OPENING FACE-OFF

- **Topping the Charts:** For the second week in a row, the WCHA has an NCAA-best four teams in both the USCHO.com and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national rankings. The two polls mirror each other, with the WCHA represented by No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Wisconsin, No. 8 Minnesota Duluth and No. 9 Bemidji State.
- **Winning Hockey:** WCHA teams also own four of the nation's top 10 and six of the top 15 winning percentages, tied with the ECAC for most of any league: Minnesota (3rd at .882, 14-1-2), Wisconsin (4th at .861, 15-2-1), Minnesota Duluth (8th at .667, 11-5-2), Bemidji State (9th at .607, 8-5-1), Ohio State (t-13th at .531, 8-7-1) and North Dakota (t-15th at .500, 7-7-2).
- **Non-Conference Success:** Following a perfect 5-0-0, East Coast swing by three league teams last weekend, the WCHA is an NCAA-best 24-7-1 (.766) in non-conference play.
- **Pairing Up:** Following the first two months of the season and nearing the halfway mark on many teams' regular season schedules, six of the eight WCHA teams are in the PairWise top 16: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 4 Wisconsin, No. 8 (tied) Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State, No. 13 Ohio State and No. 14 North Dakota.
- **Putting Up Zeroes in Madison....:** Behind the stellar play of sophomore goaltender **Ann-Renée Desbiens**, Wisconsin enters the weekend with a program-record 330:56 scoreless streak. The Badgers have also posted five straight shutouts, tying the school record for consecutive whitewashes.
- **...And in Duluth:** Bulldogs' junior netminder **Kayla Black** has recorded a shutout in four consecutive weekends, including a 2-0 victory over Bemidji State last Sunday. Black's six shutouts this year are the second-highest single-season total in UMD history, while her 15 career blankings are third most in program annals (behind All-Americans Riita Schaublin, 17; and Kim Martin, 16).
- **Streaking Along:** Several WCHA teams are riding hot stretches. Wisconsin's 10-game unbeaten streak (9-0-1) is the third-longest active streak in the country. Minnesota Duluth is 10-1-0 in its last 11 contests, while Bemidji State (which snapped UMD's nine-game run) is on a 4-1-1 roll. Minnesota has won seven consecutive games, while North Dakota has a modest three-game winning streak.
- **North Dakota Nearing 100:** North Dakota's next conference win will be its 100th WCHA victory all-time. Head coach **Brian Idalski** has been at the helm for 88 of UND's 99 WCHA wins to date.
- **Full Slate of WCHA Series Ahead:** Week 11 will feature a quartet of WCHA series. Wisconsin hosts North Dakota, Ohio State welcomes Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State entertains Minnesota State and Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State.

RIVALRY WEEKEND - DECEMBER KICKS OFF WITH FULL SLATE OF WCHA SERIES

The women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) comes to the halfway mark on the schedule with a full round of league series this weekend, Dec. 5-7. The league features four nationally-ranked teams and this weekend's series feature games involving long-time rivals.

League-leading Wisconsin (13-2-1-0 and 34 points in the WCHA; 15-2-2-1 overall) puts a 10-game unbeaten streak on the line when it hosts third place North Dakota this Friday and Sunday afternoon at LaBahn Arena. UND (6-6-2-1, 21 points; 7-7-2 overall) is coming off its first series sweep since the second week of the season. Wisconsin leads the all-time series with North Dakota, 40-6-3, but the series has been close lately, as UW has a 6-4-2 advantage in the last 12 meetings. The Badgers have shut out its opponent in its past five games, which tied the school record for consecutive shutouts. UW's shutout streak of 330:56 is the longest in program history.

Minnesota, the two-time defending league champion, is in second place, but has played two fewer games than Wisconsin. The Gophers (9-1-2-0, 29 points; 14-1-2 overall) host in-state rival St. Cloud State (2-7-1-1, 8 points; 5-11-1 overall) Friday and Saturday at Ridder Arena. The teams met Nov. 24 in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Museum Women's Faceoff Classic Nov. 24 and the Gophers scored a 5-0 victory to improve to 63-3-2 all-time against St. Cloud State. The Gophers have won the last 21-straight meetings between the two teams and went 6-0-0 against St. Cloud State last season, including a postseason sweep in the WCHA first round.

