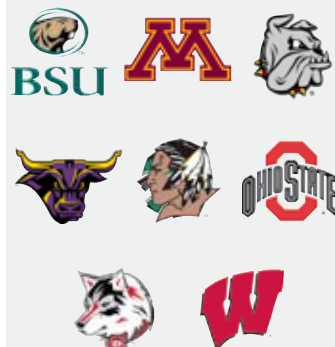

# Wisconsin Hosts Minnesota to Highlight Full Slate of Jan. 28-29 Weekend WCHA Series; MSU Heads to UND; UMD Hosts BSU; OSU Travels to SCSU; Badgers, Gophers, Sioux Riding Hot Streaks Top-Ranked Wisconsin Stands 11-0-1 Over Last 12, No. 4-Ranked Minnesota 8-0-1 in Last Nine; North Dakota Ups Unbeaten Streak to Seven at 6-0-1; Badgers' Duggan Pushes Scoring Streak to 22 Games; WCHA's Non-Conference Record at 24-11-3 (.671); Four WCHA Teams Among Nation's Top 10 in Latest USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Poll ... UW No. 1, UM No. 4, UMD No. 6, UND No. 7 ... BSU Also Receives Votes; Tickets Continue on Sale for 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, Set for March 4-5 at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis

MADISON, Wis. – Three of the nation's hottest Division 1 women's college hockey teams – No. 1-ranked Wisconsin, No. 4-ranked Minnesota and No. 7-ranked North Dakota – will put impressive unbeaten streaks on the line this weekend as a full slate of four Western Collegiate Hockey Association series will be contested.

The Badgers (23-2-1, 17-2-1-1 WCHA), in the midst of a 12-game unbeaten streak to 11-0-1, will play host to the Golden Gophers (18-6-1, 13-6-1-1 WCHA), riding a nine-game unbeaten streak at 8-0-1, in the marquee series Friday (Jan. 28) and Saturday (Jan. 29) at 7:07 pm CT at the Kohl Center in Madison. Wisconsin and Minnesota split their first two-game series of the 2010-11 season on Nov. 5-6 at Ridder Arena, with the host Gophers winning 7-5 in game one and the Badgers prevailing 5-0 on Saturday.

No. 7-ranked North Dakota (14-7-3, 12-6-2 WCHA), meanwhile, is back home to play Minnesota State (6-17-3, 5-14-1 WCHA) this weekend with a woman's program-record, seven-game unbeaten streak at 6-0-1. Face-offs at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks are 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday.

Back-to-back WCHA sweeps have moved the Sioux into third place in the league race and given them more than a passing interest in this week's Border Battle between second place Minnesota and league-leading Wisconsin. Earlier this season, North Dakota and Minnesota State split a series in Mankato on Oct. 22-23, with the Mavericks claiming a 4-2 win on Friday and the Sioux bouncing back for a 5-1 victory on Saturday.

In the two other league series on the docket this coming weekend, Ohio State visits St. Cloud State and Bemidji State heads to Minnesota Duluth. The Huskies (0-24-1, 0-19-1-1 WCHA) will host the Buckeyes (12-12-2, 6-12-2-2 WCHA) at the National Hockey Center on Friday at 2:07 pm CT and Saturday at 1:07 pm CT. OSU is 2-0-0 vs SCSU this season following 3-1 and 6-1 wins in Columbus on Oct. 15-16.

Minnesota Duluth (12-7-3, 10-7-3 WCHA) and Bemidji State (12-9-3, 10-7-3-2 WCHA), meanwhile, will face each other for the third and fourth times this season as well, in a pair of 7:07 pm CT face-offs at the Bulldogs' new AMSOIL Arena. The two clubs split their first head-to-head series back on Nov. 5-6 in Bemidji, with the host Beavers claiming a 1-0 victory on Friday and the Bulldogs taking a 3-1 decision on Saturday. BSU is two points ahead of UMD in the standings, with the Bulldogs looking to snap an 0-3-2 stretch – the longest winless streak in UMD's history.

