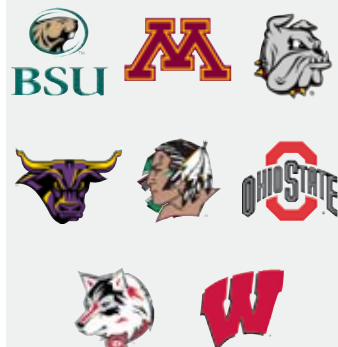

First Weekend of November to Feature Full Slate of Four WCHA Series; Top-Ranked Wisconsin, No. 3-Ranked Minnesota Duluth Sweep at Home over Halloween

Nov. 5-7 Conference Series Have Wisconsin at Minnesota, UMD at Bemidji State, St. Cloud State at Minnesota State, Ohio State at North Dakota; Five WCHA Team Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UMD No. 3, UND No. 7, UM No. 8, OSU No. 9; Cody has Seven Points as BSU Takes Pair from SCSU; Buckeyes Sweep Syracuse; Tickets on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national champion Minnesota Duluth and top-ranked Wisconsin recorded conference sweeps at home over the Halloween weekend to establish themselves at the top of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association women's standings.

Both the No. 3-ranked Bulldogs and No. 1-ranked Badgers face road tests this weekend as Minnesota Duluth travels to Bemidji State and the new Sanford Center and Wisconsin visits No. 8-ranked Minnesota and Ridder Arena in a pair of two-game conference series this Friday and Saturday, Nov. 5-6. The Bulldogs have never lost a game to BSU, posting a 47-0-2 all-time mark.

The Badgers, who wrapped up a season-opening eight-game homestand by defeating Minnesota State 3-2 and 6-1 behind a five-point series from Brooke Ammerman Oct. 29-30 at the Kohl Center, are 8-0-0 overall and 6-0-0 in the WCHA with 18 points.

The Bulldogs are 7-1-0 overall and 5-1-0 in the WCHA with 15 points, three more than idle North Dakota, after running their winning streak over Minnesota (5-4-0, 2-4-0 in WCHA) to six straight games.

The Bulldogs beat the visiting Gophers 3-2 last Friday and 4-2 last Saturday as Haley Irwin had a three goals and an assist.

Wisconsin and UMD, which is ranked behind Cornell, are again two of five Western Collegiate Hockey Association-member teams ranked in this week's (Nov. 1) USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll. North Dakota is at No. 7, Minnesota is at No. 8 and Ohio State ranks No. 9 in this week's poll.

In other league series this weekend, Ohio State (5-2-0, 2-2-0 WCHA, six points) plays at North Dakota (5-3-0, 4-2-0 WCHA) in a Saturday-Sunday series at Ralph Engelstad Arena while St. Cloud State (0-9-0, 0-6-0 WCHA) travels to Minnesota State (1-5-0, 2-5-1 WCHA, three points) and All Seasons Arena for a Friday-Saturday series.

Last weekend (Oct. 29-30), host Bemidji State (4-4, 2-2-0, six points) won its first league games by sweeping winless St. Cloud State, 4-2 and 4-0, as Erin Cody had five goals and two assists in the series and goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova had a 17-save shutout in the series finale.

In non-conference play over the Halloween weekend, host and No. 9-ranked Ohio State won two decisions against Syracuse, a 5-1 victory last Friday and a 6-2 win last Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink. The sweep is Ohio State's third in four series this season. Laura McIntosh became the sixth Buckeye to reach the 100 career point milestone last Friday when she dished out three assists. McIntosh eclipsed the century mark with a total of five points vs. the Orange and now has 103 points in 81 career games. She is the fastest Buckeye to reach 100 points (in 80 games), surpassing the previous mark by 19 games (Jana Harrigan, 100th point in 99th game). McIntosh was one of four Buckeyes with multiple points last Friday as Hokey Langan also had three points (1g, 2a), Natalie Spooner scored twice and Kelly Wild had a goal and assist. Rookie goalie Lisa Steffes made 44 saves in the 6-2 win last Saturday. Spooner had three points on two goals and an assist.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Friday and Saturday, Nov. 12-13, there are just four WCHA-member teams in action. Those two league series will find Ohio State hosting Minnesota State and Bemidji State entertaining North Dakota. Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth, St. Cloud State and Wisconsin will all be idle.