Minnesota Duluth and Ohio State have met in the first round of the WCHA playoffs for the last three years. They will meet for the first time this season in Columbus, Ohio on Friday and Saturday and again are bunched in the standings, battling for fourth place and the final home ice slot for the league playoffs. The Bulldogs (6-5-1-1, 20 points; 11-5-2 overall) have won 10 of their last 11 games, while the Buckeyes (6-6-1-1, 17 points; 8-7-1 overall) are in fifth place, three points behind UMD. All-time, UMD is 58-12-2 against Ohio State. The Bulldogs finished 4-1-2 overall head-to-head with OSU last season.

Minnesota State (0-11-1-0, 1 point; 0-13-1 overall) heads north to Bemidji State (4-5-1-1, 14 points; 8-5-1 overall) in search of its first victory. The Beavers have just one loss in their last six games. BSU is 27-24-10 all-time against its in-state rival, including a 3-1-0 mark versus MSU last season.

Before the full set of league series this weekend, Bemidji State hosts an exhibition game against Pursuit of Excellence on Wednesday night at Sanford Center.

WEEKEND REWIND

In action last weekend, Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State split a top-10 showdown series, North Dakota picked up a pair of victories, and Minnesota, Wisconsin and Ohio State continued the WCHA's dominance in non-conference play.

North Dakota recorded its second home sweep of the season, beating St. Cloud State, 6-1 and 3-1 in Grand Forks, N.D. **Josefine Jakobsen** and **Gracen Hirschy** scored twice in the series opener. **Becca Kohler** collected five-points and had a goal in each game against the Huskies.

Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State each took unbeaten streaks into last weekend's series in Bemidji. Not surprisingly, the teams split. The Bulldogs saw a nine-game winning streak snapped in the series opener -- a 4-1 BSU victory. **Brittini Mowat** had 31 saves, while **Kristine Grenier** and **Ivana Bilic** scored first-period goals to give the Beavers the early lead. UMD came back to end Bemidji's five-game unbeaten streak Saturday as **Kayla Black** made 19 of her 32 saves in a busy second period. **Zoe Hickel** scored early, **Meghan Huertas** added an empty-netter late and Black recorded her sixth shutout of the season in a 2-0 victory. The only UMD netminder to ever record most whitewashes in a season was All-American Riitta Schaublin, who collected seven during the 2004-05 season. Black also now has 15 career shutouts, one behind All-American Kim Martin (16) and two behind UMD shutout leader Schaublin (17).

WCHA teams have posted an NCAA-best 24-7-1 record (.765 winning percentage) outside the league this season following non-conference series sweeps on the road by Wisconsin and Minnesota and Ohio State's 5-1 victory over Robert Morris in Pittsburgh, Pa.

Kayla Sullivan led the Buckeyes with three points on two goals and an assist, while **Melani Moylan** and **Sara Schmitt** added a goal and an assist.

Minnesota earned a non-conference road sweep over Princeton, winning 2-1 and 5-2. **Hannah Brandt** (2g-2a) and **Dani Cameranesi** (1g-2a) led the Gophers and **Amanda Leveille** combined for 34 saves to earn both wins in net for Minnesota. The Gophers' Brandt and **Maryanne Menefee** scored early in the third period to break a scoreless tie on Friday, and five different Minnesota players scored goals on Saturday to complete the sweep.

For the second straight weekend, **Ann-Renée Desbiens** turned in a pair of shutouts for Wisconsin as the Badgers beat New Hampshire by identical 5-0 scores. Desbiens has six shutouts this season and even added an assist on her team's first goal of the weekend. The sophomore goalie has a 12-2-1 record this season, and a .833 winning percentage. **Sydney McKibbin** and **Annie Pankowski** each had a pair of goals to help UW run its road unbeaten streak to 24 games. They have not lost a road game since October 12, 2013.