Last weekend (Jan. 21-22), the Badgers took five of six points from defending national champion Minnesota Duluth in Duluth in a matchup of the teams which have won the last five Div. 1 national championships. Meghan Duggan had two goals and an assist as the Badgers beat UMD 4-1 last Friday in the first game by a women's hockey team ever in AMSOIL Arena. Then in the series finale last Saturday, Wisconsin's Hilary Knight scored the shootout game-winner after Minnesota Duluth had rallied back to tie the game at 4-4. In the tie, Duggan assisted on the Badgers' second goal of the game and extended her current point streak to 22 games, the longest individual point streak in UW women's hockey history. She is tied for second in the nation with 54 points overall while averaging 2.08 points per game. She is fourth in the country with 23 goals and ranks second with 31 assists.

Minnesota heads into this week's 'Border Battle' at Wisconsin with a 14-2-0 overall record since early November after beating Ohio State twice in Columbus last weekend. The Gophers rallied with three goals within four minutes in the third period to take a 4-2 victory in the series opener last Friday. Minnesota's Sarah Davis, a freshman forward, then assisted on four of the eight goals scored against the Buckeyes en route to an 8-1 win last Saturday. The Gophers head into Madison with 41 points, 12 points behind Wisconsin with eight games (and 24 points) left in the regular season.

Lurking in third place with 38 points is North Dakota, which won twice at St. Cloud last weekend. North Dakota goaltender Stephanie Ney recorded two shutout victories in back-to-back 5-0 wins over the host Huskies on Jan. 21-22. She made 28 and 23 saves respectively

in running her season record to 10-2-2 and keeping the Huskies without a goal in their last four games. Her 10 victories set a UND single season record for most victories in a season. She now has a 1.70 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage this season.

And last weekend in Bemidji, goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova stopped 22 shots to backstop Bemidji State to a 2-0 shutout victory against Minnesota State on Friday afternoon at Sanford Center. On Saturday, the Beavers completed the sweep of the Mavericks with a 3-1 victory.

The current WCHA standings show Wisconsin (17-2-1-1 WCHA) in first place with 53 points and Minnesota (15-6-1-1 WCHA) second with 41. North Dakota (12-6-2 WCHA) stands third with 38 points while Bemidji State (10-7-3-2 WCHA) is fourth with 35 and Minnesota Duluth (10-7-3 WCHA) is fifth with 33 points. Ohio State (6-12-2-2 WCHA) is sixth with 22 points, Minnesota State (5-14-1 WCHA) is in seventh place with 16 points, and St. Cloud State (0-19-1-1 WCHA) is eighth with two.

In this week's USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's Hockey Poll, four of the WCHA's eight-member teams are ranked in the top ten. Wisconsin remains at No. 1, Minnesota is up to No. 4, Minnesota Duluth is at No. 6, and North Dakota is up No. 7. Also receiving votes was Bemidji State.

Looking ahead to the weekend of Feb. 4-5, the four WCHA series will find Ohio State hosting North Dakota, St. Cloud State at Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth at Minnesota State, and Bemidji State entertaining Wisconsin. There are four weeks remaining in the 2010-11 regular season and all games played will be league games. Through games of Jan. 24, the eight WCHA-member women's teams are a combined 24-11-3 in non-conference play for a .671 winning percentage.

## WCHA Continues Shootouts; Adopts New Standings Format for League Play in 2010-11

The WCHA is continuing to use shootouts for the 2010-11 season and has also implemented a three-point system in women's league play. In a change this year the WCHA has adopted a standings format for

league play where a team that wins in regulation or overtime receives three points, a team that wins a shootout is awarded two points, a team that loses a shootout gets one point, and a team that loses in regulation or overtime earns no points.

The standings show wins, losses, ties and shootout wins – W-L-T-SW (W-L-T add up to games played, the tie column signifies how many times a team has been to a shootout and the SW column represents how many shootouts a team has won.) Teams are awarded three points for each win in regulation or overtime, and one point for an overtime tie. Conference games tied after 65 minutes advance to a three-player shootout with the winning team receiving an extra point in the standings (denoted in the SW column).