WCHA Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

2010-11 WCHA Women's Schedule Highlights

112-Game League Slate Runs Oct. 8-Feb. 19; Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota are Defending Conference Regular Season Co-Champions; New Buildings Opening at Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth; 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF to be Held March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis; Bulldogs are Defending Playoff Champs; 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four Set for March 18-20 in Erie, Pa. ... UMD is Defending National Champion

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association's women's league, sporting a record 11 consecutive national team championships since it's founding in 1999, released it's 2010-11 composite schedule on Aug. 20, highlighted by the appearance of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn., and the opening of new arenas at league-members Bemidji State and defending national champion Minnesota Duluth.

Under the leadership of Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the WCHA continues to set the pace in women's collegiate ice hockey.

"This will certainly be an exciting year for us, with two of our programs – Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth – opening new arenas. The Robert M. Peters Rink at the Bemidji Regional Event Center (4,258) and AMSOIL Arena (6,600) in Duluth are state of the art facilities that will provide great amenities for teams and fans," said Martin.

Bemidji State will play it's first game in the new building on Oct. 15, when the Beavers host eastern power Mercyhurst for a two-game non-conference series. Minnesota Duluth will officially open AMSOIL Arena on Dec. 30 with the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame men's game between the Bulldogs and North Dakota while the women's team will first play in the new facility Jan. 21-22 against WCHA-foe Wisconsin.

"We also look forward to a highly competitive regular season in the WCHA. Each year our teams get stronger and the race to the championship gets tighter. Last year's co-championship between Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota was historic for us and just four points separated the next four teams at the end of the regular season. We feel the upcoming 2010-11 campaign may be our most tightly-contested season to date."

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will again be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

"We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association's automatic bid

into the NCAA tournament championship field.”

The initial on-ice action of 2010-11 will consist of four exhibition contests slated for Sept. 24-26 as Bemidji State and North Dakota take turns hosting the Toronto Jr. Aeros and St. Cloud State and Minnesota both entertain the University of Manitoba.

The first regular season action will occur the weekend of Oct. 1-3. In non-conference matchups Minnesota travels east to face Clarkson, St. Cloud State heads to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State is off to Wayne State, Wisconsin hosts Rensselaer and North Dakota hosts Boston University (Sat/Sun). In exhibition play, the UMD Bulldogs host the Minnesota Whitecaps for a pair of games.

The weekend of Oct. 8-10 will bring the first league encounters of the 2010-11 season as Minnesota Duluth ventures to North Dakota (Sat/Sun) and Wisconsin entertains Bemidji State (Fri/Sun). Outside the WCHA, Ohio State plays at Robert Morris, Minnesota State hosts Niagara, and St. Cloud State and Minnesota will take turns hosting Wayne State and the Minnesota Whitecaps (exh).

Other conference openers, by member team, are: Minnesota (Oct. 15-16 vs North Dakota), Minnesota State (Oct. 16-17 at Minnesota Duluth), Ohio State (Oct. 15-16 vs St. Cloud State), and St. Cloud State (Oct. 15-16 @ Ohio State).

Additional non-conference action this season, by member team, consists of the following matchups: Bemidji State (vs Mercyhurst, Oct. 15-16); Minnesota (vs Harvard, Nov. 26 & 28); Minnesota Duluth (vs Connecticut, Oct. 23-24); Minnesota State (@ Wayne State, Nov. 26-27 and vs Robert Morris, Dec. 3-4); North Dakota (@ Vermont, Jan. 7-8); Ohio State (vs Syracuse, Oct. 29-30 and vs Wayne State, Dec. 30-31); St. Cloud State (vs Mercyhurst and Northeastern as host of Easton Holiday Showcase, Jan. 1-2); and Wisconsin (@ Robert Morris, Nov. 19-20 and vs Northeastern and Mercyhurst @ Easton Holiday Showcase in St. Cloud, Jan. 1-2).

