming at the hands of ranked opponents. Desbiens' ten career shutouts rank sixth on the Badgers' all-time list.
- Wisconsin's freshman class of Pankowski, Clark, **Baylee Wellhausen**, **Lauren Williams** and **Maddie Rolfes** is second in the NCAA in freshmen scoring, as the quintet has put up 20 goals, 33 assists, and 53 points so far this season for an average of 2.65 points per game.
- UW's sophomore class of Nurse, **Melissa Channell**, McKibbon, **Jenny Ryan** and **Mikayla Johnson** rank fourth in the NCAA in sophomore scoring, averaging 3.00 points per game.
- The Badgers' senior class of Ammerman, **Karley Sylvester**, **Blayre Turnbull**, **Katy Josephs** and **Katarina Zgraja** lead the NCAA in senior scoring, averaging 4.25 points per contest.
- The Badgers' lead the nation in shots on goal, averaging 42.30 shots on goal per contest. UW also ranks second in fewest shots against per game, holding opponents to an average of 18.65 shots per contest.
- Wisconsin leads the nation in shot margin, averaging 23.65 more shots per game than their opponents.