## 2011 WCHA Playoffs, NCAA Tournament

The pursuit of the WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday-Sunday, Feb. 25-27 with four, first round conference playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will all host best-of-three playoff series against the bottom four ranked teams. The No. 1 seed hosting the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed hosting the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed hosting the No. 6 seed,

and the No. 4 seed hosting the No. 5 seed.

Those four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2011 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, which is set for March 4-5.

The WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will be contested at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis and hosted by the University of Minnesota, but with a new twist.

“We have opted to play the championship on Friday (March 4) and Saturday (March 5) this season and we anticipate that giving us an additional boost. And as always, the four participating teams that earn the trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF will put everything on the line to win the tournament and receive the Association’s automatic bid into the NCAA tournament championship field.”

There will be two semi-final matchups on Friday, with face-offs at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT. The championship contest will then be played at 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. Minnesota Duluth is the defending WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF champion.

Following the league playoff championship, four NCAA Div. 1 Women’s Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of March 11-14 at sites to be determined.

The four regional winners then earn a trip to the 2011 NCAA Women’s Frozen Four, set for March 18 and 20 in Erie, Pa.

## WCHA Member Team Weekly Notebooks

### Bemidji State Beavers

- The Beavers (12-9-3, 10-7-3-2 WCHA) will finish their regular season series against the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs this weekend, traveling to Duluth. The games will take place Friday and Saturday at 7:07 pm CT at the new AMSOIL Arena.
- Earlier this season the Beavers picked up their first-ever win over the Bulldogs, downing the then-No. 3 team 1-0 on Nov. 5 at the Sanford Center. Emily Erickson scored the lone goal of the game at 13:25 of the third period while Zuzana Tomcikova made a season-high 38 saves. In the series finale on Nov. 6, BSU dropped a 3-1 decision to UMD. The only goal for the Beavers came again from Erickson.
- All time against Minnesota Duluth, Bemidji State is 1-48-2. The Beavers and Bulldogs played to a 2-2 tie on Dec. 13, 2009, with BSU winning the shootout.
- Last week, BSU picked up the weekend sweep over Minnesota State, winning by scores of 2-0 and 3-1 on Jan. 21-22. Seven different players scored points for BSU over the weekend. Montana Vichorek and Danielle Williams each had an assist, Erickson had one goal, Annie Bauerfeld, Sadie Lundquist and Lauren Williams each had one goal and one assist, while Erin Johnson had one goal and two assists. In last Friday's game the Beaver defense shined as Tomcikova turned away 22 shots on goal to record her fifth shutout of the season. Bauerfeld and Johnson connected to open the scoring in the second period. Entering the offensive zone with two players on her heels, Johnson fought-off the two defenders and kept possession of the puck long enough to make a move around Maverick goalie Alli Altmann and score her fourth goal of the season. In the final minute of play, Erickson scored an empty-net goal to secure the Beavers' 11th victory of the season. The following day started off quickly as Lauren Williams scored her first collegiate goal at 3:27 of the first period. Seven minutes later, Bauerfeld found the net for her sixth goal of the season and fifth since the start of the new year. In the final stanza, Tomcikova turned away 10 shots to keep the Mavericks from tying the game and Lundquist would add an empty-net goal with :07 seconds remaining to secure the sweep.
- The forward line of Cody, Lundquist, and Erickson has scored 33 of the team's 48 goals this season and have tallied 32 of the 83 assists so far. Cody leads the three with 14 goals and 14 assists, while Erickson has 13 goals and nine assists and Lundquist has six goals and nine assists. The trio has also accounted for 65 of the 131 total points.
- Goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova has made a total of 525 saves so far this season. In 21 games she has recorded a .929 save percentage and a 1.99 goals-against average. Turning away 22 shots on goal, she recorded her 13th career shutout (vs Minnesota State) on Jan. 21.
- So far this new year Annie Bauerfeld has had a hand 10 of the last 15 goals scored by the Beavers, scoring four and assisting on six. Erin Johnson has also helped in nine of those past 15 goals, scoring three and assisting on six. The two have recorded at least one point in each of the past six games this new year.
- In WCHA games only, the BSU women's hockey team is ranked first with a 90.9% penalty-kill. They haven't allowed a power-play goal in 27-straight penalties, spanning back to the Dec. 4 game against Minnesota.
- Erin Cody sits one point shy of the 100 career point mark. There have been two players in BSU history to eclipse the century mark: Kelly Hart (100) and Amber Fryklund (122).