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Feb. 25-27 with the four first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams as the No. 1 seed hosts the No. 8 seed, No. 2 hosts No. 7, No. 3 hosts No. 6 and No. 4 hosts No. 5.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT with the championship contest set for 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners will then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women's Frozen Four, which will be contested March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

Beavers

Bemidji State University

- The Beavers continue their five-week homestand playing host to the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs Nov. 5-6.
- Minnesota Duluth is the only conference team that BSU has never defeated. Bemidji State's all-time record against the Bulldogs is 0-47-2.
- One of the two ties the Beavers have on UMD came last year as goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova made a season high 46 saves to take the 1-1 game into a shootout. BSU ended up winning the shootout and it marked the first time the Beavers picked up more than one conference point against Minnesota Duluth. The Beavers played the Bulldogs five times last year, going 0-4-1 in those games. The Bulldogs ended BSU's season last year after Bemidji State made its first-ever trip to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. The Bulldogs won the semifinal game by a score of 7-3. The three goals scored by BSU were the most conceded by UMD in a single game in the postseason.
- Of the eight goals scored against the Bulldogs last season, four came from Erin Cody, two from Emily Erickson and one from Annie Bauerfeld.
- The BSU women's hockey team gained a sweep against the St. Cloud State Huskies over the Oct. 29-30 weekend, defeating SCSU last Friday 3-2 and then blanking the Huskies 4-0 last Saturday.
- Erin Cody had the biggest weekend of her collegiate career as she had a hand in each BSU goal tallying seven points on five goals and two assists in the series. In last Friday's contest, Cody scored all three Beaver goals in the 3-2 win, recording a natural hat trick. Scoring a power-play, short-handed, and even-strength goal all in the first period, the hat trick was the first of her BSU career. The performance also set a school record for most goals scored by a single player in one period. Following up her performance on Saturday, Cody tallied assists on the first two BSU goals before scoring the final two to give her four points in the game.
- Cody's linemates, Sadie Lundquist and Erickson, had four points on the weekend. Lundquist recorded one assist last Friday and on Saturday picked up one goal and one assist. Erickson tallied one assist in last Saturday's game.
- Zuzana Tomcikova was the only WCHA goaltender to earn a shutout over the weekend, keeping St. Cloud State off the board in last Saturday's game. The shutout was the 10th of her collegiate career and second of the season. On the weekend Tomcikova made 40 saves, recording a .952 save percentage, helping the Beavers pick up six valuable points in the conference standings.
- Montana Vichorek netted her first goal of the season last Saturday and also had two assists in last Friday's contest to earn three points on the weekend. She also had nine blocked shots in the two games, the most of any BSU defender.
- Both Bauerfeld and Erika Wheelhouse recorded assists over the Halloween weekend. Bauerfeld had two in both games while Wheelhouse had two in Saturday's game.
- The BSU penalty-kill was perfect over the Oct. 29-30 weekend while denying all nine power-play chances the Huskies had.
- Tomcikova has made a total of 181 saves so far this season. In six games she has recorded a .917 save percentage. Making 17 saves, Tomcikova picked up her 10th-career shutout on Oct. 30 as the Beavers defeated St. Cloud State 4-0.
- The line of Cody, Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 15 of the 18 goals this year and have tallied 16 of the 31 assists so far.
- Sacrificing their bodies, the members of the BSU defense have combined to block 139 shots on the season.
- Since the WCHA introduced the shootout in the 2008-09 season, Bemidji State has competed in the most shootout rounds, with 59. Second is Minnesota State with 51.

- Cody leads BSU with eight goals and six assists, while Lundquist has four goals and five assists. Erickson has three goals and five assists. The trio has accounted for 31 of the 49 total points on the season.