Kohler recorded a five-point weekend, scoring two goals and handing out three assists, as North Dakota swept a league series against visiting St. Cloud State. The junior from St. Thomas, Ontario paced a 6-1 Friday night victory with a goal and two assists, before her game-winning strike helped UND to a 3-1 triumph on Sunday. She finished the weekend with eight shots and a +3 rating. Kohler, who is 17th in the nation with 1.19 points per game, is on a three-game point streak that includes three goals (two game-winners) and four assists.

Black posted a shutout for the fourth consecutive weekend, making 32 saves in a 2-0 victory over then-No. 10/9 Bemidji State last Saturday that gave Minnesota Duluth a split in the series between two top-10 teams. The junior from Blyth, Ontario was particularly impressive in the second period, when the Beavers outshot the Bulldogs, 19-4. Black is only the second netminder in UMD history with more than five blankings in a season, as her six shutouts this year trail only the seven recorded by All-American Riitta Schaublin in 2004-05. She also now has 15 career shutouts, one behind All-American Kim Martin (16) and two behind UMD's all-time leader, Schaublin (17).

ANN-RENÉE DESBIENS

Desbiens rank her shutout streak to four consecutive games with back-to-back blankings in Wisconsin's two 5-0 road victories at New Hampshire. Behind Desbiens' stellar play between the pipes, the Badgers have held their opponents scoreless for 330 minutes and 56 seconds. The sophomore from La Malbaie, Québec, is now 12-2-1 on the season and ranks among national leaders for shutouts (t-3rd, 6), wins (t-4th), winning percentage (t-4th, .833) and goals against average (6th, 1.32). Her nine career shutouts rank sixth on the Badgers' all-time list.

Beavers Bemidji State University

- The No. 9 Beavers (4-5-1-1, 14 points; 8-5-1) split their series last weekend against Minnesota Duluth. BSU defeated the Bulldogs Friday 4-1 before dropping the series finale, 2-0.
- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak for the Beavers, which tied the longest in program history.
- Bemidji State is off to its second best start through 14 games in program history. The only better start came during the 2011-12 season when BSU was 8-4-2.
- Bemidji State ranks second nationally in blocked shots per game (17.07). Only Robert Morris averages more blocked shots per game (18.08).
- Senior **Kristine Grenier** tallied her first career multi-point game against UMD Friday. Grenier is tied for fourth on the team with six points (2g, 4a) this season.
- **Stephanie Anderson** notched a two-assist game Friday versus the Bulldogs. Anderson has already matched her point total from last season (eight).
- **Ivana Bilic** registered the game-winning goal against UMD Friday. Bilic has two game-winning goals this season, which is tied for the most in nation by a defenseman. Bilic has 23 career points which is the eighth most by a defenseman in BSU history.
- **Brittini Mowat**, who is 6-3-1 this season, ranks fourth nationally with a save percentage of .952.
- Bemidji State hosts WCHA rival Minnesota State this weekend. BSU is 27-24-10 all-time against the Mavericks, including a 3-1-0 mark versus MSU last season.
- The Beavers are 13-10-7 all-time against Minnesota State in Bemidji, Minn., including a 6-2-0 mark at Sanford Center.
- **Kaitlyn Tougas** has enjoyed quite a bit of success against Minnesota State in her career with eight points (4g, 4a) in eight games.

- The No. 2 Golden Gophers (9-1-2-0, 29 points; 14-1-2) return home to host St. Cloud State (5-11-1, 2-7-1-1 WCHA) at Ridder Arena in its final series of 2014 this weekend.
- Minnesota and St. Cloud State met in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Museum Women's Faceoff Classic on Monday, Nov. 24. Led by **Kelly Pannek's** hat trick, the Gophers secured a 5-0 win over the Huskies to improve to 63-3-2 all-time against St. Cloud State.
- The Gophers have won the last 21-straight meetings between the two teams. Minnesota went 6-0-0 against St. Cloud State last season, including a postseason sweep in the WCHA first round.
- Last weekend, the Gophers earned a non-conference road sweep over Princeton, winning 2-1 and 5-2. **Hannah Brandt** (2g-2a) and **Dani Cameranesi** (1g-2a) led the Gophers and **Amanda Leveille** combined for 34 saves to earn both wins in net for Minnesota.
- The Gophers scored two third-period goals to secure a 2-1 win in the first game of the series. Brandt and **Maryanne Menefee** scored early in the third period to break a scoreless tie.
- Five different Gophers scored goals as Minnesota completed the sweep with a 5-2 win in game two. Brandt and Menefee each scored their second goals of the weekend, and **Milica McMillen** scored her NCAA-leading sixth power-play goal of the year. Cameranesi recorded three points (1g-2a), and **Megan Wolfe** and Pannek each had two assists.
- Ten Gophers are in double-figures for scoring, led by Brandt (14g-14a), Cameranesi (15g-9a) and **Rachael Bona** (4g-13a). - Minnesota is 109-4-4 in the team's last 117 games, a stretch that includes an NCAA-record 62-game winning streak (Feb. 28, 2012 through Nov. 17, 2013). The Gophers are also 52-0-1 in their last 53 true road games (not including neutral-site games).