### Minnesota Golden Gophers

- The No. 4-ranked Golden Gophers (18-6-1, 13-6-1-1 WCHA) earned two wins against Ohio State last weekend, gaining another six points in the WCHA conference standings. In a tight race, Minnesota is currently second with 41 points, while North Dakota is third (38) and Bemidji State is fourth (35). Wisconsin holds a comfortable lead with 53 points.
- In last Friday's (Jan. 21) game, OSU jumped out to a quick 1-0 lead when Melissa Feste scored just :21 seconds into the game. Minnesota

tied the game with a goal at 18:26 in the second period from Amanda Kessel. Ally Tarr gave the host Buckeyes a 2-1 lead at 5:18 in the third period. Minnesota, however, responded with goals at 10:26, 12:46 and 13:06 to come-from-behind and win the game. Sarah Erickson received a cross-ice pass and placed the puck over OSU goalie Lisa Steffes' left leg pad for her 12th goal of the season. Megan Bozek struck next when she scored at 12:46. Anne Schleper finished the Gopher flurry when she streaked in as her and Kessel created a near two-on-one attempt to bang in her fifth goal of the season. Erickson added the second assist. Noora Rätty had a 33-save performance in nets, with 16 saves in the first, nine in the second and eight in the third.

- In last Saturday's (Jan. 22) game at OSU, the Gophers scored three times in the first period, four in the second and once in the third for the 8-1 win. Sarah Davis had a career-high four assists in the game to lead the Gophers in scoring. In all, nine Gophers tallied a point in the win. Along with the offensive charge, Megan Bozek held a plus/minus rating of +4, while Kelly Seeler, Davis, Kelly Terry and Becky Kortum were all +3. Terry scored the Gophers' first goal at 4:52 in the first. Kessel scored the Gopher's second unassisted goal when she picked up the loose puck at 8:56. Kessel scored a shorthanded goal, the Gophers' second of the year at 8:56. Terra Rasmussen scored a power-play goal at 15:16 in the first when she placed the puck on the far side, just out of the reach of OSU goalie Lisa Steffes. Rätty held the assist. Minnesota lit the lamp another four times in the second and allowed one goal to put the game at 7-1 after two with goals from Becky Kortum (6:07), Erickson (6:57), Mira Jalosuo (16:07) and Schleper (18:10). Minnesota added its final blow when Kortum netted her second goal of the game just :10 seconds into the third period. Off the opening faceoff, Terry passed Davis the puck just outside the blue line. Davis found Kortum and fed a cross-ice pass to her as she buried the puck for her 10th goal of the year. Noora Rätty started in goal for the Gophers. She played two periods and had seven saves in the first and 19 saves in the second. She is credited with the win and improved her record to 17-4-1 this season. Jenny Lura saw action for the second time this season and had a shutout third period and stopped five OSU shots on goal.

- With her eight shutouts this season, Rätty has already tied the Gopher record for shutouts in a season. She already tied Jody Horak's school record of shutouts in a season, set in 2004-05. Rätty now has 15 shutouts in her UM career. Former Gopher and Minnesota hall of fame honoree Erica Killewald holds the school record of 22 from 1997-2001, while All-American Horak had 20 from 2001-05.

- Erickson has been putting points on the board, especially since the Bemidji State series (Dec. 3-4). After the Gophers were shut out by the Beavers on Dec. 3, Erickson has tallied a point in nine-straight games. Of those nine games, six have been a goal, while three of those have been game-winners.