Golden Gophers

University of Minnesota

- The No. 8-ranked Golden Gophers fell in a two-game series to No. 3-ranked Minnesota Duluth last weekend, putting the Gophers at 2-4-0 in the conference and 5-4-0 overall.
- Last Friday, the Gophers opened up the first period with two quick penalties, one resulting in a UMD power-play goal. Jessica Wong scored at 5:11 in the first period. With the goal, it broke goaltender Noora Raty's scoreless streak against her opponents. She had played a total of 245:11 without allowing a goal this season. However, the Gophers responded 2:23 with a power-play goal of their own when Kelly Seeler scored at 7:34 in the first. It was UMD's first allowed goal in three-straight games. Sarah Davis gave the Gophers a 2-1 lead heading into the third period at 19:34 in the second. However, the Bulldogs rallied back scoring two goals in the third period to take a 3-2 win away from the Gophers. Elin Holmlöv scored just :52 seconds into the third period on an unassisted goal to tie the game at 2-2. Pernilla Winberg then scored at 13:55 on a Gopher breakdown in their zone with the assists from Holmlöv and goalie Jennifer Harss to win the game. Minnesota attempted a comeback when it pulled Raty with a minute remaining but were unable to muster anything together in the final moments. Raty finished the game with 31 saves, while Harss had 20 in her third win of the season.
- Last Saturday, UMD got on the board early when Haley Irwin scored a power-play goal at 4:44 in the first period. As she was coming out of the penalty box, Irwin connected Brienna Gillanders' pass to score her ninth goal of the season. The Bulldogs increased the lead to 3-0 when they got a goal by Winberg at 7:12 in the second and again at 10:30 on Irwin's second goal of the game when her shot deflected off of Anne Schleper's stick and past Raty. Sam Downey chipped away at the UMD lead when she scored a power-play goal at 14:30 in the second. It was her first goal of the season. Minnesota cut the lead to one when Kelly Terry scored on a breakaway just :20 seconds in the third period. Amanda Kessel found Terry waiting at the blue line. Terry caught the puck and went on a breakaway. However, Irwin netted her third goal of the game when she scored an empty-netter at 19:59 in the third period to ice the game.
- After a two-week hiatus, the Gophers return home, Nov. 5-6 as Wisconsin comes to town. Friday's game is set for 6:07 pm CT, while Saturday's tilt is at 4:07 pm CT.
- The University of Minnesota Athletics department will be holding a "Burst the Bus" food drive on Saturday, Nov. 6. For the doubleheader for women's and men's hockey, the athletics department will have its M.A.G.I.C. bus (Maroon and Gold Impacting the Community) located between Mariucci and Ridder Arena. The Gophers are looking for canned or non-perishable food donations for Second Harvest Heartland.
- Although Minnesota will be idle over the Nov. 12-13 weekend, five players have been named to Four Nation's Cup rosters. Three Minnesota players have been named to the United States Four Nation's Cup roster. Sarah Erickson, Kessel and Schleper will represent their country when they play with Team USA, Nov. 9-13 in St. John's, Newfoundland. Also earning a spot on an international roster were Mira Jalosuo and Noora Rätty, who will play with Team Finland.