- The No. 8 Bulldogs (6-5-1-1, 20 points; 11-5-2) saw their nine-game winning streak come to an end Friday night before salvaging a series split with No. 9 Bemidji State on Saturday.
- Friday night the Bulldogs struck first, 6:30 into the game, on a **Bridgette Lacquette** goal, but the Beavers responded with four unanswered goals, including an open net tally to beat UMD 4-1. It was the Bulldogs' first loss since Oct. 17 and only the fifth ever loss for UMD against BSU in 67 meetings. The Bulldogs outshot BSU 13-4 in the third period and 32-25 in the game.
- Saturday, UMD again scored first, this time 2:23 into the contest, thanks to senior winger **Zoe Hickel**. That goal would stand as the eventual game-winner, though **Meghan Huertas** added an open net tally with 58 seconds left to ice the contest for the Bulldogs. Bemidji outshot UMD 32-29 in the skate, including 19-4 in the second period, but goaltender **Kayla Black** earned her sixth shutout of the season. UMD was a perfect 4-of-4 on the penalty kill.
- Black's sixth shutout on the season makes her the first UMD goaltender in a decade to post more than five shutouts. The last and only Bulldog netminder ever to do so was All-American **Riitta Schaublin**, who collected seven during the 2004-05 season, which stands as a UMD record to this day. Black also now has 15 career shutouts, one behind All-American **Kim Martin** (16) and two behind UMD shutout leader Schaublin (17).
- Sophomore winger **Ashleigh Brykaliuk** leads the Bulldogs in scoring with 18 points on nine goals and nine assists in 18 games. - North Dakota picked up the win against St. Cloud State on Saturday, 6-1. **Becca Kohler** led UND with three points off of a goal and two assists, while **Josefine Jakobsen** and Gracen Hirschy each tallied twice. Sophomore forward **Kayla Gardner** scored her first goal of the year, and classmate **Marissa Salo** earned her first career assist on the play. **Halli Krzyzaniak** recorded her first multi-point effort of the year with two assists. Goaltender **Shelby Amsley-Benzie** earned the win in net, improving to 4-4-1 this season with a 19-save effort.
- A good first period and some solid goaltending helped North Dakota complete the sweep over the Huskies on Sunday afternoon. **Meghan Dufault**, Kohler and **Amy Menke** all scored goals.
- The two wins over SCSU marked the first home sweep of the year for North Dakota. The six-goal outing on Saturday afternoon was the team's highest offensive output since a 7-1 win over Rensselaer in the season opener, back on Oct. 3.
- North Dakota is one win away from picking up its 100th all-time Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory. The weekend sweep against St. Cloud State (Nov. 29-30) gave UND its 98th and 99th WCHA victories. Head coach **Brian Idalski** has recorded 88 of UND's 99 conference wins.

- Against Robert Morris, senior forward **Kayla Sullivan** led the Buckeyes with three points on two goals and an assist. Sullivan started Ohio State's scoring trend early, finding the back of the net less than a minute into the game. She later went on to add another goal as well as an assist in the second period of play.
- Redshirt junior **Stacy Danczak** started in goal for the Buckeyes. She has suited up in five games for the Scarlet and Gray this season, recording a goals against average of 1.86 and a save percentage of .904. Against the Colonials, Danczak played all 60 minutes and recorded 20 saves.