- Minnesota will travel to Madison, Wis., this weekend to face the No. 1-ranked Wisconsin Badgers. Both games on Friday and Saturday night will be played at 7:07 pm CT at the Kohl Center. Audio for both games can be found on gophersports.com, while Saturday's game will be live on the Big Ten Network.

### Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs

- The No. 6 Bulldogs picked up just one point against top-ranked Wisconsin last weekend, dropping a 4-1 decision Friday night before earning a 4-4 tie Saturday night.

- The series vs UW was the first ever women's match ups in the Bulldogs' brand new AMSOIL Arena, and last Friday's opening was a start-studded affair, with alums Jenny Potter, Caroline Ouellette and current assistant coach Maria Rooth dropping the honorary first puck in the ceremonial face-off. UMD struggled to assert its new home ice advantage, however, as the Badgers built up a three-goal lead by the third period. The Bulldogs didn't get on the scoreboard until 8:15 on a goal by Elin Holmlov. Wisconsin added an open net goal and outshot UMD, 25-21, while winning its 11th

game, 4-1 style. UMD leading scorer Haley Irwin did not play Friday night, and sophomore goaltender Jenny Harss made 21 saves.

- The Bulldogs fought back to overcome a two-goal deficit in each of the three periods last Saturday evening to earn the 4-4 tie vs the Badgers. Outshot 43-27, UMD had two players – Kacy Ambroz and Tara Gray on the power-play – notch their first goals of the season. Sophomore defenseman Jessica Wong added a power-play tally, her 11th of the year, and rookie forward Jamie Kenyon scored her third goal of the season, and first game-tying tally of her young career, with just 1:14 left in regulation to bring the game to a 4-4 stalemate. Kenyon's and Gray's goals came 1:17 apart and in the last three minutes of regulation. The overtime – the 19th ever between the two programs – ended in their 10th tie, although UMD lost in the ensuing shootout 2-1. Jennifer Harss made 39 saves – a season-high for either Harss or senior goaltender Kim Martin.
- UMD is now 26-21-10 all-time against the Badgers, and finishes up the regular season portion against Wisconsin 1-2-1, with two overtime games. The Bulldogs are also now 2-4-3 against Wisconsin when the Badgers own the No. 1 ranking since 2007.
- Last Saturday's 4-4 draw vs UW was the first time this year UMD has allowed four goals by its opponent but not suffered a setback. The Bulldogs are 0-3-1 in contests they surrender four goals so far this season.
- Senior defenseman Jocelyne Larocque made her own Bulldog history last Saturday. With her assist on Gray's goal at 17:29 in the third period, Larocque became the all-time leading scoring defenseman in UMD history with a combined 92 points (16g, 76a) in 115 skates. Larocque's 92 points rank her No. 8 all-time among WCHA defenseman and just one point from entering a tie for the No. 7 slot, currently owned by Bobbi-Jo Slusar of Wisconsin from 2003-07.
- Elin Holmlov extended her pile of points against the Badgers over her collegiate career by adding a goal last Friday and an assist Saturday, giving the senior forward five goals and 10 assists vs Wisconsin for 15 points over her career.
- Haley Irwin's assist Saturday night brings her career total against the Badgers to 14 points (5g, 9a) in just 16 skates.
- Sophomore defenseman convert Wong has now registered a point in six of the eight games she has played against Wisconsin in her UMD career. Wong has three goals and five assists for seven points.
- Other Badger-baiters who tacked on to their points against Wisconsin this weekend were senior Laura Fridfinnson (6-6=12) and sophomore forward Pernilla Winberg (2-7=9), who has nine points in eight games.
- Minnesota Duluth has not won a game since Dec. 10, a 4-1 victory against North Dakota. Since then, in five games, the Bulldogs are 0-3-2 – the longest winless streak in UMD's storied history.
- The Maroon and Gold's seven WCHA setbacks this season is only the third time in program history the Bulldogs have lost seven or more games in league play. UMD was 18-7-3 in league play in 2005-06, and lost a program-high eight skates in the WCHA back in 2003-04, when the Bulldogs went 15-8-1.
- The Bulldogs are 6-6-2 so far this season against teams ranked in the top-10.
- UMD has now had seven games where the team has netted two or more power-play goals during an outing. Four of those two-goal power-play games have come against nationally-ranked opponents, and while UMD is just 4-of-35 in its last six games with the extra skater, they have had two of their two-goal power-play outings in those last six games.
- UMD will host Bemidji State this weekend for the second-ever women's college hockey series in AMSOIL Arena. The Bulldogs are 48-1-2 all-time against the Beavers, and 1-1 this season. In the two teams last series in Bemidji on Nov. 5-6, UMD suffered its first-ever setback to BSU in the first game (Nov. 5), a 1-0 loss. The Bulldogs were thin that weekend however, with Team Canada call-ups Irwin and Larocque, as well as assistant coach Laura Schuler with Team Canada ahead of the Four Nations Cup. UMD outshot the Beavers 38-31 in the loss, and again the next day, 37-28 en route to a 3-1 win. Both games are slated for a 7:07 pm CT face-off.