Bulldogs

University of Minnesota Duluth

- The No. 3-ranked Bulldogs earned a WCHA series sweep over No. 6 Minnesota with 3-2 and 4-2 wins over the past weekend. The Bulldogs – who closed the all-time record gap against the Gophers to 23-26-5 – has now won six-straight games versus Minnesota and six of the last eight games between the two programs.
- UMD scored two goals in the third period, including the equalizer by Elin Holmlov :52 seconds into the third period, to down the Gophers 3-2 last Friday night. Holmlov had a goal and an assist to help lead UMD, which was backstopped by Jennifer Hars, who is now 5-2 against Minnesota and 5-0 in her last five skates against them. Hars made 20 saves to earn her third win of the season.
- Last Saturday night, junior forward Haley Irwin scored three goals and added an assist to help lead UMD with a 4-2 victory against the Gophers. Irwin's hat trick – the third of her career – is also only the third hat trick ever by a Bulldog player against Minnesota, and first since the 2002-03 season. Sophomore forward Pernilla Winberg added a goal and an assist in the contest, while sophomore forward Jessica Wong dished out two assists. Kim Martin made 27 saves to improve her record on the season to 4-1 and gives her 57 wins over her career.
- The series sweep was just the fifth-ever for UMD over Minnesota in 12 seasons, and two of those five have come in 2010.
- Wong has now scored at least a point in her last four outings for eight points (4g, 4a), and is just a game shy of tying her career-best scoring streak of five games.
- Irwin has scored a goal in seven of UMD's eight contests so far this season, and her 11 overall goals is the fifth-most in the NCAA. Her eight WCHA tallies ranks her No. 1 in the WCHA, and with 11 WCHA points, she sits second. She is averaging 2.00 points per game, which puts her fifth overall in the nation, and she is tied for third with three power-play goals, and tied for first with three game-winning scores.
- The Bulldogs, who are averaging 4.50 goals a game to rank No. 4 in NCAA Div. 1 stats, are also the nation's stingiest team, allowing opponents only 1.25 goals a skate. UMD has scored 36 goals overall, but allowed just 10.
- Five UMD players have a +/- ranking of +12 or higher, with Irwin owning a +17 ranking to lead the Bulldogs.
- Irwin and senior blueliner Jocelyne Larocque will centralize a week early with Team Canada ahead of the Four Nations Cup to be held next week. UMD will have six players total representing their countries next week (Martin, Holmlov and Winberg for Sweden, and Mariia Posa for Finland).
- Head coach Shannon Miller is currently sitting at 298 wins, just two shy of the 300-win plateau.
- Miller and the Bulldogs will head to Bemidji this weekend to face Bemidji State, the only WCHA team that UMD remains unbeaten by. The Maroon and Gold is 47-0-2 all-time against the Beavers, and faced BSU last in the semifinal of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 6 in Ridder Arena, a 7-3 win for the Bulldogs.

Mavericks

Minnesota State University

- The Mavericks dropped a pair of Western Collegiate Hockey Association road contests to top-rated Wisconsin last weekend in Madison. MSU dropped last Friday's contest 3-2 and Saturday's 6-1.
- In the two contests at Wisconsin, six Mavericks earned points. Three players netted goals, while three others tallied assists. Junior forward Emmi Leinonen, sophomore Lauren Smith and freshman Kathleen Rogan all scored goals while junior defenseman Jackie Otto, sophomore defenseman Emilia Andersson and sophomore blueliner Erika Magnusson each earned helpers.
- Three Mavericks finished with a team-best +1 plus/minus rating in junior

captain Aril Mackley, sophomore forward Lauren Zrust and freshman blueliner Elisabeth Hewett.

- Rogan leads the team in points this season with seven, while junior Moria O'Connor sits second on the team with four points. Rogan owns five goals, a team-high, and Rogan, Otto and O'Connor each owns two assists, team-bests. Smith and Rogan each own two unassisted goals.
- Junior goaltender Alli Altmann owns a 1-3-1 record and owns goaltender bests, 133 saves, .899 save percentage and a 3.15 goals-against average.
- Freshman forward Tracy McCann is the owner of a team-best +3 plus/minus rating.

Fighting Sioux

University of North Dakota

- The No. 7-ranked Sioux return to WCHA play this weekend against another top-10 ranked team, hosting No. 9 Ohio State at the Ralph Engelstad Arena in a Saturday/Sunday series with both games scheduled for a 2:07 p.m. opening faceoff.
- This will be the fourth top-10 team the Sioux have faced out of five series to start the season.
- In UND's last action, the Sioux settled for a split on Oct. 22-23 to close out its first month of the 2010-11 season. The Sioux ended October play with a 5-3-0 record and 4-2-0 WCHA record.
- In Mankato that Friday, the Sioux dropped a 4-2 decision to Minnesota State allowing a pair of freshmen to lead the way in Kathleen Rogan and Danielle Butters. The Sioux hit its first bump in the season as the outshot the Mavericks 30-21 (62-32 shots attempted) but allowed a hat trick by Rogan and Butters to pick up her first collegiate win with 28 saves. All of Rogan's goals came on odd-man rushes with two of them on breakaways. Jocelyne Lamoureux had two points in the game with one goal and one assist while Allison Parizek added the second goal for the Sioux.
- North Dakota then answered with a 5-1 win at All-Seasons Arena on that Saturday, led by a three-goal hat trick by Jocelyne Lamoureux. Kelsey Ketcher and Parizek added goals. The Sioux outshot the Mavericks 15-2 in the first period leading to a 2-0 advantage, but the Mavericks were the lone team able to score in the second period to cut the lead to one goal despite trailing 29-11 in shots. In the third period, UND blew it open. Jocelyne Lamoureux had a pair of goals and Parizek added her second of the weekend. Stephanie Ney stopped 17 of 18 shots on goal between the pipes to earn the win and improve to 3-0 on the year with a 1.33 goals-against average and .946 save percentage. She currently ranks ninth in the country in goals-against average, is tied for fifth in save percentage and one of seven remaining goalies that are undefeated.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux's hat trick was the first recorded by a Sioux since Cami Wooster accomplished the three-goal mark on Oct. 22, 2005.
- Alyssa Wiebe recorded three assists in the game giving her 42 in her career. She is now tied with Melissa Jaques for the program's career record.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux and Monique Lamoureux-Kolls both have 12 points on the season and are currently tied for 21st in the country averaging 1.50 points per game. Lamoureux also has three power-play goals which is tied for 3rd in the country.

Buckeyes

Ohio State University

- The No. 9-ranked Buckeyes won both games in a non-conference series against Syracuse, Oct. 29-30. Ohio State had a 5-1 victory last Friday and a 6-2 win last Saturday at the OSU Ice Rink.
- This was the first meeting between Ohio State and Syracuse, who is in their third season as a Division I program. The sweep is Ohio State's third in four series this season.
- Laura McIntosh became the sixth Buckeye to reach the 100-point milestone last Friday when she dished out three assists. McIntosh eclipsed

the century mark with a total of five points vs. the Orange and now has 103 points in 81 career games. The Waterloo, Ontario native is the fastest Buckeye to reach 100 points (in 80 games), surpassing the previous mark by 19 games (Jana Harrigan, 100th point in 99th game).

- McIntosh was one of four Buckeyes with multiple points last Friday against Syracuse as Hokey Langan also had three points (1g, 2a), Natalie Spooner scored twice and Kelly Wild had a goal and assist.
- Melissa Feste scored her first goal of the season on an assist by Liz Rizzo, also her first of the season.
- Freshman forward Ally Tarr set up a goal in each game for her first collegiate points.
- Twelve Buckeyes had a point and rookie goalie Lisa Steffes made 44 saves in the 6-2 win last Saturday. It was Steffes' third time in the last four games she made over 40 saves. Leading Ohio State in game two (Oct. 30) was Spooner with three points on two goals and an assist. Langan, McIntosh and senior Shannon Reilly each had two assists while sophomore Tina Hollowell had a goal and assist. A pair of Buckeyes – sophomore Amanda Boskovich and freshman Becky Allis – also scored the first goals of their career and rookie defenseman Madison Marcotte played in her first game Saturday. Ohio State was down 2-1 in the first period, but a goal by Spooner tied the game at the first intermission. It was all Buckeyes from there with two goals in the second and third periods.
- Spooner (4g, 1a), Langan (1g, 4a) and McIntosh (5a) each finished the Syracuse series with five points. Spooner has scored two goals in a game four times this season. Spooner extended her point streak to 12 games and her goal streak to nine games (both dating back to last season). The goal streak is a program record and her point streak is the fourth-longest in team history. Spooner also moved into the 10th spot in Ohio State all-time point standings with 91. Langan extended her point streak to 10 games (dating back to last season). In her 45 career games, Langan has been held without a point just eight times.
- The Buckeyes have swept their first two non-conference opponents, both from the College Hockey America league. OSU opened the season with two 4-1 wins at Robert Morris. Ohio State will also play Wayne State from the CHA, Dec. 30-31 at the OSU Ice Rink.
- Up next, Ohio State travels to Grand Forks to face North Dakota, Nov. 6-7. Games begin at 2 p.m. both Saturday and Sunday at Ralph Engelstad Arena. The Buckeyes and Sioux split their series last season, each winning and losing a home game. The same weekend last November, Ohio State dropped a close one, 5-4, before a 3-1 victory.