## Minnesota State Mavericks

- The Mavericks (6-17-3, 5-14-1-0 WCHA) were swept in two games by Bemidji State in Bemidji last weekend, losing 2-0 on Friday and 3-1 Saturday.
- The Mavericks have now lost six straight games and have been swept their last three series. Out of the Mavericks' 13 series this season, MSU has swept its opponent two times and been swept seven times.
- When the Mavericks score three or more goals they have a record of 6-0-0. When they score two or less they are 0-17-3.
- The Mavericks have not earned a victory since 11/13 at Ohio State and are 0-12-2 in their last 14 games.
- Freshman Kathleen Rogan scored her 11th goal of the season, a team best, which bumps her point total to 11-8=19, also a team-best. Rogan ranks 22nd in the WCHA in points (11-8=19), tied for 13th in goals scored and fifth in freshman scoring.
- The series in Bemidji this past weekend opened a four-game road trip for the Mavs, who were outshot by the Beavers, 50-46, and outscored, 5-1.
- Junior goaltender Alli Altmann finished the Jan. 21-22 weekend with two starts, 45 saves and three goals allowed, with a .938 save percentage and a 1.52 goals-against average.
- Minnesota State dropped its fifth straight at Bemidji State to the Beavers last Friday, 2-0. Altmann finished with a game-high 24 saves, while Bemidji State's goaltender Zuzana Tomcikova tallied 22 saves.
- The Mavericks dropped game two of its series with Bemidji State last Saturday, 3-1. The Beavers and Minnesota State each finished with 24 shots, while MSU went 0-for-3 with an extra skater and Bemidji State went 0-for-1. Tomcikova finished with 23 saves, while Altmann stopped 21 BSU shots.
- MSU plays at North Dakota this weekend. The teams split a series in Mankato earlier this season.

## North Dakota Fighting Sioux

- No. 7-ranked Fighting Sioux (14-7-3, 12-6-2 WCHA) swept St. Cloud State this past weekend with back-to-back 5-0 wins.
- Jocelyne Lamoureux led the Sioux with four points on Friday. She scored two goals while adding two assists. Her first goal was her 100th career point. Stephanie Roy, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Holly Perkins added goals for the Sioux. The Sioux outshot the Huskies 40-28. Last Saturday, a balanced scoring attack saw different skaters score all five goals for UND. Mary Loken, Alyssa Wiebe, Allison Parizek, Lamoureux and Kelsey Ketcher all found the back of the net. Parizek and Lamoureux-Kolls had three-point games while Loken, Jordan Slavin and Wiebe all had two points.
- Goaltender Stephanie Ney went 2-0 on the Jan. 21-22 weekend with two shutout victories. She made 28 and 23 saves, respectively, to improve to 10-2-2 this season. Her 10 wins are a single-season program record for UND. She now has a 1.70 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage on the season.
- The Sioux have extended their unbeaten streak to a program-record seven games at 6-0-1, including back-to-back conference sweeps. The previous record was six which the Sioux had in 2003-04. The longest streak since joining the WCHA in 2004-05 was five games which happened in 2008-09.
- Lamoureux and Lamoureux-Kolls are now tied with Stasia Bakhit's single-season points record, as both have 38 points. Bakhit set the record in 2003-04. Monique Lamoureux-Kolls (113) also passed Bakhit (111) as UND's all-time leading scorer. Wiebe holds the record for most career points in a Sioux jersey with 81. After Jocelyne's three-goal weekend at SCSU, she now has 22 goals – one behind Bakhit's single-season record of 23.
- Jordan Slavin is fourth in the nation and leads the WCHA in points per game for a defenseman averaging 0.90. She has 18 points in 20 games and is one point shy of Abbey Strong (2003-04) and Kelly Lewis (2008-09) for the UND single-season record for points by a defenseman.
- The Sioux will host WCHA-rival Minnesota State this weekend at the

Ralph Engelstad Arena. Both games are scheduled for 7:07 pm CT. The two teams split their series in Mankato, Minn., earlier this season.

### Ohio State Buckeyes

- The Buckeyes dropped both games of a WCHA home series to then No. 5 Minnesota, Jan. 21-22 at the OSU Ice Rink. The Buckeyes led 2-1 in the third period of the opening game, but the Golden Gophers came back with three goals in the last 10 minutes for the 4-2 win. The next night, Ohio State fell 8-1.
- Junior forward Natalie Spooner had two assists in the first game vs UM and added the lone OSU goal in game two for a three-point weekend. Spooner had her first multi-assist game of the season last Friday, but it was her 12th multi-point performance in 19 games.
- Also with two points last Friday was freshman forward Ally Tarr, who had a goal and assist. It was her first multi-point game of her career.
- Junior forward Melissa Feste also scored for Ohio State last Friday. She has had four points in the last five games.
- Spooner was set up by junior Laura McIntosh and sophomore Hokey Langan for the Ohio State goal last Saturday. Langan missed just the second game of her career last Friday with an injury, but returned to the lineup for game two.
- Ohio State blocked 31 shots in the first game with senior defenseman Shannon Reilly leading the way with seven. McIntosh also finished with six blocked shots in the series.
- Freshman goalie Loren Carrier played the first minutes of her collegiate career last Saturday vs UM after replacing fellow rookie Lisa Steffes and patrolling the final 23:53 of the game. Carrier finished with 13 saves and two goals allowed.
- The first game vs Minnesota, Steffes tallied her 13th game with 30-plus saves with 39. Steffes continues to lead the NCAA in total saves (762) and minutes played (1550:36). Her save total ties for the fourth-highest in the Ohio State season records.
- The Buckeyes next travel to St. Cloud State to face the Huskies Jan. 28-29. Games begin at 2:07 pm CT Friday and 1:07 pm CT Saturday at the National Hockey Center. Ohio State topped SCSU by scores of 3-1 and 6-1, Oct. 15-16 in Columbus. McIntosh led the Buckeyes in scoring that weekend with six points on three goals and three assists. Spooner was second with four points (2g, 2a). Steffes made 37 saves with two goals allowed in the series.