Huskies

St. Cloud State University

- Playing at the Sanford Center (formerly Bemidji Regional Event Center) for the first time in school history, St. Cloud State's women's hockey team suffered a series sweep at Bemidji State University this past weekend on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 29-30.
- The Huskies are now 0-9-0 overall in 2010-11 and 0-6-0 in the WCHA.
- BSU defeated the Huskies 4-2 last Friday and blanked SCSU 4-0 in the second game of the weekend series.
- Brittany Toor scored her first goal of the season against the Beavers last Friday, while Kylie Lane netted her second goal of the season in the loss on Friday.
- Senior netminder Ashley Nixon was the goalie of record this past weekend. In 118:29 minutes played, Nixon backstopped the Huskies with a combined 70 saves and a .909 save percentage.
- The Huskies will return to action on Nov. 5-6 with a pair of Western Collegiate Hockey Association games at Minnesota State University. The game on Nov. 5 will start at 7:07 p.m. and the Nov. 6 game is slated to start at 3:07 p.m. in MSU's All Seasons Arena.

Badgers

University of Wisconsin

- The top-ranked and unbeaten Badgers (8-0-0, 6-0-0 WCHA) travel to No. 8 Minnesota (5-4-0, 2-4-0 WCHA) for their first road series of the 2010-11 season this weekend. The Badgers take on the Gophers at 6 p.m. Friday and conclude the series at 4 p.m. Saturday. Both games will be played at Ridder Arena.
- The Badgers look for their seventh-straight WCHA win Friday. Wisconsin currently owns sole-possession of first place in the WCHA standings with 18 points.
- UW is 206-61-27 all-time in WCHA games for a .747 winning percentage.
- Wisconsin is 22-27-6 all-time against Minnesota, but the Badgers held a 3-1-0 edge over the Gophers during four meetings in 2009-10. Minnesota won the last meeting as the teams split a series Feb. 19-20, 2010.
- The Badgers retained the No. 1 ranking in this week's USCHO.com national poll after moving into the top spot the week of Oct. 18. Wisconsin opened the season ranked No. 5 in both national polls.
- Wisconsin swept Minnesota State Oct. 29-30 to conclude its season-opening eight-game homestand. The Badgers earned a 3-2 win last Friday before completing the sweep with a 6-1 victory last Saturday.
- On Oct. 29, junior Brooke Ammerman scored two power-play goals, including the game-winner, to lead the Badgers to a 3-2 victory. Ammerman added an assist in addition to her two-goal effort, and senior Meghan Duggan and sophomore Brianna Decker each tallied two assists. Minnesota State was led by goaltender Alli Altmann, who posted 38 saves.
- Wisconsin erupted for four third period goals, and eight Badgers recorded points in last Saturday's 6-1 victory over Minnesota State. Decker led UW with two goals and one assist, and junior Hilary Knight scored two goals. Ammerman and Duggan each added one goal and one assist. Becca Ruegsegger and Alex Rigsby again split time in goal. Both earned their fourth wins of the season as Rigsby tied her career high with 17 saves on Friday night before Ruegsegger made a season-high 18 saves on Saturday. Both have now made four starts on the season while combining for 110 saves with a 1.37 goals-against average, a .909 saves percentage and three shutouts.
- With their 6-1 win over Minnesota State on Oct. 30, the Badgers tied the best start in program history with an eight-game winning streak. UW also started the 2008-09 campaign at 8-0-0 before tying Minnesota in their ninth game; Wisconsin was unbeaten in its first 21 games at 19-0-2 to start that season.
- As a team, the Badgers rank third in the nation with 5.25 goals per game, and UW is fourth in the country in scoring defense, allowing 1.38 goals per game. The Badgers are second with a +3.88 scoring margin in eight games as Cornell owns the national lead with a +4.25 margin in four games.
- UW is tied for fourth in the nation with a 28.6 power-play percentage (8-of-28).
- The Badgers are one of four undefeated Div. 1 teams, joining Cornell (4-0-0), Dartmouth (2-0-0) and Holy Cross (1-0-0) as teams with a 1.000 winning percentage.
- With two wins over then-No. 10 Ohio State Oct. 22-23, the Badgers are a perfect 2-0-0 against ranked opponents this season. The Badgers went 4-3-1 against ranked opponents in 2009-10.

WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