### St. Cloud State Huskies

- The Huskies (0-24-1, 0-19-1-1 WCHA) were swept in a two-game series by then No. 8 North Dakota by identical 5-0 scores. Despite a valiant effort from St. Cloud State senior netminder Ashley Nixon, who backstopped the Huskies with 77 saves over the weekend in the National Hockey Center, this marked the first time in school history that SCSU has been swept by UND in both regular season league series. This is also just the fourth sweep that North Dakota has handed SCSU, dating back to the 2002-03 stint.
- The Huskies have now been held scoreless in their last 12 straight periods played, suffering four consecutive shutout losses in the WCHA.
- St. Cloud State will look to erase its scoring drought this weekend as the Huskies will play host to Ohio State on Friday and Saturday, Jan. 28-29, at 2:07 pm and 1:07 pm in the National Hockey Center. Earlier this season, the Buckeyes swept the Huskies 3-1 and 6-1 at the OSU Ice Rink on Oct. 15-16. The Buckeyes now hold a slight advantage in the all-time series with the Huskies, 24-23-6, dating back to Oct. 22, 1999.
- The St. Cloud State University Athletic Department will kick-off the 25th Anniversary of National Girls and Women in Sports Day on Saturday, Jan. 29 at the women's hockey game and women's and men's basketball games. To honor National Girls and Women in Sport Day, all women and girls are invited to attend the women's hockey game on Saturday, Jan. 29

at 1:07, the women's basketball game at 4:00 pm, followed by the men's basketball game at 6:00 pm, free of charge.

### Wisconsin Badgers

- The No. 1-ranked Wisconsin Badgers (23-2-1, 17-2-1-1 WCHA) return to the Kohl Center to host No. 4 Minnesota (18-6-1, 13-6-1-1 WCHA) this weekend. The puck drops at 7:07 pm CT both Friday and Saturday nights, and Saturday marks the Badgers' Fill the Bowl game.
- Wisconsin is 23-28-6 all-time against Minnesota, and the teams split a series at Ridder Arena Nov. 5-6. The Badgers fell 7-5 in Friday's game before posting a 5-0 shutout in Saturday's finale. Last season, Wisconsin held a 3-1-0 edge over the Gophers during four meetings. In the last series at the Kohl Center, the Badgers earned two wins over Minnesota, 4-2 and 5-2.
- Wisconsin faced No. 6 Minnesota Duluth last weekend, earning a 4-1 win in Friday's women's opener at AMSOIL Arena before recording a 4-4 overtime tie in Saturday's game. The Badgers gained the extra point in the WCHA standings with a 2-1 shootout win over the Bulldogs to conclude the series.
- Senior Meghan Duggan led Wisconsin with two goals and one assist in last Friday's 4-1 victory at UMD. Duggan's three-point game set a new Wisconsin program record for longest individual point streak at 21 games. Hilary Knight and Brianna Decker each tallied two points on one goal and one assist, and Decker scored her eighth game-winning goal of the season.
- Last Saturday saw Wisconsin take part in, and win, its first shootout of the season when the Badgers and Bulldogs remained tied at 4-4 after overtime. Brooke Ammerman and Hilary Knight scored for the Badgers and Alex Rigsby made one save, as Wisconsin won the shootout, 2-1. Rigsby played both games for the Badgers in nets, making 20 saves in her 16th win of the season on Friday before stopping 23 pucks in Saturday's tie.
- With the 1-0-1 weekend, the Badgers took the season series with a 2-1-1 mark against UMD this year.
- Wisconsin returns to action at the Kohl Center this weekend, boasting a 12-1-0 record at home this season. The Badgers have a 116-23-12 all-time record for a .808 winning percentage at the Kohl Center.
- Meghan Duggan is currently riding a 22-game point streak, the longest individual point streak in UW women's hockey history. Duggan's streak bested Meghan Hunter's 20-game scoring run from Oct. 14, 2000 to Jan. 12, 2001. In addition, Brianna Decker's current 17-game point streak ranks third all-time.
- In addition to Duggan and Decker, two other Badgers are currently riding multi-game point streaks. Brooke Ammerman is riding an 11-game streak, and Knight is on a 10-game streak. Duggan and Knight are both closing in on the 100-goal mark. Knight needs just two tallies to hit 100 career goals, while Duggan is close behind with 92 career goals.

## WCHA Women's Tie-Breaking Procedures • For Playoff Seeding Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All eight teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #8 rank, #2 rank vs #7 rank, #3 vs #6, and #4 vs #5.

Following the four first round series, the four winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #4 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.
- Shootout wins used during the WCHA regular season will not be counted in the determinations. Shootout games will be recorded as a tie in the determinations.
